The North American bent metal furniture brand introduces the carbon neutral Twigz café collection in Chicago

With its minimal frame, Twigz proves that you don't need a lot to make a big impact. Think of this collection like blue eyeshadow – less is definitely more. Comprised of a chair, a two-seater bench, a rectangular dining table and a round café table, Twigz is a standout collection that will make everyone stop and say, "Ooh la la."

Launching today at NeoCon, June 12-14 in Chicago, Twigz is the first collaboration between Division Twelve and designers Andrew Jones and Nathalie de Leval. As with all Division Twelve products, Twigz is a certified carbon neutral furniture collection – something you can definitely brag about at your next garden party.

"We are excited to introduce a multi-piece café collection into the Division Twelve product line," says Mike Keilhauer, Division Twelve CEO. "With Twigz, Division Twelve's signature style of playfulness is present, but there is also a strong sense of sophistication within the pieces, which provides a different spin on the brand."

The Twigz collection combines minimal-yet-striking silhouettes with soft curving elements that create products that are classic while remaining infused with Division Twelve's signature fun, playful personality. Twigz is modestly scaled with a light footprint, allowing the pieces to fit within smaller spaces like bustling summer patios or the tiniest of chic French bistros, designed with the purpose of bringing people together.

"When designing this collection, comfort was very important to us," says Jones & de Leval. "The products needed to feel right, but also maintain this aspect of joy – it needed to be something practical, something comfortable, and something joyful. That's the sweet spot we were trying to hit."

The hero of the collection, the Twigz chair has a charming, elegant silhouette and a curved backrest that supports and comforts the user through its simple frame. The chair's back legs are also slightly curved, further highlighting that bent metal furniture does not always have to be so rigid – it still has the ability to be refined and subtle, echoing the human curves of the user.

The Twigz collection's signature detail is the construction illusion that the products are created from one seamless piece of metal. This is achieved through blended welds between the rails and the tubular legs of the pieces. This design detail provides strength to each item, while also adding to the overall beautiful design aesthetic of the collection. This blending construction detail is also present within the Twigz bench and tables.

"This blending detail gives the collection a crafted, human quality," adds Jones & de Leval. "It shows that these pieces have been made by hand; someone has taken some real care to craft these elements."

Twigz is intended for both indoor and outdoor use, and its pieces come in café height. The Twigz chair and bench are available in white oak, steel or upholstered models, and the chair's backrest is constructed from aluminium. For convenience and storage ability, the chair is stackable. All Twigz product frames come with a standard glide or a heavy duty option for more heavy-use indoor spaces. The rectangular Twigz table is available in three sizes – 8 seater, 6 seater and 4 seater. The circular Twigz table was designed to be used with 3-4 Twigz chairs.
