We are now accepeting applications for our 2020 Artist Awards. The aim of these programs is to support outstanding emerging visual and literary artists working in some area related to plants, gardens, landscapes, and place.

The Award

All visual artists will be considered for the Eliza Moore Fellowship for Artistic Excellence – a \$10,000 grant and two-week residency for one awardee on mutually agreeable dates in 2020. Applicants (visual artists, writers, and theater artists) can also elect to be considered for the Artist in Residence (AiR) Program – a \$1,500 grant as part of a 6-week residency. If being considered for the AiR, there will be two 2020 residency periods: in the Summer (May 31st - July 10th, 2020) and in the Fall (September 20th - October 30th, 2020). Applicants can choose to apply for either or both residency periods. In 2020, we plan to award one Eliza Moore Fellowship and about 14 Artists in Residence. All awardees are provided housing accommodation and 24-hour access to studio space on the Oak Spring estate in the Virginia Piedmont region. Transportation to/from Washington, D.C. is the responsibility of the applicant. Oak Spring will arrange and pay for ground transportation to/from Oak Spring (from either Dulles Airport or Union Station). Visit www.OSGF.org/artists for more information.

Eligibility

All applicants for both the Eliza Moore Fellowship for Artistic Excellence and the Artist in Residence Program must be an early-career artist (see www.OSGF.org/artists to see more information on how we define this). The awardees must be available (and have their own visa, if a non-resident/citizen) for a residency on the Oak Spring estate in Upperville, Virginia.

Application Process

 - i) a resume/curriculum vitae,
 - ii) a short description of your creative practice and your interest in the Oak Spring Estate and/or Oak Spring Garden Library and what you hope to gain from the experience,
 - iii) any and all relevant links/uploads to/of an online portfolio of work, and
 - iv) references who can speak to your artistic practice and suitability as a resident.

Applicants are expected to show exceptional promise and artistic excellence, as well as superior communication skills. The awardees will be selected by a panel of distinguished administrators, scholars, or practitioners with relevant experience and/or knowledge.
