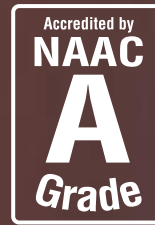

SSL is the oldest Private law college in Chennai and the only law college from Tamil Nadu to be featured among the “Best 40 Law Colleges in India” Published by the India Today, MDRA survey, 2019.

SSL functions in a fully air- conditioned unitary building that span over 60,000 square feet. The entire campus is CCTV monitored and WiFi enabled.

SSL has hybrid learning spaces called cliff Rooms which combine classrooms with an exclusive inbuilt staff centre. The cliff rooms are spacious and modelled to accommodate not more than 30 students at a time.

SSL Provides its undergraduates the Opportunity to graduate with a specialisation or double specialisation by choosing and studying from the offered 150+ elective subjects through its Choice Base Credits System (CBCS).

SSL has a team of qualified and experienced faculty and Provides an unparalleled 1:12 student teacher ratio as 75 full- time faculty members and 100 plus national and international visiting faculties from various reputed institutions across the globe are part of the team.

SSL enters into MOUs with leading international Universities and provides Student Exchange Programs through the Special Credit Transfer System . Queen Mary University London, AIMST, Malaysia, Nottingham Trent University, UK are some of the universities, where our students have undertaken courses through this programme.



SSL has a state of the art library, which has over 10,000 books and journals. The library also subscribes to research databases and provides resources in both analogue and digital form for its students. Digital access is provided through a fully functional computer centre within the library

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About the City - Chennai

Chennai, the fourth largest city in India, is an hub for educational institutions. The city has a vibrant culture that is rich, diverse and modern in outlook yet deeply rooted in Tamil tradition and values. The infrastructure and amenities in this state capital, including its public libraries, public transportation, housing and medical care are modernised and largely adequate for the steady influx of people from other parts of the country. The city and its people are warm in their reception of visitors and migrants both for education and work. Also, the city has been consistently ranked among the top safest cities in India and hence can be an excellent place for students who come within its fold to stay, grow and excel.



2.1 Why SSL

Saveetha School of Law is the oldest private law institution in Tamil Nadu, which has been imparting world class legal education to its students for over a decade. It's alumni include noted practitioners, corporate advisors and eminent judges. The law school has facilities on par with international standards and is nestled in a sprawling green campus, which provides an excellent ambience for learning. The teaching pedagogy coupled with an eminent set of faculty addresses the individual needs of students and hones their knowledge and skill set preparing them holistically to succeed as lawyers.

The collaborations with institutions of eminence from abroad, the importance given for research, publications, internships, moots and field study and most significantly the choice based credit system which provides the students the opportunity to specialise during their undergraduate study sets SSL apart and its graduates in a better footing than their peers from other law schools. 2.2 The Campus

The Saveetha Institute for Management and Technical Studies spans 180+ acres with 40 lakh square feet built area housing 13 institutions, 5000 staff and over 10,000 students. Saveetha School of law, a part of SIMATS, is nestled in a green campus with state of the art facilities for its students. The campus is entirely air conditioned and the spacious classrooms are custom made to accommodate not more than 30 students at a time. The campus also houses the law library, which provides the latest learning materials in both digital and analogue form. Also, the moot court hall, the spacious seminar hall and the convention centre are amenities that are available for students to bring out their best talent during their stay at the law school. Moreover, separate boys and girls hostels are present within the campus with easy access to medical care as a hospital is adjacent to the law campus. Also, a wide array of restaurants that serve different cuisines at subsidised rates are available for students within the campus.



2.3 The Faculty

Faculty are the backbone of SSL and the college has a team of qualified and experienced faculty who lead from the front and shape students into young budding lawyers. Personalised attention is a hallmark of quality education. SSL has a team of 75 full-time faculty members and 100 plus visiting national and international faculties from various reputed institutions across the globe. Our extraordinary faculty team includes senior Registrars of High Court, former Professors and faculties from institutions of eminence like JNU, New Delhi, CUSAT, Cochin, TISS, Mumbai, Queen Mary University, England, Auckland University of Technology, New Zealand etc to name a few. The faculty strength ensures that the institution provides an unparalleled teacher student ratio of 1:12. 2.4 The Academic Environment

Conferences, Seminars, Workshops and Special Lectures



Workshops, conferences, seminars, involving both international and national speakers is a regular part of the vibrant research atmosphere at SSL. Our faculty and students are constantly exposed to cutting edge research and deliberate on key areas of emerging law through these activities. The pandemic induced lockdown has prompted Saveetha School of Law to conduct international and national webinars on contemporary legal issues

using online platforms such as Zoom and Google Meet. The law Departments at SSL, including students under the guidance of faculties have organised webinars covering diverse legal issues, where national and international speakers shared their expertise in law. In total, around 400 webinars were conducted to ensure that student interest was sustained and knowledge was constantly shared using the aid of technology during the unprecedented lockdown. Saveetha School of law conducts over 400 special lectures every year and our faculty along with students take incredible efforts to bring in experts from various fields to create a nurturing learning environment that is inspiring and interesting for our graduates. As a part of each course, special lectures are conducted to give a glimpse on the practical aspects of the subject. Guests may vary from professors of other institutions to eminent officers of the law, retired judges and many more professionals, who are creating a strong impact in our society.

