The deadline to apply for the Conway Holy Land Travel Bursary has been extended to January 20! Dr. John Conway has generously endowed an annual \$7,500 bursary for research and travel to the Holy Land. The bursary is intended to foster inter-religious dialogue and understanding of the region's past and present and will be awarded to students interested in promoting a more peaceable and just future for this deeply troubled part of our world. Preferential attention will be given to the study and research of Christian-Jewish relations or Christian-Muslim relations.
