## Conference: *Poverty and Violence: Doing Justice in a Post-Colonial World*

On **Saturday May 13<sup>th</sup> 2017**, you are invited to join IJM Canada and Cristosal as we unpack what it means to do a justice in a post-colonial world. Both IJM and Cristosal have extensive first-hand experience in advancing human rights in Central and Latin America. Over the years we have learned that the interplay of poverty and violence is complex and dynamic and often has roots in colonialism. So what does it look like to do justice in a post-colonial world?

Hear from **Noah Bullock** (*Executive Director, Cristosal*), **Celia Medrano** (*Chief Program Officer, Cristosal*) and **Kevin Dixon** (*VP of Operations, IJM Canada*) as they share about inroads they are seeing on the frontlines of seeking justice. The day will conclude with a panel discussion that will challenge participants about what it means to be a seeker of justice in the midst of a broken world.

**International Justice Mission** is a global organization that protects the poor from violence throughout the developing world. IJM partners with local authorities to rescue victims of violence, bring criminals to justice, restore survivors, and strengthen justice systems. International Justice Mission Canada shares this mission. The largest organization of its kind, IJM combats slavery, sex trafficking, sexual violence, police brutality, property grabbing and other forms of violence in nearly 20 communities throughout Africa, Latin America, South Asia and Southeast Asia.