3. Student Activities

3.1 Clubs

SSL students organize and participate in co-curricular, extra-curricular activities through different student clubs, including Idea Club, Start-Up Club, Creativity Club, Innovation Club and IP club. Apart from the core law curriculum, the clubs related activities help the holistic development of the students as they have adequate scope to explore their creative skills and exhibit their inborn talents.



3.2 Moot Court Society

Moot Court Society is the spinal cord of clinical education in law as it provides practical learning and on the job training. The Moot Court Society at SSL conducts preliminary selections and the winning team will be directed to participate in National and International Level Moot Court Competitions organized by various Law Schools and Universities. The Moot Court Society at SSL conducts around 16 moots every year, where our students will have the opportunity to participate within the class against each other. The best teams of the college also participate in Mega Moots where designated faculties will train teams for the competition. The grand Multi Moot competitions will be held every quarter. Winners of this competition will be given special training by professional 'mooters' to participate in local and national competitions. SSL also conducts Jus Amicus - The National Moot Court Competition, JusLex - The National Trial Advocacy Competition, Jus Consilium - The National Client Counselling Competition and JusLex - The National Judgement Writing Competition for law students from across the country.



3.3 Skill Development Programmes

SSL conducts various skill development programmes including Client Counselling, Court Visits, Seminars and Conferences in Emerging Areas, Prison Visits, Extension Activities, Free Legal Aid Camps, Research Field Visits, Educational Tour, Visit to Consumer Forums, Visit to Arbitration Centres, National Green Tribunal and Parliamentary Visit, Classes for Competitive Examinations, Career Counselling, Personality Development Programmes, Workshops on Legal Drafting, Workshops on Judgement Writing, STAR Summit, Bill Drafting and Poster Presentations.



3.4 Clinical Legal Education



Clinical Legal Education (CLE) at SSL empowers our students to engage in a variety of community outreach programs including legal awareness camps at rural areas, visit to juvenile detention centers, community centers and other institutions. The students conduct sessions that are designed to enlighten the marginalised groups to understand and access their legal rights and services. Areas of teaching often include: awareness about the procedures under criminal law, family law, consumer protection law, land law,

healthcare rights, prisoners' rights, juvenile justice, rights of tribals and wildlife protection among others. The CLE programmes at SSL are aimed at developing empathy among students towards the marginalized sections of the society.

3.5 Entrepreneurship Cell

Entrepreneurship Cell at SSL aims to provide opportunities for students to engage in entrepreneurship and related activities. Through our conference, social events, lectures, speaker engagements and workshops, we are hoping to help students interact with entrepreneurs and find means to operate resources effectively and engage or work on creation of start-ups.



3.6 Culturals



'Triveetha' the annual intra college cultural fest of Saveetha School of Law, provides a unique platform for our students to showcase their vibrant talents. The students are divided into four houses called *the Trishulas*, *the Chakras*, *the Astras* and *the Vajras*, all led by their respective Captains, Assistant Captains and Faculty-in-charge. The gala event that spans to two to three days showcases healthy competition in diverse events, including patti mandram, light music, channel surfing, theme dances and movie spoof with enthusiastic participation from our students. The event which is end to end organised by the students of SSL with the support of management displays great camaraderie and competitive spirit. The event culminates in the grand valedictory function where students who were divided by teams again unite as one single SSL family.

3.7 Sports

Education at SSL is not confined to the academic courses a student selects. SSL endeavours to aid in the overall development and achievements of each of our students. This includes physical fitness, mental ability, team spirit and the discipline and drive required to work towards a goal, and not to mention the ability to loosen up and have some fun. SSL's extensive sports facilities cater to these needs and the college encourages the students to pursue excellence in their chosen sports, providing them with the infrastructure facilities, ambient environment and adequate guidance. Since 2001, the Department of Physical Education has encouraged the students to participate in various sports and games at International / National / State / University & District levels. Our students won prizes at National and State Level Competitions and most recently they won Anna University Zonal & Inter Zonal Level Competitions. Many of our alumni have secured admissions for post graduate courses and employment through form 3 sports quota.



4. Infrastructure and Campus Facilities



Keeping in mind that the campus will be the centre of the lives of thousands of students who enter its portals - their home away from home – SSL provides top quality infrastructure at its campus, including a fully air-conditioned unitary building that spans over 60,000 square feet. The building is uniquely designed with two triangular gardens that are lush with various palms that tower over 30 feet. The majestic entrance is graced with a 30 feet high red staircase that is reminiscent of most court halls. The classrooms, moot court hall, seminar hall and library are well furnished, spacious and comfortable for students and faculty.

4.1 'Claff Rooms'

SSL has hybrid learning spaces called '**Claff Rooms**'. This is the combination of the class room with an exclusive inbuilt staff centre. Each claff has 2 faculty zones with a reading zone and a lecturing zone. By virtue of the CBCS system, faculty owns the claff room and students of various enrolment groups visit the claff rooms from time to time. All claff rooms are air-conditioned with smart audio visual facilities. They are furnished with comfortable glass desks and faculty zones are furnished in sophisticated beach wood. Some claffs have creative utilisation of the space for maximum efficiency.



4.2 Library

SSL has a state of the art library situated in an area of 1236 square meters that caters to the academic and research oriented needs of over 890 students and 60 faculty. The library contains over 5812 volumes with 3436 titles of text and reference books and more than 750 journal volumes. The library subscribes to 23 periodicals in print form. The library also has provision for online research and provides IP access to research databases. It also provides access to Law Finder Library Edition Software, which has about 12,00,000 judgements 14,000 Central and State Bare Acts, complete Supreme Court cases from 1950 with head notes, High Court Cases, Privy Council decisions from 1836 and more than 250 law journals and 380 research databases. The e-library is also equipped with wi-fi access, where students and faculty could access the e-resources through the computers available at the library or using their own devices.



