

THE KUNO COLLABORATION AGREEMENT

Preamble

KUNO is a Nordic-Baltic network for collaboration between higher educational institutions providing education in Fine Art. The aim of KUNO is to increase the quality of Nordic-Baltic art education through mutual exchange and the coordinated use of artistic, scientific and practical/financial resources.

1. Objectives

The objective of the member institutions is to strengthen their collaboration within teaching and artistic development/research.

KUNO also aims at collaboration with other European institutions and institutions in other parts of the world.

- 2. Collaboration and membership
- 2.1. Collaboration between member institutions
- 2.1.1 The member institutions shall encourage and realise student and staff mobility, develop joint courses and other joint activities.
- 2.1.2 Student mobility normally means exchange periods from 3 to 10 months (1 semester = 5 months, 1 academic year = 10 months).
- 2.1.3 Student express mobility normally means exchange periods from 1 to 4 weeks.
- 2.1.4 Staff mobility normally means exchange periods from 1 day to 4 weeks (minimum requirement: 1 week or 8 hours of teaching).
- 2.1.5 Economic support for mobility is always applied for through the student's or teachers's home institution.
- 2.1.6 For students, exchange periods at a KUNO partner institution shall be fully accredited as part of their studies/programme at the home institution. The host institution is responsible for providing documentation of studies done during the exchange period.
- 2.1.7 Admission of exchange students is based on portfolio review and also on the number of places available. All applications must be sent through the home institution.
- 2.1.8 During the exchange period a KUNO student shall as far as possible obtain the same rights as the students of the host institution. The member institutions shall mutually inform each other about specific regulations and routines that may apply.
- 2.1.9 Economic support for staff mobility is to be considered a contribution to travel costs, accommodation costs etc. If extra salary is required, it must be agreed between and provided by the institutions involved. The host institution should be responsible for assisting the guest in finding affordable accommodation.
- 2.1.10 All institutions are responsible for providing relevant information material to the KUNO partner institutions.
- 2.1.11 In the Nordplus application process as well as in relation to other financial sources - the development of joint courses and projects/seminars should be given priority.

2.2. Membership Criteria

To become a member in the KUNO network an institution must:

- Offer a BA/BFA degree in Fine Art, first cycle but not double degrees.
- Offer studio based practice in Fine Art.
- Present its institutional structure, learning outcomes and assessment in writing to KUNO Secretary.
- Hold an Erasmus Charter as KUNO collaboration is based on funding from both programmes, Nordplus and Erasmus+.

An academy that wishes to join the network needs to hand in an application before mid-April each year. Based on its conclusion, the Steering group of KUNO proposes the applicant as new member. Proposed new member should make a presentation at the network's annual meeting in October. Following the presentation, the member institutions vote on the application.

3. Leadership

The organs of the KUNO network are:

- Network meeting
- Steering group
- Chair
- KUNO Secretariat

The KUNO funds (Nordplus funds and the network's own funds) are administered by the institution that hosts the KUNO Secretariat. The funds are accounted for at the annual network meeting and at the steering group meetings.

3.1. Network meeting

- 3.1.1 The network meeting has the highest authority in the network. The Network meeting consists of full members of KUNO network and each member has one vote, associate members can attend network meeting without voting rights.
- 3.1.2 The Network meeting is held annually, the agenda is to be published at KUNO web site and contributed via e-mail 10 days before the network meeting.
- 3.1.3 Proxies. Full members may be represented at the meeting by other full members. Proxies must be named before the network meeting to the Secretariat and to the Chair.
- 3.1.4 Quorum. The meeting can make decisions if 50% of the members are represented. Decisions are made upon simple majority of those present. In case of a tie, the Chair's vote is decisive.
- 3.1.5 Financial support from the Nordplus programme is applied for jointly, according to proposals made by the member institutions. Decisions on the annual Nordplus application are made at or in relation to the annual network meeting.

- 3.2. Steering group.
- 3.2.1. The Steering group is a policy-making, counselling, governing and supervising body of KUNO. The Steering group establishes priorities of KUNO activities and may initiate separate working groups within the network. The steering group plans and supervises the budget of KUNO in cooperation with the KUNO Secretariat.
- 3.2.2. The Steering group comprises of 4 members.
- 3.2.3. Each member institution of KUNO may nominate candidates for the election of the steering group.
- 3.2.4. A steering group member is elected at the network meeting for a period of 2 years and is eligible for re-election for one further period of 2 years.
- 3.2.5. The Steering group names a Chair.
- 3.2.6. Each institution can only nominate one person, either from their own institution or a person from another institution and the KUNO Secretariat will receive confirmation from the nominee that the person is willing to be a steering group member.
- 3.2.7. Steering group members may be rectors, deans, directors, heads of departments, or professors from KUNO member institutions. The candidates must have full support and authority from their home institution presented to the KUNO Secretariat in written form before the Steering group elections. The candidates will be announced to the KUNO network in advance. Announcement includes names and CV and/or motivation if possible.
- 3.2.8. In case a Steering group member withdraws from the steering group due to change of position at his/her home institution, the seat will be filled through usual steering group elections procedure at the next annual Network meeting. Until the next Network meeting the home institution of the withdrawn steering group member can name a proxy from that institution according to p 3.2.7.
- 3.2.9. In case of contested election, i.e. if more than the needed number of new members are proposed, new members will be elected as follows:
 - The election will take place at the KUNO network meeting as part of the general agenda.
 - The candidates must present their motivation and vision at the KUNO network meeting.
 - Each KUNO member institution gets one vote. The voting is in writing and secret. Each member institution receives a voting sheet at the network meeting with names of candidates. The voter marks two candidates (or in accordance with number of available places in the SG each time).
 - The candidates receiving the highest number of vote will become the next SG members.

3.3. Chair.

The Chair is one of the members in the steering group and is decided among steering group members by democratic dialogue.

Once Chair is chosen, he/she will act for a 2 year period and may be re-elected if he/she has been re-elected to the Steering group.

3.4. Secretariat

KUNO Secretariat functions according to a separate set of guidelines agreed by the network meeting 06.10.2006 in Stockholm.

This agreement is reviewed and accepted at the KUNO network meeting on October 20th, 2017. The agreement is valid from this date until the network meeting in 2020 - unless any of the member institutions requests a revision at the 2018 or 2019 network meeting.
