#### Dear Friends,

After seeking to entrap Jesus in speech last week, we again see the Pharisees question Jesus with a daunting question: "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?"

The Face of Love

Of course, we're all too familiar with the question. "An easy one!" we can think. But there were hundreds of laws that proscribed the Jewish way of life - this wasn't any easier than

last week's query, "...should we pay tax or not?"

Jesus desires to move the Pharisees - and so many of us in their category from an anxious, checkbox Christianity to a divine filiation - a familial relationship deeply rooted in our desires.

Notice Jesus doesn't just say "Love God and neighbor" as a pious platitude. No, He says love God with all your heart, all your soul, all your mind. Everything. Holding nothing back. Wow.

Jesus points to examples in the scriptures of the poor widow who gives her last coin, of the woman who breaks the entire vase of perfumed oil and anoints His feet, and the healed leper who came back to give thanks. Have you experienced the lavishness of a God, a Creator, a Father Who loves you this deeply? Who has communicated that love to you?

For our "all" can only be in response to the "all" that God gives us. Each morning His graces are new because He knows well our challenges. Son though He was, Jesus learned obedience by what He suffered. He knows our struggle to love, let alone to love with everything we have. It's more than we can do alone, and so this command is by design: Don't dare try to love this way on your own. Ask me. Trust me. Stay with me.

Jesus says, "You have faith in God, have faith also in Me." Take time to look at a favorite image of Christ this week. Let Him be seared in your memory. Then look for that image in everyone you meet - walking tabernacles longing to be loved.
