Greg begins his 33rd year as a golf professional and player development specialist. In 1999, Greg completed studies and testing to earn the PGA of America's highest teaching distinction – PGA Master Professional of Instruction. He has given over 25,000 lessons to amateurs, professionals, and golf school students. A St. Paul native and University of Minnesota graduate, he spent nearly 9 years in Florida teaching at clubs and at the country's top-ranked golf academy.

His peers honored him with the 2014 Player Development Award, 2012 MN PGA Horton Smith Award for Education, the 2007 MN PGA Teacher of the Year Award and the 2006 MN PGA Junior Golf Leader Award becoming the first and only MNPGA Professional in Minnesota history to be the recipient of these 4 awards. He has given personal instruction to a Minnesota PGA Player-of-the-Year, Minnesota PGA Senior Player-of-the-Year, Minnesota State High School Champion, Minnesota State Open Champions and 3 inductees in the Minnesota Golf Hall-of-Fame. He uses this experience and knowledge to SIMPLIFY his instruction for players of EVERY level.

Greg has been listed in Golf Digests "Best Teacher's in your State," Golf Range Magazine's "Top 50 Instructors in America" and Honorable Mention "Top 50 Kids Instructor in America" by U.S. Kids Golf. In 2008, he completed studies to become a Titleist Performance Institute Certified Golf Fitness Instructor. His greatest honor was the 2000 "Distinguished Service Award" from the Minnesota Special Olympics for directing clinics, fall games, and certification classes for parents and coaches.

Greg is a regularly featured speaker at Minnesota PGA Teaching Seminars. He has had nearly 90 instruction articles published in newspapers, blogs and magazines. He has appeared as a featured instructor on The Golf Channel, every major TV network in the Twin Cities and hosted his own weekly golf radio show on CBS Sports Radio.