4. Infrastructure and Campus Facilities

4.3 Moot Court & Seminar Halls

SSL has an air-conditioned moot court hall that spans over 1200 square feet and has seating arrangements for onlookers apart from the participating teams. The judges' desk and witness podiums are furnished in teak like traditional court halls. The audio-visual facilities and the presentation equipment make the moot session court-hall realistic, lively and enjoyable. SSL also has an air conditioned seminar hall with the trademark butterfly table design that spans over 1200 square feet and can house over 120 students. These work spaces with rolling chairs draped in elegant colours offer a flexible environment that make group learning and discussion comfortable and enjoyable. The students can move with ease during the session creating a very free and friendly environment within the seminar hall.

4.4 Food Court

SSL has a food court that functions via SSL's special ala-carte smart mess cards that offer a variety of food for our students. The food court can accommodate our entire students at any given point of time. The students can utilise the smart mess card system to manage all cashless transactions that make it both safe and well documented for both the vendors and the students.



4.5 Sports and Well-being

SSL sprawling campus comprises a playground where students and faculty beat the blues out of the rigours of academic life by enjoying a game of cricket, football or tennis as the sports grounds are designed to accommodate a variety of sporting events. SSL also has a dedicated Yoga room and a gym / fitness centre with both cardio fitness and weight lifting exercise equipment, where students can indulge in physical activity and ensure overall mental and physical well-being.



4.6 Banking and Medical Access

A branch of IndusInd Bank with round the clock ATM facilities is situated within the campus to cater to the needs of the staff and students of SSL. SSL is located adjacent to Saveetha Dental and Medical College and the students at SSL have easy access to 24 hours medical care.

4.7 Green Campus

The entire SSL campus is a plastic free green zone. It is located in a sea of green where the trees provide adequate cooling even in the hottest summer months. The Environmental Law club at SSL also engage in sustainable activities including green drives such as Miyawaki plantation drive to ensure sustainable development.

5. Residential Accommodation

SSL provides hostel facilities within campus separately for boys and girls. The hostel facilities range from a single super deluxe room that are fully furnished rooms with an exclusive washing machine, air-conditioning, fridge and bathtub to modest well-furnished dormitories that can house upto to 8 students. All hostel facilities are common for law, management and dental students, which fosters great opportunities for interdisciplinary collaborations.



Both the boys and the girls hostels are WiFi enabled buildings with airy generous interiors and have round the clock electricity and water facilities. The hostels are fully secure and faculties are posted in-charge of each of



the hostel as the hostel wardens. The hostels have super deluxe single rooms, ultra super deluxe double rooms, super deluxe quadruple and octuplet sharing rooms in each floor, with attached bathrooms and power supply. The badminton courts and the TV room at hostel provide ample recreation for hostellers. The mess is yet another vast portion of the hostel layout, which serves hygienic south Indian and Chinese cuisine in a buffet system.

6. Assessment and Accreditation



SSL is a National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) 'A' grade accredited institution. It is recognised by the Bar Council of India, New Delhi, to award LLB, LLM and Ph.D. degrees. SSL's parent university SIMATS is ranked 42nd by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. SIMATS is also a Recognized (SES REC) Institution by the Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education, Department of Higher Education, a caveated recognition provided by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. SIMATS also received QS E Lead Certification for conduct of online classes during the covid pandemic induced lock down and is the only institute to receive the perfect 150/150 score in E-Lead category. SIMATS is additionally ranked among the top 10 Indian universities in the Greenmetric World University rankings. Notably, we are the number 1 university from India to publish 300 research papers related to sustainability.

7. Admissions

7.1 Undergraduate Courses

SSL offers 5 year integrated courses in BA LLB (Hons), BBA LLB(Hons), BSC LLB(Hons) and BCom LLB (Hons). The undergraduate course is offered in the unique CBCS pattern which allows the students to earn upto 32 credits every semester by opting for subjects offered by a faculty of their choice. The flexible curriculum coupled with amazing opportunities to do transferable credit courses in many of our partner institutions, such as Queen Mary University of London, AIMST, Malaysia, Nottingham Trent University, UK and University of Dundee, UK provide the students the chance to complete their coursework within 40 months and devote ample time for internships, which would make them work-ready by the time they graduate from SSL.

Eligibility Criteria

- The candidate shall not have completed the age of 20 years as on 1st July, 2021. The maximum age limit for admission is relaxed to 22 years for the candidates belonging to OBC, SC, ST.
- The candidate should have passed higher secondary examination (10+2) or an equivalent examination and secured above 60% of marks in such qualifying examinations.
- Candidate selection is based on marks secured in the entrance test, interview and group discussion conducted by SSL.
- Candidates should be medically fit to undergo the course of study.



Admission Procedures



The admission for undergraduate degree courses are based on the marks obtained by the candidate in the qualifying examination and on the basis of the performance of the candidate in the Saveetha Entrance Examination, interview and group discussion, which shall all be conducted by SSL. Students with CLAT and LSAT scores will also be considered for admissions.

