This year's conference organizers are delighted to invite you to another exciting event. We meet at the 4-H Conference Center, in beautiful Chevy Chase, Maryland. The 4-H Conference Center runs like a hotel. It sits on 12 acres in the well known neighborhood of Chevy Chase, Maryland. Staying at this location helps to support a 4-H positive youth development by providing funds and resources to deliver their programs to millions of youth around the world. The youth will utilize the bunk bed rooms.

You can reach Chevy Chase by plane, train, bus, and car. We suggest you make your travel plans and reservations as soon as possible.

By Plane: Airports are

Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport: 12 miles

-Taxicab – available from terminals – approximately \$30

-Metrorail – take Blue Line to Metro Center or Yellow Line to Gallery Place-Chinatown. Transfer to Red Line towards Shady Grove. Get off at Friendship Heights stop. Take Metrobus L8 toward Aspen Hill or the Ride-On Bus #1 or #11, and get off at Connecticut Avenue and Taylor Street. You will have to cross the street to the entrance of the Center.

Dulles International Airport: 26 miles

-Taxicab – available from terminals – approximately \$65

-Airport bus – ask for assistance from Ground Transportation Desk

Baltimore-Washington International Airport: 35 miles

-Airport limo or taxicab available – ask for assistance at the Ground Transportation Desk on the lower level. Taxicab approximately \$65

CSJO 2018 Conference Highlights

Keynote speakers: Saturday May 26 10:30 – 11:45 a.m.



Jordan Shuster:

Jordan Shuster has proudly represented the CSJO Youth for the past two years as the Youth Representative to the Executive Committee. She has been attending CSJO conferences since 2010 and is a graduate of the Jewish Children's Folkshul in Philadelphia, PA. Jordi will graduate from Drexel University in June 2018 with B.S. degrees in Civil Engineering and Architectural Engineering, and she plans to transition one day into a career as an engineering librarian. In her (admittedly limited) spare time, Jordi can be found reading, singing, and walking shelter dogs as a volunteer for the Philadelphia Animal Welfare Society (PAWS).



Herb Silverman:

Secular Coalition for America President Herb Silverman delivers opening remarks at our briefing with administration officials.

Herb Silverman is Distinguished Professor Emeritus of Mathematics at the College of Charleston, founder of the Secular Coalition for America, founder of the Secular Humanists of the Lowcountry in Charleston, SC, founder of the Atheist/Humanist Alliance student group at the College of Charleston, and a recipient of the American Humanist Association Lifetime Achievement Award. In 1990, a colleague pointed out that atheists were ineligible to hold public office in South Carolina. After an eight-year battle, Herb won a unanimous decision in the South Carolina Supreme Court, which struck down this religious test requirement. He has written for the for the Washington Post, Huffington Post, The Humanist, Free Inquiry, Humanistic Judaism, and other magazines and blogs. Herb has appeared in a number of debates on topics that include: Can we be moral without God? Does God exist? Is America a Christian nation? He has also debated at Oxford University in England on the topic, Does American Religion Undermine American Values?

Herb's books include *Candidate Without a Prayer: An Autobiography of a Jewish Atheist in the Bible Belt* and *An Atheist Stranger in a Strange Religious Land*. You can browse a collection of his public speeches and debates [here](#), and visit his website <http://www.herbsilverman.com>
