

What to do if you miss a Gaelic Intensive Day

Despite everyone's best efforts, you may have to miss a GID. You'll want to explore the missed coursework on your own, since later units build upon the missed material.

As soon as you know that you'll be missing a GID, **PLEASE contact your instructor ASAP to let them know that you will be absent**, and start making arrangements to make-up the work.

- 1) Using the **Z2G Schedule** and the **Z2G Syllabus**, figure out which topics will be covered during the GID to be missed. These are available in your **Welcome Packet** or for download from slighe.org
- 2) Using the **Z2G Syllabus**, study the topics using your textbook. Your presenter may have their own handouts. Contact your presenter to see if they will email copies to you.
- 3) You will need to make arrangements with your presenter to show him or her that you have sufficient knowledge of the material so your presenter may sign your **Attendance Card**.

At the end of the **Zero To Gaelic Program** you will need to have a complete set of signatures on your **Attendance Card** in order to graduate from the program and receive your **Z2G Completion Pin**. No exceptions.