Course Structure - BA LLB



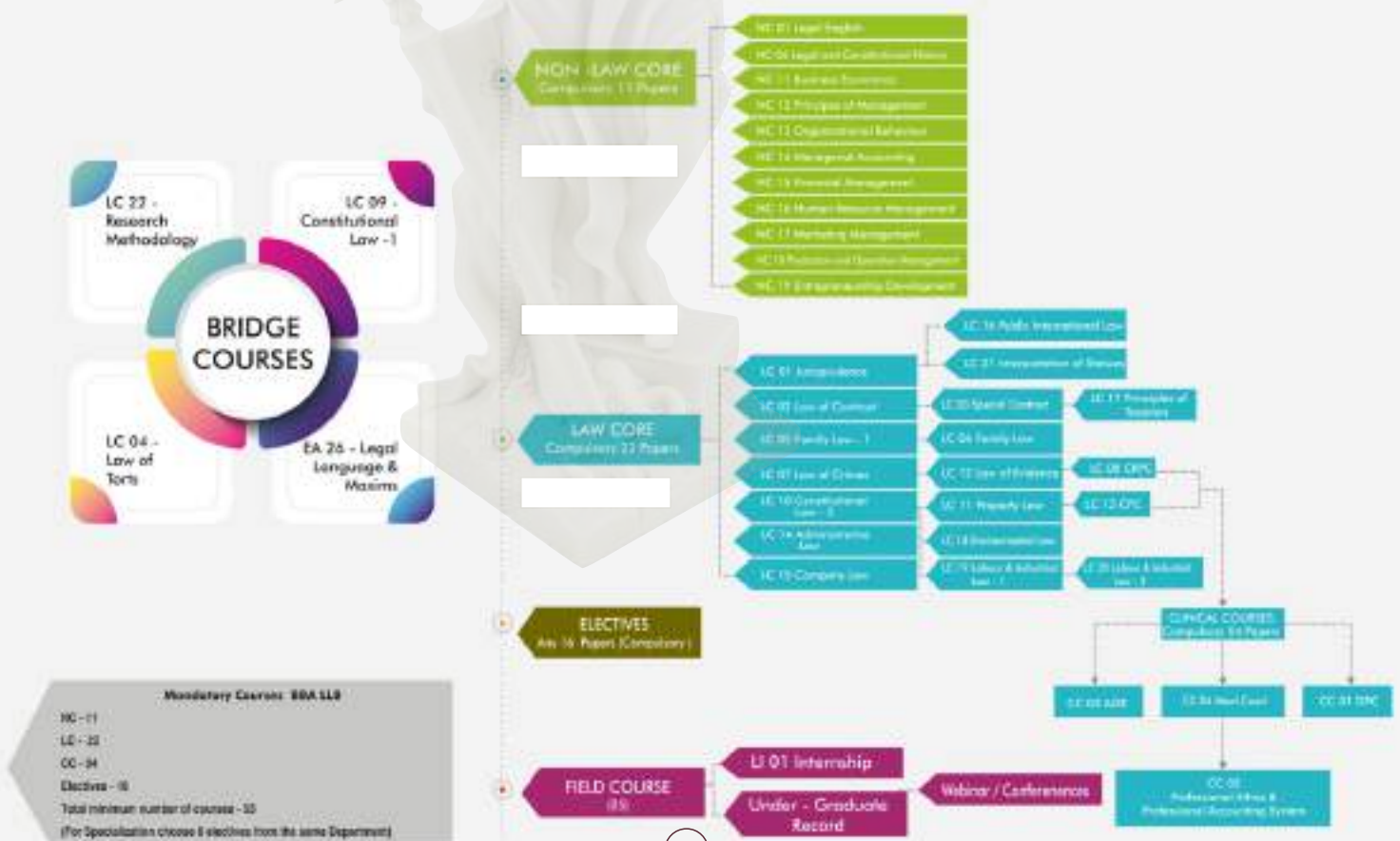

Students who complete a minimum of 8 electives under any Department shall be awarded with mini specialisations, which can also extend to dual specialisations, provided they complete a minimum of 8 electives each under 2 different Departments.

Additionally, the student has to complete a minimum of 5 internships / field courses. Students who complete a minimum of 8 electives under any Department shall be awarded with mini specialisations, which can also extend to dual specialisations, provided they complete a minimum of 8 electives each under 2 different Departments.

