#### JEFF'S JOTTINGS...

As most of you know Naomi and I are huge lovers of our pets. Both she and I have had animals in our lives practically since day one, and so it would be extremely unusual to not have a four-legged critter greeting you at the parsonage door, should you stop for a visit. When we arrived in Troy nearly two years ago we had three dogs in our family – and since we have been here gained one more with the addition of Barb Burlison's tiny dachshund. However, within a 12 month period, we have lost to death two of our precious family members – one on my birthday last April, and the second – this past week.

Sugar, our scatter-brained English pointer mix, was probably 17 years or so old. We are not sure exactly, because she showed up at our church in Maryland, one morning, with a rope around her neck. We weren't sure if she had escaped someone's home, or been dropped off in the parking lot — as the frontage of the church faced a four lane highway, which would have been hard for her to cross. She arrived on the same day that our daughter Kara was having a birthday — slumber party, and that evening after drinking a gallon of water, and a ton of food, she snuggled in with a pile of laughing/giggling girls to be spoiled rotten. Sugar was always a quirky dog, generally scared of strange noises — like thunder, or the click of a camera, but was certainly one of the most agile dogs I have ever seen. She could easily lay her head on her back and sleep and could contort herself into all kinds of "uncomfortable-looking" positions…we frequently said she had no bones.

She rode in the car well, never growled at anyone, and barked so infrequently that we wondered if she knew how. She never tried to run away — always stayed close to the house, even without a fence. She didn't like getting a bath, and walking her on a leash for any length of time was near torture! She enjoyed being by herself, but when she wanted attention she would let you know of her presence. We also said that she never grew into her long legs, sometimes not knowing what to do with them when she was playing or sleeping.

Letting family and friends know that Sugar had passed on social media, the outpouring of love and prayers has been simply overwhelming. Friends from years ago touched base to offer their sympathy. I share all of this, even as I am aware that many of our church family have recently lost their loved pets, and are struggling as we are with a new life situation. While we still have two dogs at home to love on, we are missing Sugar, as we continue to miss Trooper that were so much a part of our daily routine. I know that for some of our folk, they lost their "only" dog or cat, and are not ready or not able emotionally to replace them.

I believe that God has placed these beloved pets in our lives as a way for us to learn what loving and losing is all about. They are innocent and as helpless as a child when they come into our care. They are dependent upon us for food and water and shelter. They are dependent upon us for touch, for care, for compassion, for helping them when they hurt, and making the most difficult decision of life when they are at the end of theirs. I cannot imagine how much money we have spent on the animals we have had in our married life, but I don't regret one dollar, because of the happiness and joy they have brought our life.

They seem to know when we are sad or depressed or hurting, remembering when I was healing after a serious car accident and was immobile for some time, how our dogs sat patiently beside me, bringing comfort and their version of care. Later when I suffered a heart attack and was resting at home they always seemed to be beside me in bed — watching me carefully and snuggling close.

All of this I have shared in this column, is only to say how important the lives of our pets are to those who care for them and love them. They have a special place in God's kingdom, this I believe, precious reminders of His immense love for us. Whether you own a dog, a cat, a fish or a hamster — they mean different things to all of us, and I cannot imagine living life without them. Bottom line — hug your pet (unless they are a fish!)...and love them dearly, as Christ our Lord loves you!

Let No Child Go




Here is a list of foods that we typically pack each week:
