#### **News from The Core**

#### **English** writes:

This half term The English Department are looking forward to working closely with The Drama Department to teach poetry to Years 7 and 8. This collaborative approach was really successful with Shakespeare earlier this year and we hope that it will allow pupils to develop their interpretations of some challenging texts.

In Year 10 we are asking pupils to do a presentation on their work experience. This is so we can award them a spoken language grade for their GCSE. This does not contribute to their final grade but it is still an important skill that pupils will need in the future. Although the pupils often find this task challenging, they have been embracing it and working hard to gain high grades.

We are taking the Year 12 and 13 English Literature students to see Othello at The Globe Theatre in March and really looking forward to a performance that promises to be exciting and engaging.

#### Maths writes:

We recently entered our strongest mathematicians from KS4 (excluding year 10 who were on work experience) into the UK Intermediate Maths Challenge and are pleased to announce we had some excellent results. The students received 5 gold, 9 silver and 20 bronze certificates in total. The five students who received a gold certificate, therefore also qualifying them for the Intermediate Mathematical Olympiad, were Peter Roder, David Roder, Andrew Hutchinson, Jenson Taylor and Jasmine Myhill. #### **News from The Core**

#### Science writes:

As Year 11 approach the end of their school days many parents are checking how they can help with the preparation for those dreaded examinations. They will be the last cohort to gain grades from A\*- G in Science and so we want to go out on a high. As a reminder any resources you find must be aligned with the OCR Twenty First Century Suite (2012) and as the course nears its end the revision books are beginning to come down in price so if you are inclined to buy books you may find a bargain.

For Year 10 and below we are well on the way to preparing Radcliffe students for the first results using the 9-1 grading system which will be first issued in Science from August 2018. For any parent who would like to purchase resources to support Year 10 and below then we are staying with OCR but you need to ensure that you find books aligned with OCR Gateway (9-1).

This change in examination assessment has made life a little complicated especially if you have more than one child in school so if you need clarification on any aspect of this please feel free to ask your child's class teacher in the first instance. We understand it!

In the last newsletter the Science team launched the concept of a Gardening Club which would use the fantastic enclosed space and greenhouse within the science teaching area. At the time of writing the Radcliffe wild mallard ducks have returned to the pond in the courtyard so we will need to be wary of disturbing their nest and the likely arrival of the dozen or so ducklings. If you have any gardening equipment you don't need then we would love to put it to use so when you come to dust off items in the shed ready for the growing season ahead please think of us.

how planes fly using aerodynamics.







#### 'The Rhythms of Success'

Toby Dytrych represented The Radcliffe School at the end of last term at The Milton Keynes Young Musician Award showing off his years of hard work learning all things percussion. Toby opened his performance on drum kit playing a technical grade 8 piece by Ralph Salmins and then moved onto his second piece played on a Marimba by Ivan Trevino. Toby was particularly impressive using four beaters with two hands and showed his multi-talents across different percussive instruments.



Though Toby was not chosen for the overall award, one of the judges commented that 'Toby is one of the most impressive percussionists ever to perform at a Milton Keynes Young Musician Award'. Toby has come so far in the last 4 four years, growing quickly from a beginner to grade 8 and becoming a solid rhythm section percussionist at various brass bands such as The New Bradwell Brass Band. Toby is a huge credit to The Radcliffe School and is hoping to complete A-Level Music here and continue to audition for national youth orchestras.