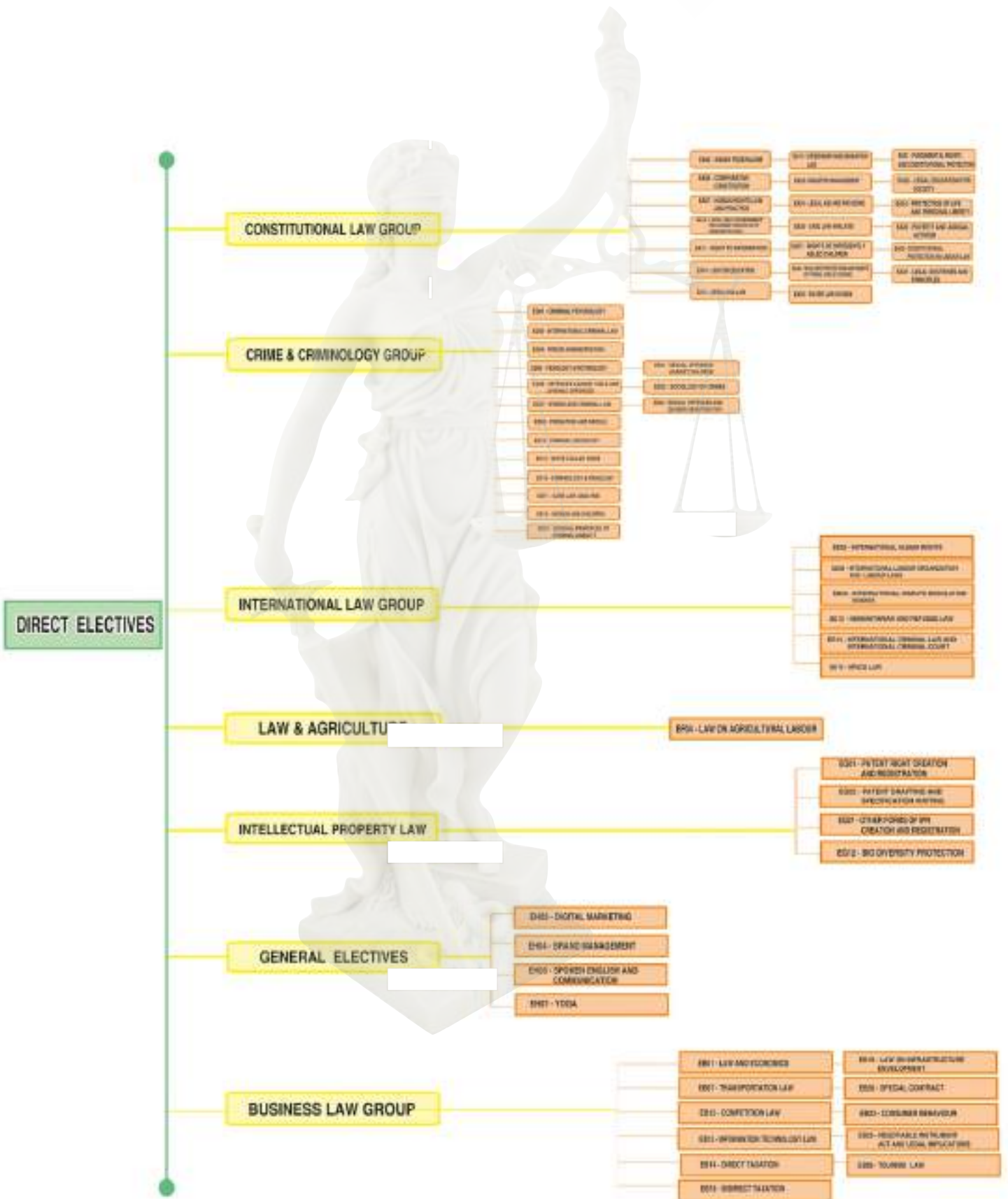

Students who complete a minimum of 8 electives under any Department shall be awarded with mini specialisations, which can also extend to dual specialisations, provided they complete a minimum of 8 electives each under 2 different Departments.



