Services: **Day Treatment** program focuses on treatment, relapse prevention, and recovery for individuals with serious mental illness and addiction concerns. Day Treatment provides the consumer with the opportunity to participate in a structured therapeutic program while being able to reside in the community. Activities include, but are not limited to, group counseling, education, skill building, recreational therapy, and family services.

Specialized Residential Services Population (SRSP) is a long term (up to 6 months) residential program for adults with serious mental illness and or co-occurring alcohol and other drug problems. Referrals to the SRSP are received through case managers and social workers. The SRSP includes the following components: observation, monitoring and treatment twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week. Individual and group programming and activities are provided to facilitate recovery and assist the consumer to live successfully in the community, maintain an abstinent lifestyle, regain employment, develop and maintain social relationships, or to independently participate in social, interpersonal, community and peer support activities to increase community stability.

Crisis Support Management (CSM) services provide time-limited support and interventions to individuals who are in crisis and in need of necessary services, and are not linked to a case manager. The goal of the program is to return consumers who have known or suspected mental health or substance abuse diagnosis to their pre-crisis state. Services typically include assisting the individual in stabilizing community living and accessing needed services. Services are provided by crisis case managers with education, experience and training in crisis stabilization. CSM provides services throughout Oahu, Kauai and the island of Hawaii.

Adult Drug and Alcohol Division (ADAD-ICM) is an Integrated Case Management (ICM) program for persons with drug and alcohol problems who are under the supervision of one of four departments of the Criminal Justice System (Department of Public Safety's Intake Service Center, Judiciary's Adult Probation, Department of Public Safety's Corrections Division, Hawaii paroling Authority), who refer individuals for this service. Service is provided on the islands of Hawaii, Kauai, Maui, and Oahu. The primary purpose of this program is to rehabilitate and enable individuals to return to the highest possible level of functioning.

Intensive Outpatient (IOP) services to all age groups and includes access to adjunct therapies that support recovery for the individual and family. We currently offer outpatient and intensive outpatient services for both adolescents and adults—an expanded array of services that include on-site assessments, co-occurring disorder services, and matching the client to the appropriate services. The Intensive Outpatient program meets 3 times a week for 3 hours for 12-16 weeks

Pakolea ADAD Intensive Outpatient Treatment Program provides intensive outpatient substance abuse treatment services for adolescents who meet DSM IV-TR substance abuse/dependence criteria. The program uses a curriculum to teach about positive coping skills, improve self-efficacy and build social skills. Referrals accepted from parents, schools, other providers, etc. with preference given to Windward youth.

Services: CHAMP clinics has counselors to help patients with changes pertinent to recovery in several stages: planning the change, implementing the change, monitoring, reminding patients of change, and assessment focused on patient's readiness to reintegrate into the community. They also provide emotional support by incorporating scheduled and an open door policy to guide patients through recovery.

Methadone Maintenance: Methadone maintenance therapy is the most widely known and well researched treatment for opioid (heroin and narcotic pain medicines) dependency. The maintenance phase can be used as a long/short term therapy until the patient demonstrates the qualities required for successful detoxification.

Detoxification Treatment: Detoxification is indicated when a patient demonstrates consistent, long-term abstinence and possesses adequate supportive resources (e.g., productive use of time, a stable home life). Gradual detoxification tends to be more successful than a sudden does discontinuation. For these reasons, detoxification must be undertaken on a case-by-case basis.

Case Management: Case management will enhance the scope of addictions treatment and the recovery continuum. Two reasons why case management is effective as adjunct to substance abuse treatment. First, retention in treatment is associated with better outcomes and a principal goal of case management is to keep clients engaged in treatment and moving toward recovery. Second, treatment may be more likely to succeed when a cline's other problems are addressed concurrently with substance abuse. Case management focuses on the whole individual.

Vocational Planning: Experienced counselors are equipped with proper government and community resources; and provide proper referrals to help opiate dependent patients take action & achieve their goals.

Residential Treatment: Highest level of care is their residential treatment program that offers structured programming from wake up to lights out. Cultures- Western curriculum include: cognitive behavioral therapy (CBT), dialectical behavior therapy (DBT), trauma-informed care, social skills training, 12-step familiarization classes, smoking cessation classes, health and nutrition classes, physical recreation opportunities, gender specific process groups, cinema therapy, financial literacy, and several other living skills classes.

Non-Residential Treatment: Intensive outpatient group sessions are about 9-15 hours a week for 4-8 weeks. Less intensive Outpatient group sessions and support services are about 6-9 hours a week for 2-4 weeks. Outpatient group sessions and support services are about 3-6 hours for 6-8 weeks. Stage II recovery continuing care and support services are about 2-4 hours for 6-8 weeks prior to graduation.

