

## **Two injured in single vehicle crash in Bowling Green**

A single vehicle car crash on Stonehenge Avenue just off Veteran's Memorial sends two to the hospital.

A white Toyota Tundra, driven by Ismael Sanchez, was driving down Stonehenge Avenue Sunday night when it flipped upside down in a yard.

Sanchez, and his passenger, Gustavo Vazquez Nunez, were ejected from the vehicle.

Matthew Croft was sitting in his truck listening to the radio, two blocks away, when he heard "the tires screeching a boom like a car wreck." He ran over to make sure everyone was safe.

When Croft reached Stonehenge Avenue, he "saw a bunch of people and the truck" overturned in someone's yard. He added, "I saw two guys lying in the street."

Croft mentioned feeling scared because he thought the accident looked "pretty bad." He described the scene saying, "The truck was beat up pretty good, and it looked like they were hurt pretty bad. One guy was unconscious. I knew he was unconscious, and the other guy kind of looked like he might have been moving a little bit, but not much."

Croft talked to one person at the scene who saw the entire event happen. The witness told Croft, "They were going way too fast, and they lost control of the vehicle. It flipped two times, and one guy was thrown out while the other guy crawled out."

The Bowling Green Police Department and Fire Department were on the scene of the wreck and shut off the road to all traffic for over an hour.

Nunez was taken to Skyline Medical Center, while Sanchez was taken to the Medical Center in Bowling Green.

Alcohol was believed to be a factor.