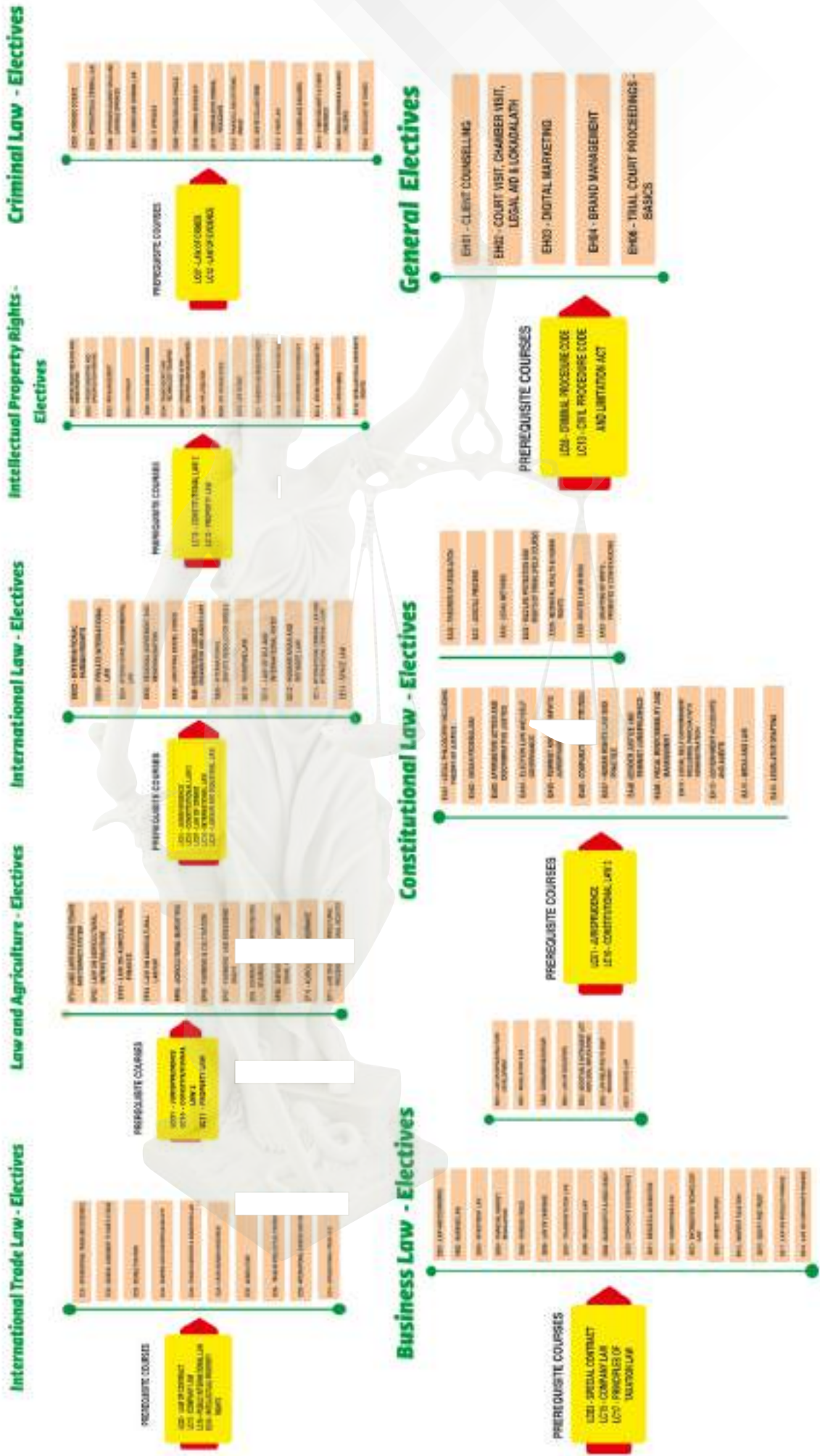
Course Structure - BSc LLB

7.2 Post Graduate Courses

SSL offers a full time, 1 year LLM programme that follows a trimester pattern with special focus on research and academic training. SSL's unique curriculum and teaching methods provide the post graduate students with excellent training both in teaching pedagogy and research in order to ensure that they excel in their chosen field of study upon graduation. SSL currently offers 6 specialised LLM courses, which include Business Law; Criminal law, Intellectual Property Rights Law; Constitutional law; International Law; and Labour law.



Eligibility Criteria



- A candidate should have completed any five year integrated LLB programme after 10+2 or the 3 year LLB subsequent to a Bachelor's degree with a minimum average of 50% or above.
- The candidates for admission to LL.M course for the academic year 2021- 22 should have completed their LLB course on or before June 2021.
- Candidate selection is based on marks secured in the interview and group discussion conducted by SSL.
- Candidates should be medically fit to undergo the course of study.

Course Description

LLM offered at SSL is a one year course approved by the Bar Council of India. The minimum mandatory number of subjects to be completed towards the fulfillment of requirements for the award of the degree of LLM shall comprise: 04 general papers common for all specialisations, compulsory papers in their chosen LLM stream and compulsory SPSS training. Additionally, students are required to complete a total of 09 research papers within the trimester.

7.3 Doctoral Studies

7.3.1 LLM., Ph.D (Integrated) Studies

SSL offers a full time 4 year LL.M plus Ph.D integrated course in Law. The programme comprises 1 year of full time LL.M and 3 year of full time Ph.D. The Ph.D research area should be identified at the time of LL.M admission itself and based on the selected subject area the students can choose their LL.M specialisation. The programme comprises coursework, the research field work etc. which needs to be undertaken after the completion of LL.M under any of our collaborative centres. Final synopsis and thesis submissions are to be completed as per the guidelines of the UGC.

7.3.2 Ph.D in Law & Interdisciplinary Studies

SSL offers both full time 3 year Ph.D. and 4 year part time Ph.D. programmes. The programme comprises coursework, which can be completed in the first semester, and the research field work, which can be completed under any of our collaborative centres. Final synopsis and thesis submissions are to be completed as per the guidelines of the UGC. Applicants shall be admitted to the Ph.D. Program under one of the following categories:



- (i) Full-time Ph.D. students with or without fellowship.
- (ii) Ph.D. students who are faculty members/ staff of the University.
- (iii) Ph.D. students under the external registration program recognized by the University and sponsored by and employed in the organization/ industry/ university/ other institutions, who will normally carry out their research in the organization/ industry/ university/ other institutions of their employment.
- (iv) Ph.D. students from partner universities/ institutions with which SSL has MOUs or collaborative arrangements.
- (v) Ph.D. students pursuing part-time Ph.D.

Eligibility Criteria

I. For Ph.D. In Law

- The candidate shall have a Master's Degree in Law from a recognized university with at least 55% marks in aggregate or an equivalent degree from a foreign educational institution.
- A relaxation of 5% of marks, from 55% to 50%, or an equivalent relaxation of grade, may be allowed for those belonging to SC/ST/OBC(non-creamy layer)/differently - abled and other categories of candidates.



II. For Ph.D. In Interdisciplinary Studies With Law

A. Ph.D Management:

- a. Master's Degree or any other degree recognized / equivalent thereto in Business Administration or Economics or Commerce or in allied subjects with at least 55% marks OR
- b. Post Graduate Diploma in Management recognized as equivalent to MBA by AICTE with at least 55% marks or equivalent grade. Applicants with more than 3 years industry/ teaching/ practicing/ managerial/ professional experience will be given preference. Professional qualification such as CA/ ICWA/ CFA/ CS (both 5 years integrated or 3 years after graduation) with at least 55% marks.
- c. Applicants with more than 3 years industry/ teaching/ practising/managerial/ professional experience will be given preference. Master's Degree in Engineering/ Technology with at least 55% marks in aggregate and 3 years industry/ teaching/ practising/ managerial/ professional experience will be given preference.



