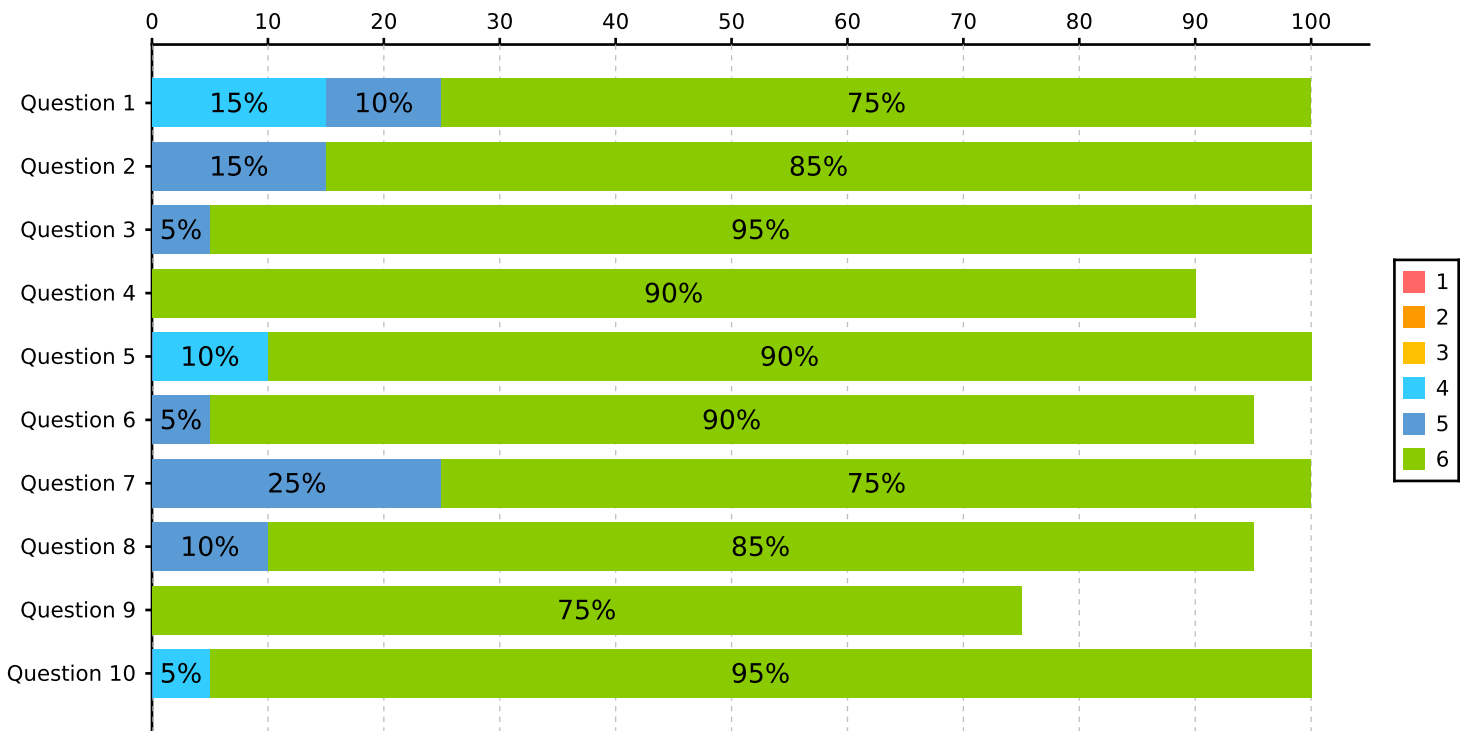

more guest lectures

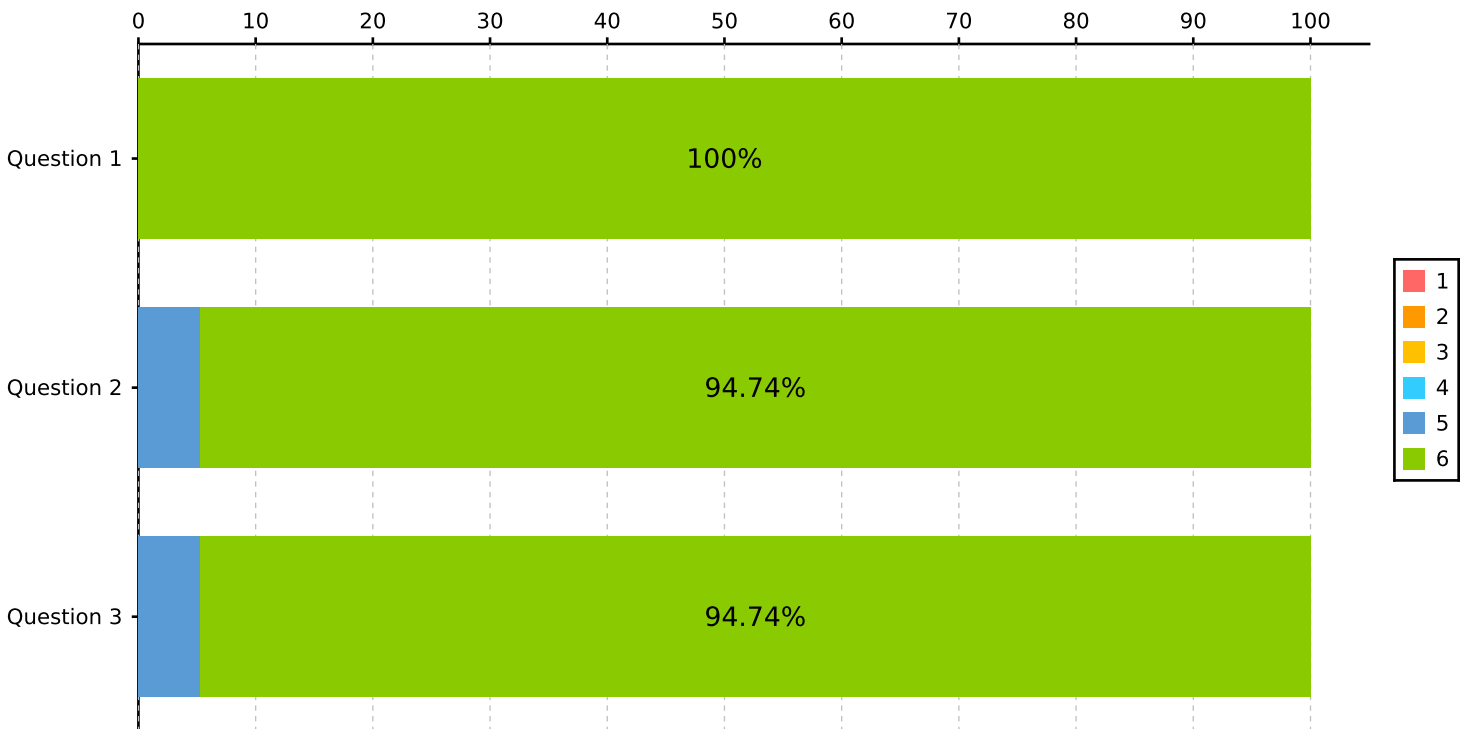
Maybe connect better the theory with the experiments
