COST OF LIVING IN SITKA

According to the July 2019 issue of Alaska Economic Trends, housing is the largest expense for the average household. Housing takes up 40.2% of Alaskan spending. In Sitka, the average rent is \$1,241 which is second only to Kodiak, the city with the most expensive rent in Alaska. The average rent in Juneau is \$1,167 and in Ketchikan rent is \$1,149.

In the first quarter of 2019 the statewide average sale price of a 2 bedroom single family home was \$319,896. The price in Juneau was \$385.038 and \$346,450 in Ketchikan. Sitka was not included in the study of homes sold. In early August we found 31 single family homes were listed for sale online with an average price of \$467,803. The average list price of a two or three bedroom single family home in Sitka is \$373,992.

In 2018, Alaska was number 7 of the top ten highest cost of living states at 30.6% higher than average. In this issue of the Sitka Trends we will explore the cost of living in Sitka. The link to the Alaska Economic Trends is: http://labor.state.ak.us/trends/jul19.pdf.

UTILITY COST

Electricity, water, wastewater treatment, and refuse (trash) are the public utilities that residents of Sitka pay. Base rates range from \$167.96 to \$191.83 plus 5% or 6% tax, depending on the time of year, with electricity usage added. According to the City of Sitka CAFR-FY18 the average monthly residential electric bill was \$165. Add water, wastewater, and refuse to the electric bill and Sitkans pay an average of \$312 to \$336 for monthly utilities.



With an average rent of \$1,241 and average utilities of \$312 (with the smaller refuse bin) Sitkans can expect to pay \$1,553 monthly for housing and utilities.

GAS/FUEL

Many families in Sitka use fuel to heat their homes. In July the price of #1 fuel was \$3.12 a gallon. This is an average of the prices from the two local providers. Both Juneau and Wrangell had slightly higher fuel prices in July, at \$3.31 and \$3.55.

Sitka has 14 miles of beautiful road with an average commute time of around 10 minutes. In Juneau gas is less expensive than in Sitka. They paid \$3.31/gallon in July




while we paid \$3.82/gallon. The price in Wrangell was close to Sitka at \$3.84/gallon. Compared with many other locations Sitkans have a relatively short commute and do not need as much gas as someone who has a 26 minute commute (the national average). COST OF COMMON ITEMS AND SERVICES

The Alaska Economic Trends included a section of what common items and services cost in early 2019. They compared costs in Anchorage, Fairbanks, and Juneau with the U.S. Average cost. Since Sitka was not included we found similar items and services in Sitka, but our prices are from August instead of early 2019.

EYE EXAM

The price of a vision exam in Sitka was not included in the Alaska Economic Trends, so we called the




two local providers for prices. For an eye exam in Sitka the price ranges from \$175 to \$493.50, with an average cost of \$316. The lowest price is a cash discounted price from the normal \$200 cost of an exam at one vision provider. The other provider has two prices for an eye exam also, \$395.50 for an established patient or \$493.50 for a new vision patient. The average eye exam costs in Juneau, Anchorage, and the U.S. average are included in this chart for comparison.



PERSONAL CARE

Another area the Alaska Economic Trends touched on is the cost of a haircut at a barber or a salon cut and style. Like the eye exam, we called to local vendors for prices to find local costs. Sitka is very close in price to Juneau for a haircut at the barber. The price of a salon cut and style varies from \$38 to \$78 depending on the length of hair and the experience of the stylist. FOOD ITEMS



This chart includes the lowest price available from various locations for common food items. A medium cheese pizza from one restaurant in Sitka is \$15.35. In Juneau it was \$11.99 and \$10.99 in Anchorage. When another restaurant runs their one topping medium pizza special Sitka's price drops below the Anchorage cost. A quarter pounder with cheese is \$5.29 in Sitka, \$5.39 in Juneau, and \$4.95 in Anchorage. Iceberg lettuce is

straightforward in pricing. It is \$2.99 in Sitka, \$3.04 in Juneau, and \$2.23 in Anchorage. Bread is not as simple as there are many varieties. The lowest price of bread in Sitka is \$2.25, which is included in the chart. Bread costs can be as high as \$7.99 for a loaf of bread with a median price of \$5.99. 


