The Bachelor of Theology program is for students who have completed their Associate's or Bachelor's degree, serving as a capstone or stepping-stone to the Master's level.

What You Will Learn?

A Bachelor of Theology degree equips students with advanced-level focus and specialization for Christian ministry. High level of academia will expand theological comprehension and sharpen one's biblical worldview. Each course across the spectrum will uniquely challenge engagement of their biblical framework interfacing contemporary issues of today. Students will gain greater competency and skill-set for research methods and scholarly contributions. The academic standards ensure graduates an incomparable educational experience.

What You Can Do With This Degree?

A Bachelor of Theology degree program will undoubtedly open up numerous avenues and opportunities. Graduates have gone on to serve in high capacity with church ministries, the para-church, missions, and teaching at religious-based schools. Many enter the marketplace ministry with highly successful secular careers. Mainstream opportunities, just to name a few, include writers for newsprint publications as a weekly religion columnist, researchers for scholarly periodicals, even as a self-employed Internet blogger. Others choose to enter a graduate program at Pacific Rim Christian University as well as other top-ranked seminaries and universities. In doing so, open up further avenues, possibly to return full circle, teaching in the college and university settings.

Bachelor of Arts B-Th

Students who have completed an Associate's or Bachelor's degree from an accredited institution can enroll into the two-year Bachelor of Theology degree. In order to avoid make up courses, the student's transfer credits need to include at least one course in each of the following disciplines: communications, humanities, physical sciences (math or science) and the social sciences. The goal of the Bible and theology curriculum equips the student to value the careful study of the Bible and theology for life and ministry.

Upon successful completion of the Bachelor of Theology degree, students will demonstrate the ability to integrate biblical and theological thought into their life and ministry or marketplace context.
