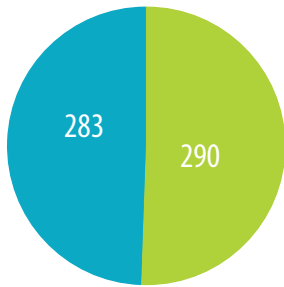

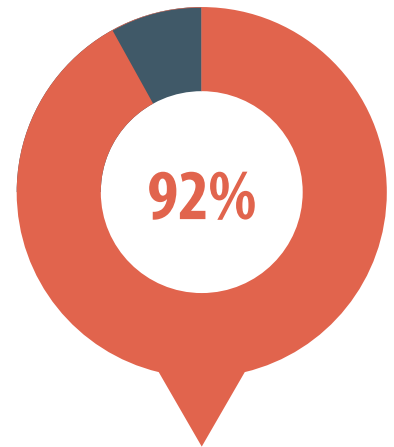

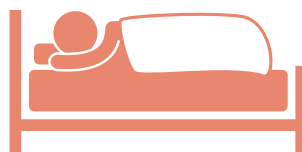
OUTCOMES

ABOUT

Catholic Charities Assisted Housing & Health supports and stabilizes housing for men and women living in the City and County of San Francisco who have HIV/AIDS. Clients are provided with access for housing combined with other support services.

The program was established in 1985 to stabilize the precarious housing situations of low-income people with HIV/AIDS through rent subsidies. Through the program, clients may receive case management, referrals to community support and counseling. Assisted Housing & Health also collaborates with other HIV service providers in the county to ensure that clients' medical, psychological, social, and vocational needs are met.

Assisted Housing & Health serves as a major link in the HIV continuum of care through education, counseling and support.
