Way #5: 1 John 4:11-12

Way #9: 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

Way #11: 2 Corinthians 9:7

Each one *must do* just as he has purposed in his heart, not grudgingly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. (NASB)

Way #4: Hebrews 12:11

All discipline for the moment seems not to be joyful, but sorrowful; yet to those who have been trained by it, afterwards it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness. (NASB)

Way #8: Colossians 3:13

...bearing with one another, and forgiving each other, whoever has a complaint against anyone; just as the Lord forgave you, so also should you. (NASB)

Way #12: Luke 16:10

Way #22: Titus 2:11-12

sensibly, righteously and godly in the present
age... (NASB)

Way #15: Ecclesiastes 4:9-10
