Biographical / Historical Note

Huey Pierce Long was a Louisiana politician and lawyer who served as governor of the state from 1928 to 1932 and US Senator from 1932 to 1935. As governor, he was responsible for legislation that improved infrastructure, increased literacy, and developed public works. He was assassinated in the Louisiana State Capitol on September 10, 1935.

Scope and Content

This collection contains 31 folders of articles relating to Huey P. Long, his time as governor and senator, and his death.
