

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY PDF

RUGBY REMEMBERS - COMMONWEALTH WAR GRAVES COMMISSION & RFU FIRST WORLD WAR COMPETITION

This competition is organised by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission (CWGC) with the support of the Rugby Football Union (RFU).

1. Details of how to enter this competition are contained in the promotional information and guidance which form part of these Terms and Conditions and can be found on the Commonwealth War Graves Commission's website at www.cwgc.org/rugby-remembers. Entrants will be deemed to have accepted these Terms and Conditions and to agree to be bound by them when entering this competition.
2. This competition is open to individuals from within the United Kingdom, including UK schools, universities, colleges and other full-time educational establishments ("educational establishment") and RFU affiliated clubs.
3.
 - (a) Entries from individual students or groups (maximum of 5 members – including one adult) will be accepted
 - (b) The Commonwealth War Graves Commission ("the Commission") reserves the right to verify the eligibility of all entrants.
 - (c) In order to attract as much interest from students as possible there is no limit on the number of entries an educational establishment may submit but an individual or group (maximum of 5 members – including one adult) may submit one composition and one entry only each. This is on the basis that each entry must be significantly different from any other submitted by the same educational establishment.
4. Entries are only accepted via social media (twitter and facebook) and must contain the hashtag #rugbyremembers to be eligible. Entries will be judged from those using #rugbyremembers between 10 April 2017 and 17 May 2017. Any links to additional research material must be hosted on a club or school website and must be an original composition or have the rights of the article owner to be linked to this competition. The Commission reserves the right to verify associated material with each entry.
5. The Commission reserves the right to disqualify any entrant if it has reasonable grounds for believing any of these terms and conditions have been breached or if there has been any duplication in multiple entries submitted by an educational establishment, or any infringement of third party rights including copyright; or at the decision of judging panel has not entered into the competition to support the aims of the Commission and the RFU Great War Commemorations of remembrance and education.
6. All competition entries must be received by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission no later than 5pm on 17 May 2017.
7. The Commission does not accept responsibility for late or incorrect entries and will only accept entries using the hashtag #rugbyremembers on Twitter or Facebook.
8. By submitting an entry to this competition an educational establishment
 - (a) undertakes to obtain any necessary parental consents as appropriate in connection with submitting a competition entry
 - (b) warrants that the composition entered is the original work of the student entrants and that the work does not violate, plagiarise or infringe the rights of third parties including copyright
 - (c) agrees that the Commission shall not be responsible for any breach or infringement of third party rights in the composition or otherwise and that it will indemnify the Commission against all legal fees, damages and other expenses that may be incurred by it as a result
 - (d) grants to the Commission and the RFU free of charge the right to use and right to licence others to use the composition for all Commission and RFU purposes. These purposes include administering the competition, use of entry on respective websites and on any products they may produce and elsewhere in all media in connection with the Commission's and RFU's promotional and educational activities and events surrounding this competition and otherwise. The use of the composition for these purposes will be at the discretion of the Commission and the RFU.
9. Prize winners will be chosen by a team of judges from the RFU and Commission. Prizes will be awarded to the winners based on the criteria of originality, creativity and effort. The decision of the judges will be final and no correspondence or discussion will be entered into. The best entries as determined by the judges will receive tickets to the Old Mutual Wealth Cup, England vs Barbarians on Sunday 28 May 2018 up to a maximum allocation of 20 tickets. Winning group entries (clubs or educational establishments) will receive 5 tickets per establishment. Individual entries will receive a pair of tickets. The RFU will make the tickets available for collection on the day. Tickets are non-transferable, refundable and are not for resale. There is no alternative prize. No further costs will be covered by the RFU or Commission and winners exempt the RFU and Commission from any further liability in relation to the visit.
10. It is anticipated results will be announced on Monday 22 May 2017.
11. The names of the winning schools or educational establishments or individuals will be published on the Commission's website. If the Commission is unable to contact a prize winner despite reasonable efforts to do so then that winner's prize will be forfeited and the Commission in its discretion will award the prize to an entrant selected by the judges. Winners will be expected to participate in any post-competition publicity if required by the Commission.
12. The Commission will use personal details of student entrants for the purposes only of administering the competition and will not publish them or provide them to any third party without first obtaining appropriate consents.
13. The Commission reserves the right to cancel the competition at any time if deemed necessary in its opinion and if circumstances arise outside of its control.

The Commission cannot be responsible for any damages, claims or costs incurred in the event of a visit being cancelled or arising from this competition or from the failure of an educational establishment to follow the instructions and guidelines given by the Commission.
