#### Emergency care - Do you know your after-hours options?

It's always scary when your dog experiences a health emergency. It's scarier when it happens at a time when your regular vet is closed. Large cities often have one or more 7-day 24-hour emergency care veterinary facilities, but Wenatchee does not. Some local veterinarians may have on-call staff that allow them to treat their regular patients after-hours in the case of an emergency, but not all do. And note, 'regular patients' probably means the vet that sees your dog every year - if you brought your puppy in one time for something 7 years ago, you may not be in their systems. One of our WKC members recently had an after-hours emergency with a family dog, wasn't able to get any help locally, and had to make the drive to Pasco (about 2.5 hours away) to a 24/7 hour facility with a dog with a severely broken leg. So WKC'ers: reminder that you may want to check with your vet (before you have an emergency) about what your options are if your pet has an emergency on an evening or weekend.

If your emergency involves something your dog ate, I've found the ASPCA's 24/7 poison control phone hotline helpful (but there is a charge) on two occasions, one involving Otter and some ingested foot warmers during her puppy days and one involving Otter and a bag of macadamia nuts taken from a zipped suitcase of a visiting relative. Then there was also the incident of Otter and the 2 pound bag of raisins (do you see a pattern?) during a camping trip in a national forest, which gave us the opportunity of locating a 24/7 emergency vet in Vancouver, WA and having a very long scary drive down out of the mountains. Which is a reminder, I guess, to not just check on your options for at home in Wenatchee, but to check your options for when you are traveling. I always appreciate that AKC trial premiums include information on local veterinary services.

Thank you to our wonderful instructors who were so kind to help us this weekend - Betsy, who walked EVERY course with us, Jan, who video'd our runs, and Pam J., Pam P. and Sara for all their tips and encouragement. I feel so fortunate to be a WKC member!

Tara Barrett: Otter (*at right*) went to the French Creek Barn Hunt, zoomed around like a puppy in her Master's B runs, did the tunnel in ALL four runs (!!!), and Q'd in 2 (handler error in the other 2). Little Miss Iskie Biscuit had a busy month, doing 2 days of barn hunt, 1 day of scent work, and 3 days of agility trials. Iskie did well at the barn hunt and scent work trials, focusing on her 'job' when running and staying calm and quiet in the busy environments, but I've decided trialing in agility is a little too much pressure for her as she got barky while running in the ring. She got 2 Q's in Open Barn Hunt (a 3<sup>rd</sup> and a 1<sup>st</sup>/High in Trial), 1 Q in Novice Scent Work Handler Discrimination (3<sup>rd</sup> place), and 1 Q each in Novice Standard (2<sup>nd</sup> place) and FAST (2<sup>nd</sup> place) agility. Although we are an agility 'trial fail,' Iskie has gained so much from



her agility lessons, and we are going to keep practicing and learning in calmer settings. I hugely appreciate the patience and insight of all the WKC agility teachers – Linda, Pam P., Jan, Betsy, and Sara - who've helped us.

Michelle Tevelde: Boone got his third Q for open JWW and new title, then one last run Sunday earned his first Q in excellent JWW. Timme did not get any qualifying runs but gave beautiful zoomies throughout the weekend.



Aspen (*left*) and her mom Jan Flatten traveled to Monroe at the beginning of the month to participate in their first barn hunt trial in quite a while. Aspen has sure turned on to rats!