B. Ph.D. In

**Behavioural Sciences / Social Sciences/
Liberal Arts & Humanities / International
Affairs / Government And Public Policy**

- B. Master's Degree in a discipline relevant to the proposed research with at least 55%marks or equivalent grade. Applicants with more than 3 years industry/ teaching/ practising/ managerial/ professional experience will be given preference.

C. Ph.D. In Social Sciences

Master's degree in Social Sciences, Law, Commerce, Business Management, Science or an equivalent degree with at least 55% marks may be admitted to the program, if the research they wish to pursue has an interface with law, business management, public policy, international affairs, behavioural sciences, higher education, liberal arts. Applications for research in interdisciplinary areas shall be considered on the basis of proven ability and aptitude of the candidate for such kind of research.



Selection Procedure

- A relaxation of 5% of marks, from 55% to 50%, or an equivalent relaxation of grade across all the Schools / Institutes, may be allowed for those belonging to SC / ST / OBC (non-creamy layer) / Differently - Abled and other categories of candidates as per the decision of the UGC from time to time, or for those who had obtained their Master's degree prior to 19th September, 1991.
- Candidates seeking admission to part time Ph. D programme shall have at least one year teaching / industry experience.
- Indian origin candidates working abroad are allowed to register for Ph.D provided they have research experience for a minimum period of 9 months.
- The candidate shall appear for an Entrance Test and secure 55% or above to qualify. The syllabus of the entrance test shall be subject specific.
- Candidates who qualify UGC-NET /UGC – CSIR NET (including JRF)/SLET/GATE/ teacher fellowship holders are waived from appearing for the Ph.D. entrance test.
- Candidates are required to appear for an interview/viva-voce to be organized by the Head of Institution, where the candidates are required to discuss their proposed research topic through a presentation before a duly constituted Institutional Research Committee.

Course Description



The course work shall be a prerequisite to Ph.D. programme. A minimum of 4 credits shall be assigned to one or more courses on research methodology which could cover areas such as Quantitative Methods, Computer Application, Research Ethics and review of the published research in the relevant field, training, field work and other advanced courses relevant to the topic or area of research. All courses prescribed for Ph.D. course work shall be recommended by Thesis Advisory Committee (TAC) in conformity with the credit hour instructional requirement and shall specify content, instructional and assessment methods. They shall be duly approved by the Academic Council. All candidates admitted to the Ph.D. programmes shall be required to complete the course work prescribed by the Department during the initial one or two semesters. After completing the course work the candidates are eligible to appear for research proposal review, where they shall present the proposed research topic including the problem justification, aims and objectives, overall research methodology and the potential outcome of the study.

Prior to the submission of the synopsis of the thesis, a comprehensive internal assessment of the research work should be made by the TAC members through a pre-synopsis seminar. The candidates are required to submit the Synopsis to the University 3 months prior to the submission of Final Thesis. The final thesis shall be examined by a panel of examiner referred by the TAC, who will value it on its merit and shall recommend the thesis for conferring the Ph.D. Following this the candidate has to successfully defend his/ her thesis in a public viva-voce.

Course Structure

- Qualified candidates registered for full-time Ph.D. programmes shall work continuously in their respective Department under a recognized Supervisor for a minimum period of three (3) years and up to a maximum of six (6) years.
- In case of non-submission of thesis, under extraordinary circumstances in the above stipulated period including the period of extension, one more extension of six months period will be considered as a special case with the approval of Academic Council /Board of Management.
- In cases where scholars are unable to submit Thesis under extraordinary circumstances within the stipulated time as mentioned above, they are permitted for further extension by the Vice-Chancellor. However, they can also re-register for the programme.
- Qualified candidates who have registered for the Ph.D. programme as part time scholars shall work for a minimum period of four years and up to a maximum of six years.
- In case the part time scholars, who are unable to submit Thesis within six years, he/she can obtain extension for six months well in advance (i.e 6 months prior to completion of 6 years) for submission of Thesis.
- The candidates are required to submit the Synopsis to the University 3 months prior to the submission of Final Thesis.
- University may permit conversion from full time research into part time research and vice versa in respect of candidates registered for valid reasons and subject to satisfying the regulations rules and conditions in force.



7.3.3 LL.D in Law Eligibility Criteria

Any candidate who satisfies the following conditions is eligible to seek registration for LL.D. in the University upon application for registration made pursuant to periodic advertisement issued by the PG Council. The maximum seats available during a particular year will be determined by the P.G. Council.

- a. The candidate shall have Ph.D. Degree in Law of any recognized University.
- b. The candidate must have published as the main author a minimum of Seven articles in the peer reviewed/refereed journals having ISSN number or books of repute with ISBN number after the completion of Ph.D.
- c. Teaching Experience of Minimum of 10 years



Registration

- a. Application for Registration with prescribed fees shall be submitted to the University along with 10 hard copies and one soft copy of the synopsis.
- b. The LL.D. Registration is valid for FIVE years only from the date of Registration.

Selection Procedure

- a. Application along with a research proposal of about 10 pages needs to be submitted within the stipulated time.
- b. The research proposal should contain:
 - i. Title
 - ii. Statement of the problem and the background information on the subject
 - iii) A set of research questions along with Hypothesis & Methodology.
 - iii. A Research Design



C. The eligible shortlisted candidates shall be required to make an oral presentation before a panel of experts constituted for this purpose on the dates specified by the University.

