

1. ARI, THE LION

The king of the jungle is truly regal, with a massive mane of prairie fire carex. His face is accented with turkish sedum and irish moss on his chin. Creeping fig create a sleek coat for the lion's 4 by 6 foot high body. Sponsored by Greenwood Commissioners of Public Works

1. JIBARI, THE LION CUB

You can tell this two-foot tall baby is just waiting to be king. Three feet long, his body is completely made of creeping fig, with palm fiber ears, nose and tail just like dad. **Sponsored by Cox Accounting Solutions, LLC**

2. GERTIE & GIDGET, THE GIRAFFES

Palm fiber with carefully stained spots create the image of a real fourteenfoot tall mama giraffe. A miniature of Mama, her life-sized lovable newborn will delight you at six feet tall!

3. ALI'S BANANA BOY, THE HANGING MONKEY

This three-feet long, hanging monkey is looking dapper with his coat of variegated fig and palm fiber bow tiel Palm fiber is used to cover his hands, feet, tail, and mischievous face. **Sponsored by Town & Country Construction of SC. Inc.**

3. COCO, THE FUNKY MONKEY

Dressed in variegated fig with club moss hair, she delights onlookers while hanging from her favorite tree. Palm fiber hands, feet, tail, and face and a big bow complete this 2-feet tall charmer's look, in true southern style.

3. ALI, THE GATOR An amusing mix of hens & chicks with John Creech sedum create the illusion of the scales, ridges and shadows along the alligator's back. This six-foot long variegated fig alligator's smile full of red hypoestes, lets you know he's happy at home near the water.

3. HORTON, THE ELEPHANT BABY

Who doesn't love a baby elephant? This four-foot charmer made of creeping fig and ears of Spanish moss playfully spouts water from his curvy trunk. With a brilliant blanket made of yellow & white alternanthera and echeveria across his back, he is a real darling carrying a houdah spilling over with donkey tail, pork & beans, a variety of succulents, and portulaca. *Sponsored by Inn on the Square*

4. DINO DUDE, THE T-REX

At six-feet tall, the T-Rex will awe both children and adults. Covering the king of the dinosaurs are yellow, red and white alternanthera with variegated creeping fig. A mouth full of red hypoestes give him a menacing smile. A mosaic of white and yellow alternanthera, black ajuga, Turkish sedum, elephant food succulent, irish moss, & blue spruce sedum cover his back. 5. MILAK, THE ELEPHANT MAMA

Standing tall in a field of yellow sweet flag grass, salvia, cleome, corkscrew rush, coleus, portulaca, lantana, and tradescantia, Milak's body is covered with creeping fig and yellow alternanthera. Ears filled with soft Spanish moss highlight her massive twelve-foot height. Her colorful headdress and houdah add a visual punch filled with succulents, coleus, verbena, and alternanthera. 6. SWEET CAROLINE, THE BUTTERFLY A riot of bright colors and patterns, the five-foot high butterfly can be seen from near or far. Red alternantheras, lemon ball sedum, palm fiber, pink and white hypoestes, and lichen create intricate patterns on both sides of her six-foot wingspan. 9. THE DABBLING DUCKS

Five ducks playing beside the water are covered with lepttinella and sedum on their backs & low growing Turkish sedum on their wings. 9. SUNNY & RAY, THE TURTLES

Two painted turtles are hanging out with the ducks while enjoying a peaceful day by the water. The Turtles' shells are planted with a variety of vibrant succulents. **Sponsored by The Wiley Team**

10. KING KONG, THE GORILLA

This 6-foot tall ape boldly clutches an airplane atop a cityscape of yellow sweet flag grass, black ajuga, club moss, elephant food succulent, blue spruce sedum, and Turkish sedum. He comes to life with a vibrant coat of red ruby alternanthera and accents of palm fiber. *Sponsored by Greenwood Family Dentistry*

11. REEVES, THE MERMAID

Locks of chocolate creeping jenny frame a friendly face of lichen. Her body is covered in creeping fig while dwarf sweet flag, and variegated water celery trail down her graceful tail. A top of white & yellow alternanthera with ogon sedum compliment her belt and headpiece made from pink blush aloe and chalk stick succulents. Don't be shocked by her friends floating nearby! Jellyfish are made from succulents, sweet potato vine, meandering Linda coleus, portulaca, wire vine, silver falls dichondra, bromeliads, and oyster plant. Sponsored by Cambridge Dental Associates

11. PINK PRINCESS, THE FROG

Ready to make a splash, this sweet frog spouts water into her pond. Adorned with a crown of pink blush aloe and ogon sedum, she is covered in variegated creeping fig while her webbed feet are comprised of lichen.

11. STENNOLISSA, THE DOLPHIN

12. JEEP WRANGLER

This custom-built, 4/5th scale jeep is exactly what you need on your topiary safari. An "annual" favorite, the jeep sports an exterior of blue spruce, lemon ball, and Turkish sedums. Creeping fig, clubmoss, palm fiber, and Spanish moss create a cool interior. Creeping fig covers the grill and roof, while the customized lichen license plate finishes it off. 13. SMILE, PHOTO OP

14. BARBIE-Q, THE PIG

15. BRINGING LIGHT TO LIFE PAVILION

You'll have it made in the shade when you stop to visit one of the Festival's most dynamic creations – an arching pavilion covered with a variety of spreading annuals and a new copper roof! 16. GRRRRR KASASA, THE TIGER

Beware the fourteen-foot-tall, seventeen-foot-long, ferocious tiger sculpted of orange palm fiber. He proudly guards a waterfall of weeping love grass and petunias, this topiary is inspired by one of R. Thornwell Dunlap, Jr.'s favorite sculptures. With massive jaws and mighty paws, the Lander University Bearcat proudly towers over you at eleven feet tall and six feet wide.
