As COVID-19 continues to spread around the country, we have become more aware of how interconnected we are. There are many people crowded in shelters at the border who will be facing this crisis soon and will need our help. One place that has a local connection is the **Kino Border Initiative** kinoborderinitiative.org, a bi-national organization founded by the Jesuits providing direct humanitarian assistance and accompaniment to migrants. 




