Whether it's having an artmaking date with a close friend or joining a class, having other people to share with is extremely gratifying. Get encouragement from like minded creators. Collaborating with others in your field can also help you out when you're stuck with a technical problem. Lastly, giving away finished projects and seeing the recipient's joy is extremely motivating to follow through.



Swap materials and tools. Most creative people not only love getting new art supplies, but they often have a huge stash they don't ever use! Instead of feeling guilty for having too much (or hungry if you don't have enough), consider swapping supplies online or in person. A new skein of yarn or type of

pen can inspire all kinds of projects.
