Lunchtime Lecture

Jason Lepojarvi will be delivering a lunchtime theology lecture at Regent College titled "C. S. Lewis's Famous Disagreement with Augustine on Love," in Room 100.

Augustine recounts a heart-breaking story of the loss of his unnamed friend in the fourth book of the Confessions. In *The Four Loves*, Lewis's hesitantly but firmly rejects what he took to be the moral of the story: that vulnerability is a sign of misplaced or distorted love. This is the only time Lewis publicly disagrees with Augustine—whom he calls “a great saint and a great thinker to whom my own glad debts are incalculable”—on an important issue concerning love. All are welcome to bring their lunch, enjoy the lecture, and engage in a brief Q & A period afterward.
