SPRING 2018 COACH'S NOTE

What a year for Columbia Sailing! From the Sixth Annual Fundraiser at the New York Yacht Club in February to topping off our season with two conference championship appearances and everything in between, the club has continued to make important strides forward. It has truly been my honor to be at the helm of this club for another season. Columbia Sailing is comprised of an amazing group of sailors, who not only demonstrate a tremendous amount of talent in their sport but who are dedicated to every step in the process along the way. To CUST members current and past, families, and friends: you have so much to be proud of.

The season kicked off this year with the Sixth Annual Winter Fundraiser at the New York Yacht Club in Midtown, Manhattan. The Officer Board took on the task of planning and executing the evening with ease, providing sailors, their families and guests with a night to remember. Our goal for the fundraiser was to cover the cost of a new floating dock for our fleet of Fls, as our existing dock had been rendered unsafe to use due to fall storms. Though we fell short of our goal, the funds we raised as part of the event assisted in the purchase of three new dollies that were used to launch our fleet this spring. The club will continue its fundraising efforts with the goal of building a new dock for the Fall 2018 season. Thank you to all who attended and donated this year!

Upon purchase of the new dollies, the club was able to begin practice in late March. Despite the wind, rain, and snow sailors were dedicated to attending practice and working hard in order to make up for our late start. This season at



practice we focused on building the existing knowledge of beginner sailors in order to prepare them for competition at regattas and refining the skills of our more advanced sailors to improve our regatta results. The hard work of all sailors contributed to the team's successes this season.

After two weeks of Interconference competition, the club entered into the qualifier portion of our season. Led by Captain Elizabeth Keeney and Co-Captain Lily Loosbrock and seniors Adam De Vita and Bailey Fryer, Columbia demonstrated well-refined skills, earning a bid to the MAISA Co-Ed Conference Championship. The women's team finished IIth at the MAISA Women's Conference Championship, matching Columbia's finish last year and falling only two spots short of a bid to the ICSA Women's National Semifinals. Both the co-ed and women's team ended the season hungry to improve for next year.

I would like to sincerely thank everyone who made this season so special for our team. Columbia Sailing could not thrive without the continued support of our sailors, their families, and our alumni. We look forward to connecting with our network over the summer and into the next season!
