Why Attend Class? Teaching provides a means to communicate, better understand and build a relationship with our dogs! *We are asking the dog to live with us in our environment and according to our rules. It is only fair for us to teach our dog companions these rules.* A well-mannered, socialized dog is a joy to live with and teaching is a crucial step toward ensuring your dog becomes a well-behaved and enjoyable family pet. Our classes will help you teach, socialize and communicate with your dog.

The teaching method is based on kindness and respect. We use positive reinforcement such as praise, toys, playtime, or treats to motivate and reward desirable behaviors.

Humane Society of West Michigan offers assistance with:

- Socializing
- House Training
- Chewing
- Barking
- Play Biting
- Additional areas of concern

Items needed for the classes:

- Leash: 4 to 6 foot leather, nylon or cotton leash. Do NOT use chain as it is too hard on your hands during training and is harder to give clear signals to your dog. Also please NO retractable leashes.
- Collar: Nylon collars or martingale collars

Option 1: Puppy Preschool - HSWM Training Center - Thursday 6:00pm-7:00pm

Get your pup off to a good start with this puppy class! Learn to safely socialize your puppy and enjoy the playtime! Your puppy will not only learn basic skills, but how to be calm and relax. You and your puppy will learn how to play properly to avoid inappropriate mouthing and chewing. Puppy class is a great way to prevent some behavior issues from happening while learning effective ways to teach your puppy! Designed for puppies aged: 4 months and under. **Open enrollment, class is 5 consecutive attendance.**

Option #2: Puppy Kindergarten - HSWM Training Center - Tuesday 6:15pm-7:15pm

Get your pup off to a good start with this new program designed by the American Kennel Club. You'll learn how to effectively communicate with your dog and your pup will be able to socialize with other dogs. Upon completion of the course your puppy will be eligible for the AKC S.T.A.R. Puppy evaluation, and demonstrate basic manners such as sit, down, walk nicely on leash and much more! Designed for dogs aged: 4 months - 1 year old.

Option #3: Elementary School: Manners Matter—HSWM Training Center—Wednesdays 6:15pm-7:15pm

This class is designed for dogs 5 months and older who have never had a previous training class and for those who will benefit by taking the class again. The focus of the class is on good doggy manners and the basic cues of sit, stay, down, come, "leave it," and walking on a loose leash.

Option #4: High School Jocks: Find the Beauty in your Beast—HSWM Training Center—Tuesdays 7:30pm-8:30pm

This unique class is designed to help you and your "bully" breed better understand each other. This class focuses on basic manners, basic cues and specific issues pertaining to reactive dogs and how best to manage their athletic skills and impulses. Dogs do NOT socialize with each other, but learn to respond properly in presence of each other. **First night of class is WITHOUT dogs.**

Option #5: High School Wallflowers: Find the Courage in your Canine—HSWM Training Center- Wednesdays 7:30pm-8:30pm

Is your dog a little shy around new people and dogs? This class is designed to teach basic manners and cues while building your dog's confidence by acquiring new skills. Dogs and people alike benefit from building new skills and learning that they can have control over their environment. This class will help you teach your dog to blossom. **First night of class is WITHOUT dogs.**

Option #6: Intermediate Dog Obedience—Chow Hound Standale—Mondays 6:15pm-7:00pm

In this class you'll expand on your dog's skills so that he can visit the public places showing his good manners. You will work towards passing the AKC's Canine Good Citizen evaluation. Canine Good Citizen is often a pre-requisite to becoming a therapy dog and is a must for anyone interested in activities with your dog. We must have 2-5 dogs in this class to hold a session. **This class is 5 consecutive weeks and must have 2-5 dogs to hold a session.**

Option #7: Beginner Dog Obedience—The Barkery in Sparta—Mondays 6:30pm-7:30pm

In this class you'll learn the same techniques taught at the HSWM Elementary School classes, except these classes will be small in size and held at The Barkery in Sparta. **This class is 5 consecutive weeks and must have 2-5 dogs to hold a session.** [The Barkery \(29 Ida Red, Sparta, MI 49345\)](#)

Please Note: Owners are required to send proof of vaccinations for **Distemper, Bordatella & Rabies** with their registration form. A current Titer test is also acceptable. **Places in class can only be held if both payment and proof of vaccinations are received.**

Important: For the protection of your pet and others do not bring your dog to class if he/she has been recently sick (coughing, vomiting, loose stool, mange, etc.). This is also true for female dogs in heat. Please leave your dog at home, but you are encouraged to attend class so you can have the information to practice during the week. Children and your adults are welcomed, but must be accompanied by an adult.