Pono Youth Program: aims to reduce risk and cultivate resiliency in the young people of Hawaii. It targets youth (ages 12-25) from high risk populations including: native Hawaiian youth, lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, questioning (LGBTQ) youth, youth with special needs, foster and former-foster youth, young mental health consumers, adjudicated youth, and rural youth.

Grow A Rainbow: offers resources and strategies for supporting Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Questioning Youth (LGBTQ) youth and families. For the last several years, Mental Health America of Hawaii has helped community groups and schools create "safe spaces" for LGBTQ youth – programs that are welcoming and empowering to these youth. Mental Health America of Hawaii has worked extensively with GLSEN Hawaii (Gay, Lesbian, Straight Education Network) and GSA's (Gay-Straight Alliance) in the schools.

College Mental Health Project: This project offers programs at Windward Community College and Leeward Community College to train students, faculty and staff about how to recognize and obtain help for people with mental health problems, and to reduce the stigma of mental illness by conducting campus-wide awareness campaigns.

Services: **Day Treatment** program focuses on treatment, relapse prevention, and recovery for individuals with serious mental illness and addiction concerns. Day Treatment provides the consumer with the opportunity to participate in a structured therapeutic program while being able to reside in the community. Activities include, but are not limited to, group counseling, education, skill building, recreational therapy, and family services.

Specialized Residential Services Population (SRSP) is a long term (up to 6 months) residential program for adults with serious mental illness and or co-occurring alcohol and other drug problems. Referrals to the SRSP are received through case managers and social workers. The SRSP includes the following components: observation, monitoring and treatment twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week. Individual and group programming and activities are provided to facilitate recovery and assist the consumer to live successfully in the community, maintain an abstinent lifestyle, regain employment, develop and maintain social relationships, or to independently participate in social, interpersonal, community and peer support activities to increase community stability.

Crisis Support Management (CSM) services provide time-limited support and interventions to individuals who are in crisis and in need of necessary services, and are not linked to a case manager. The goal of the program is to return consumers who have known or suspected mental health or substance abuse diagnosis to their pre-crisis state. Services typically include assisting the individual in stabilizing community living and accessing needed services. Services are provided by crisis case managers with education, experience and training in crisis stabilization. CSM provides services throughout Oahu, Kauai and the island of Hawaii.

Adult Drug and Alcohol Division (ADAD-ICM) is an Integrated Case Management (ICM) program for persons with drug and alcohol problems who are under the supervision of one of four departments of the Criminal Justice System (Department of Public Safety's Intake Service Center, Judiciary's Adult Probation, Department of Public Safety's Corrections Division, Hawaii paroling Authority), who refer individuals for this service. Service is provided on the islands of Hawaii, Kauai, Maui, and Oahu. The primary purpose of this program is to rehabilitate and enable individuals to return to the highest possible level of functioning.

Intensive Outpatient (IOP) services to all age groups and includes access to adjunct therapies that support recovery for the individual and family. We currently offer outpatient and intensive outpatient services for both adolescents and adults—an expanded array of services that include on-site assessments, co-occurring disorder services, and matching the client to the appropriate services. in the community, maintain an abstinent lifestyle, regain employment, develop and maintain social relationships, or to independently participate in social, interpersonal, community and peer support activities to increase community stability.

Crisis Support Management (CSM) services provide time-limited support and interventions to individuals who are in crisis and in need of necessary services, and are not linked to a case manager. The goal of the program is to return consumers who have known or suspected mental health or substance abuse diagnosis to their pre-crisis state. Services typically include assisting the individual in stabilizing community living and accessing needed services. Services are provided by crisis case managers with education, experience and training in crisis stabilization. CSM provides services throughout Oahu, Kauai and the island of Hawaii.

Adult Drug and Alcohol Division (ADAD-ICM) is an Integrated Case Management (ICM) program for persons with drug and alcohol problems who are under the supervision of one of four departments of the Criminal Justice System (Department of Public Safety’s Intake Service Center, Judiciary’s Adult Probation, Department of Public Safety’s Corrections Division, Hawaii paroling Authority), who refer individuals for this service. Service is provided on the islands of Hawaii, Kauai, Maui, and Oahu. The primary purpose of this program is to rehabilitate and enable individuals to return to the highest possible level of functioning.

Intensive Outpatient (IOP) services to all age groups and includes access to adjunct therapies that support recovery for the individual and family. We currently offer outpatient and intensive outpatient services for both adolescents and adults—an expanded array of services that include on-site assessments, co-occurring disorder services, and matching the client to the appropriate services. The Intensive Outpatient program meets 3 times a week for 3 hours for 12-16 weeks.
