Dressed for a Feast

Dear friends,

This past week offered a chance to kick-off our 'first Wednesday of the month' Family Faith Formation session. It was great to see many people there, and many others will be able to engage the topic of this month - The Mass - by viewing the recorded presentation and engaging their 'home lessons' that walk through simple yet dynamic Catholic instruction. It's a tool that can truly help parents be the teachers of faith that

they desire to be - and are called to be by God.

If you're using other faith formation materials, or if you're not able to attend Mass in person, these are perfect days to ponder the powerful signs and realities the Mass reminds us of. Jesus said, "Do this in remembrance of me," and the communion of believers has passed this saving act of love down to us.

Indeed, the Mass is tremendous gift and Jesus speaks of it in the words of "wedding banquet" in the gospel this weekend. He says that many are invited and yet many let other priorities distract them from the Love God wants to communicate at Mass. What does God do in that case? He broadens the invitation even more – sending servants to find more wedding guests!

Of course, he desires that all would freely respond to Him with a visible generosity to that invitation. He uses the image of a "wedding garment" to symbolize our preparation to enter the feast. What is this garment? The great saints of the Church have said that it is ultimately acts of love, shown through the various virtues.

St. Paul talks on occasion of the types of things God wants us to be wearing. On one occasion, he wrote to the Colossians, "As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. ... Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony." On another, he talks about our clothes as a spiritual armor: "Therefore put on the whole armor of God: ... fasten the belt of truth around your waist, and put on the breastplate of righteousness. As shoes for your feet put on whatever will make you ready to proclaim the gospel of peace. With all of these, take the shield of faith, with which you will be able to quench all the flaming arrows of the evil one. Take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God."

No matter the condition of your wedding garment, the Merciful Heart of Jesus calls out to you. His Heart is the refuge from the storm, the divine peace of knowing you belong to Him, and source of every act of Love.

Let us "put on Christ" and enter His Feast!






