What We Expect:

- We expect residents to follow rules. There's a "Rules, Policies, and Procedures" form that residents sign agreeing to the expectations.
- We expect residents to set goals and achieve privileges. There's a "Phases and Goals" form that set resident's goals and explain the privileges they earn along the way.
- We expect residents to be informed about the program. There's an "Orientation Packet" and "Financial Responsibilities" form residents will sign explaining the cost of the program.
- We expect residents to be guided by our leadership. There's an "Application" form in which our leadership will determine the program best suited for each individual.
- We expect residents to complete a self-examination into why they behave the way they do. *Walking the 12 Steps with Jesus Christ* and the Bible are our sources.

Who We Are:

- We are a Christ-based, 12 step program.
- We are a *sober-living facility*.
- We are a ministry offering 4 programs for men: A residential 10 month program, a residential 6 month already employed program, a residential 7 month will be employed program, and a residential disability program.
- We are different from other programs. We allow tobacco, cell phones, and other electronics. We allow TVs in various phases. We allow medications, though strictly monitored. We allow personal vehicles.
- We are interested in showing how Christ can keep you sober.
- We are interested in you getting a job.
- We are interested in you getting back on your feet.
- We are interested in you being a Christian. We want you to be Christ-like.

- We are not a rehabilitation program.
- We are not a program that allows sex offenders.
- We are not a homeless shelter.
- We are not a hospital.
- We are not a psychiatric ward.
- We do not accept insurance.