D. A candidate will be entitled to be admitted, only if his/her candidature is approved by the panel of experts.

E. In deserving cases, the expert panel may recommend the second opportunity to make the oral presentation within a period of 20 days.

F. If the expert panel finds the candidate unsuitable even after the second presentation, the

said candidate will be considered as having failed in the selection process and the candidate may be informed accordingly.

G. There will be two progress reports before a draft thesis is submitted. If a particular progress report is not satisfactory the candidate may be asked to re-submit the same. All such presentations shall be ordinarily made before a committee consisting of the Supervisor and two experts identified by the P.G. Council. All progress reports shall be submitted to the examination department, which will transmit the report to the supervisor and fix a date for oral presentation.

Course Structure

A. On completion of six months after the first presentation, the candidate is required to submit a report of the research work to the examination department. This second progress report would explain and analyse the progress made by the scholar. The same will be sent to the supervisor and the scholar will interact with the supervisor to review progress and receive suggestions.

B. The second oral presentation shall be within one month from the date on which the second written submission is made to the examination department. The suggestions/ comments made by the experts will be furnished to the scholar by the supervisor.

C. The final draft shall be submitted to the examination department within three months from the date of completion of three years. In case of necessity, based upon the valid ground, the extension of not exceeding three years may be granted. The total period shall not exceed five years.

D. The scholar shall submit a soft copy as well as four hard copies to the Examination Department. The Examination department will subject the full text to a plagiarism test and send the report to the Supervisor and the scholar concerned about the same.



E. If the plagiarism test reveals a level of plagiarism higher than 20%, the Supervisor may reject the draft thesis and make a report of the same to the P.G. Council and recommend cancellation of registration. The P.G. Council will take an appropriate decision after due hearing. A scholar so disqualified shall never be readmitted to the LL.D. programme of the SSL

F. If the minimum standards are not complied with, the supervisor may give another three months for adequate compliance of all requirements, unless the candidate is already disqualified for plagiarism as above.

G. Once the final draft is approved for due processing and endorsed by the supervisor the final presentation shall take place within two months from the date on which the said five copies are submitted to the examination department. There shall be at least three external experts on the panel to evaluate the final presentation of the draft thesis. The experts will be furnished with a copy of the draft thesis at least fifteen days before the date of final presentation.

H. After incorporating the recommendations made by the external experts, the final thesis may be submitted with due certification by the Supervisor within a period of three months from the date of completion of three years in the format prescribed by the University along with the payment of prescribed fee applicable at the time of submission, failing which they may have to take fresh admission.



I. The LL.D. Scholars must publish at least one research paper in refereed journal and make two paper presentations in Conferences / Seminars before the submission of the thesis and produce evidence for the same in the form of presentation certificates and / or reprints.

J. The candidate is eligible to submit his / her Thesis only after completing 3 years of Research Work from the date of his / her registration

K. The candidate shall submit to the University 10 copies of the Synopsis of his / her LL.D. Thesis highlighting contents of the Thesis and enclose evidences of three research publications in the area of research authored solely by him / her in Journals/books of repute in the form of acceptance letters or published papers.

L. The Chairperson of the PG Council shall organize the Pre-Submission Colloquium meeting before the faculty members in the University at the earliest. The PG Council shall advise and offer suggestions to the candidate for the finalization of the Thesis.



- M. If the PG Council is not satisfied with the Pre- thesis Submission Colloquium of a candidate, it may ask the candidate to appear for the Colloquium again after a gap of one month.
- N. After the successful completion of pre-submission colloquium, the candidate shall submit a soft copy of the final thesis.
- O. The candidate shall prepare a Thesis embodying results of original research and submit 8 copies of his / her LL.D. Thesis along with 10 copies of abstract of not more than thousand words and the electronic version of the Thesis in .pdf format (3 discs) for evaluation
- P. If any candidate fails to submit his / her LL.D. Thesis within five years, he / she may apply to University for extension of his / her Registration for a maximum of two more years with the recommendation of the Doctoral Committee (LL.D.) by remitting a penalty of Rs. 25,000/- in addition to the annual fee.
- Q. If a candidate fails to submit Thesis even after seven years, his / her LL.D. Registration shall stand annulled.
- R. The thesis submitted by the candidate will be sent to three external examiners selected by the Vice-Chancellor, from out of the approved list of external examiners submitted by the P.G. Council. Of the three external examiners, one shall be a foreign examiner.
- S. For award of LL.D. degree there shall be unanimous recommendation by all the three external examiners that the thesis be accepted for the award of LL. D. degree.
- T. If any one or more of the Examiners recommend/s revision and revaluation of the Thesis, then the candidate shall revise the Thesis based on the suggestions made by the Examiner(s) and submit the Revised Thesis with payment of the prescribed fees to the University. The University shall send the Revised Thesis at the earliest to the same Examiner(s).





U. If any Examiner recommends the award of degree after incorporating the suggested revisions / corrections, such modifications shall be complied with by the candidate. The Revised Thesis shall be submitted to the University along with the prescribed fees.

V. After receipt of three positive reports from the examiners, open Viva-Voce examination shall be conducted by the University in the presence of one of the external examiners, the members of the PG Council, members of the concerned Faculty, research scholars and students by giving wide publicity.

W. The LL.D. degree would be awarded if three examiners give positive reports and the candidate successfully completes viva voce examination.
