



## FACT SHEET

### BACKGROUND

New York Avenue NE is a major transportation route, a neighborhood and an important industrial and commercial hub in the District of Columbia. The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) is working to create a cohesive corridor streetscape and trail to serve the community and users of New York Avenue NE. This project will identify improvements that include sidewalks, streetlights, plantings, trees, benches, public art and other public space improvements.



### PROJECT AREA

The project limits extend along New York Avenue NE from the NOMA Metro Station to Bladensburg Road NE. The corridor is a major east-west route through Ivy City and connecting the Arboretum and Union Market communities in Ward 5. The study area includes a mix of residences, businesses, churches and new developments. The project area's existing conditions have few options for non-vehicular traffic and lack adequate and consistent infrastructure to accommodate foot and bicycle travel.

### PROJECT PURPOSE

Beginning in 2017, DDOT will work with community and project stakeholders to identify and evaluate improvements for the following:

- Sidewalks and public space areas along the corridor;
- Streetscape amenities;
- Pedestrian safety enhancements;
- Better multimodal connectivity; and
- A bicycle and pedestrian trail.

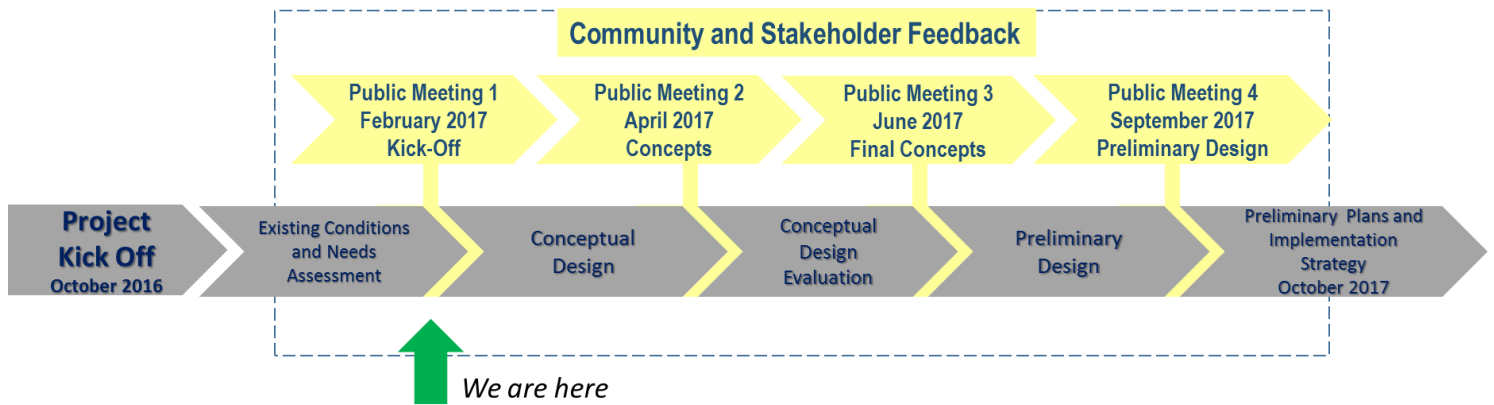
