## Biographical / Historical Note

Albert Louis Lieutaud was an arts and manuscript dealer in New Orleans in the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Lieutaud and his wife purchased numerous manuscripts, maps, watercolors, and other ephemera that document Louisiana from the 18<sup>th</sup> to the 20<sup>th</sup> centuries.

## Scope and Content

The Albert L. Lieutaud collection consists of ephemera which partially documents the business of slavery and social life in Louisiana in ht 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> centuries. It consists of business correspondence between Martinique to Marseille on the slave trade. There are also several receipts for the sale of stock and feed. In addition the collection consists of invitations, a valentine, and a playbill.

These materials are possibly from Lieutaud's arts and manuscripts collection.
