- An estimated 16 million Americans will have Alzheimer's disease by 2050
- Every 67 seconds someone develops Alzheimer's disease in the United States
- 1 in 9 individuals ages 65+ has Alzheimer's disease
- Alzheimer's disease is the 6th leading cause of death in the United States
