Genealogists know that finding proof of some relationships can be easy, but some problems may be more complex and not have an obvious solution. Understanding and using GPS elevates genealogy outcomes to the highest standards of research and answers questions that may have little documentary evidence. This lecture defines the 5 steps of the GPS and shows a case study of a complex problem that was solved with research, creativity, attention to detail and a defined process.

The Fromelles Genealogy Project: From WW1 Mass Grave to 21st Century Named Grave

In May 2008 250 WW1 soldiers were uncovered in a mass grave in France; this led to the instigation of a ground-breaking project to discover who these men were via DNA testing, anthropological study and genealogical research. This presentation will talk about the project with a specific focus on how genealogical detective work has so far helped to identify 150 of those men and give them named graves in the first military cemetery to be built in France in over 50 years. It will also tell some of their stories and give a brief overview of how to trace DNA-appropriate relatives and your own WW1 war dead.
