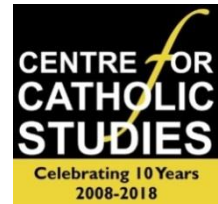

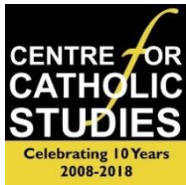

**Conference for the 450th anniversary of the founding of the English College at Douai:
The English College, Douai and British and Irish Catholic Exile**

The English College at Douai was, nominally, the first purpose-designed seminary in the world following the Council of Trent. What it initiated was a missionary endeavour on the western fringes of Europe, one mirrored by other nations in the area. As well as being part of the wider European and, indeed, global Church, the college was also a key part of the Catholic exile movement, in which women featured prominently. The conference will also consider the challenges facing and futures of seminaries, the foundation of the English College at Douai having been pioneering in its day.
