Holy Hikes - November 11, 9:00 am



Join us on November 11 as we hike to the Iroquois Park, North Overlook in Louisville. Iroquois Park was planned by Frederick Law Olmsted as a "scenic reservation" of forested hillsides and breathtaking vistas. The park features the WPA-era Iroquois Amphitheater, an open-air theater that accommodates 2,366 people. To get there, Take I-264 E toward Shively, to Taylor Blvd South (Exit 9). Turn right onto Taylor Blvd, and go until you come to a large 5-point intersection (Taylor Blvd, Southern Parkway and New Cut Road). Turn right at that light, into Iroquois Park. Take first right onto the road that flanks the Golf Course; then first left at open-gated road that leads to the top of the park. Parking is available at the top.

Dining Out for Life - Wednesday, November 15



Dining Out for Life supports the work of House of Ruth and AIDS Interfaith Ministries of Kentuckiana. Eat at H.M. Frank's: an O'Shea's Pub 355 Spring St., Jeffersonville or Jack Binion's Steak at the Horseshoe Casino, on November 15, and 25% of your bill goes to support the House of Ruth. House of Ruth provides housing and support services for people with HIV/AIDS and their families who are homeless, at risk of losing their homes, or need financial help. They do this through a continuum of services: Emergency shelter, short and long-term housing, mental health counseling, substance abuse treatment, advocacy for clients, and basic needs assistance to provide food, clothes, rent, utilities, public transportation, and back-to-school support.

St. Paul's Pet Food Pantry will be operating on Saturday, November 18, from 9:30-11:00am to provide eligible participants with supplemental pet food and supplies. Our goal is to help keep people and their pets together when hard times hit.
