President's Message

Dear ANSA NSW Members,

Last year I opened my annual report up with the line "What a great year it has been", this year I am still looking for a line that best sums up what the past fishing year has been all about. I don't mean this in a negative sense, but the word "interesting" does not do any justice to the frenetic and hectic pace at which things have unfolded for all of us here at ANSA NSW. Last year I acknowledged that it had been the busiest and most productive years I have been associated with over the past decade and I had seen ANSA NSW lift its profile to new heights, not only with regard to its award winning and life saving angel ring project but with regard to the elevation of its profile within the State and Federal Government arena. This year we raised the bar that little bit higher.

I could have almost submitted my last year's report verbatim and still been in the ballpark in terms of what we at ANSA NSW are continuing to achieve, last year ANSA NSW lifted its profile to new heights, not only with regard to its award winning and life saving angel ring project but with regard to the elevation of its profile within the State and Federal Government arena. It has also seen new and significant lines of communication being opened with all the relevant government agencies. The same can be said for this year.

One of the big things to hit the headlines was the Recreational Fishing Inquiry through the Legislative Council of NSW and was established on 24 November 2009 to inquire into and report on the benefits and opportunities that improved recreational fisheries may represent for fishing license holders in New South Wales. ANSA NSW was given two opportunities to present evidence and with the Inquiry to conclude in November 2010, we are all waiting with baited breath to see what outcomes and recommendations will transpire.

On the Federal front we have been confronted with fishing bans and new marine parks and the team at ANSA National has worked tirelessly to represent the interests of NSW anglers in these new areas that are seeking to take away our access to the resource whilst not providing any sound scientific evidence to back up the rationale behind these decisions.

Once again we have had new clubs come on board and have managed to maintain a stable membership base. We are always thriving to increase our membership numbers and hopefully next year we will see an increase. Without stealing too much of the committees thunder, all the crew has done an exceptional job at steering ANSA NSW once again. It is often a thankless task that often annoys the committee who try to handle the mundane day to day tasks like keeping all the records, databases, paying the bills etc in a timely manner, but thankfully the team always manages to keep the fires burning without too much pushing from me. Admittedly it is a time consuming, but rewarding at every turn. I actively encourage all ANSA NSW Clubs to nominate a representative for state committee duties every once in a while to keep us old timers on our toes. An injection of fresh blood is often needed to reinvigorate us all.

Take the time to read the committee reports, they outline 12 hard months of constant work for the team.

This year is an election year so I will take this chance to thank Yanko Serifi, who is shifting sideways from his role as Secretary to the role of Public Officer and continued role in the Angel Ring Team. Yanko will be on hand to keep an eye on the new Secretary, whoever that may be.

In closing it seems that the coming year will present a whole new range of challenges for ANSA NSW with marine parks, more pressure on fishing access to our favoured locations, safety, adequate representation at Government levels and the growing number of extreme green groups who want fishing banned.

In my opening remarks I was searching for a line that would sum up this year, upon reflection I can say it has been a great year for all of us here at ANSA NSW. I will also like to finally add that next year will be the year that we need to step up a gear and get involved as some of the biggest challenges we have faced as recreational anglers are on our doorstep and the ANSA NSW Committee for 2010/2011 will need all the help it can get from its members. Contribute in the debate, participate in the processes and help us shape our fishing future.

Vice President's Message

2009/10 was another extremely busy and challenging year for ANSA at both a Branch and National level and there is little prospect that the new year will be any different.

ANSA has been at the forefront for most every community and government initiative that has ramifications for recreational fishing. With the help of our many recreational fishing colleagues we were fortunate enough to have been able to turn the tide on the Australian Government's ban on the recreational take of Mako and Porbeagle sharks. However, we are now facing a similar restriction on the take of thresher sharks due to a recent IOTC (Indian Ocean Tuna Commission) listing of the species as endangered. To conserve the species the IOTC has ruled that all thresher sharks must be released alive and consistent with the terms of international treaties, the Australian Government is obliged to comply with the ruling. Negotiations are ongoing with the Australian Government and its Fishery Agencies in a bid to reach a sensible political outcome similar to that for Makos.

Australia's international obligation under the UN Convention of Biological Diversity to ring the Australian coast with a network of marine reserves and marine parks by 2012 is nearing finalisation. Proposed commonwealth marine park locations (AFA's) have been identified in NSW, QLD, WA and the NT and there has been much discussion and consultation with DEWHA management in terms of what types of protective zones will be introduced – where they might be - and the issue of compensation for those activities, such as fishing, which might be adversely impacted as a consequence of restrictions. The public consultation process has been delayed as a consequence of the recent elections but regardless of who wins office the commonwealth marine zoning process will continue to roll out. There has been a lot of anxiety expressed by commercial and recreational fishing groups that are fearful the proposed new marine reserves/ parks will severely restrict fishing access. This anxiety has been fuelled by the demands of the conservation groups to lock up 30% of Australian waters as no fishing zones. From a personal perspective I don't believe this will happen based on the outcome of the South Eastern commonwealth marine reserve that was implemented a few years back and embraced the SA, Vic and Tas coasts. The impact on recreational fishing was minimal as most protection zones were in distant commonwealth waters seldom accessed by Recfishers. I am hopeful this precedent will apply for the new marine parks / reserves. However we cannot afford to become complacent and all recreational fishers need to be alert to what's happening around them and be prepared to protect their patch.

At a state level the review process for the Jervis Bay and Solitary Island marine parks is currently in train and all Recfishers are encouraged to participate personally in the review process. This is your only opportunity to have a say on the future of these parks for the next decade as the review period will shift from 5 to 10 years. Take the time to go to the www.savesol.com and www.savejb.com websites to learn more about these marine parks and participate in the review process.

ANSA NSW also participated in the recent NSW Fishing Inquiry initiated by Robert Brown from the Shooters and Fishers party.

A good case was presented for the establishment of additional recreational fishing havens in locations such as Sydney Harbour and the Shoalhaven. It was recommended that funds for the buyout of commercial licences in those locations be raised by way of NSW Treasury loan via the Saltwater Trust Expenditure Committee and repaid over time out of licence fees – as was the case for initial recreational fishing havens. It will be interesting to see what recommendations eventually flow from the inquiry.

A strong case was also made for better public consultation on marine parks and government funding of the fishing safety awareness and education programmes of which ANSA is a driving force.

NSW Fisheries has just about finalised one of the most significant recreational fishing surveys ever undertaken in NSW. The survey which was jointly funded by Industry and Investment and the Saltwater Trust Expenditure Committee was conducted over 2 years and involved some 24000 personal interviews with recreational fishers in the Greater Sydney region. The amount of data on fishing effort, species targeted - caught, kept and released is staggering and will take another 6 months to collate and rolled into a web based portal currently being developed which when completed will provide free access for all interested recreational fishers.

It has been some 10 years since the last National fishing survey was undertaken. A number of State fisheries have recently undertaken their own socio economic surveys of recreational fishing to establish current data. It is very likely that NSW Fisheries will very soon also embark on a major NSW state wide recreational fishing survey that could potentially be wrapped up with other states into the fabric of a national survey. We need to actively support NSW Fisheries in the compilation of survey data.

ANSA has maintained its full membership status with Recfish Australia but currently has not filled its formal position on the Recfish board. Regrettably there has been no financial support for Recfish from the current Federal government and due to financial constraints it was necessary to let go the services of Len Olyott, the hard working and talented Executive Officer. The constitution of Recfish was substantially amended over 2010 to facilitate a broadening of membership base and to make the body more inclusive and representative at a state and national level. A number of State peak bodies have now joined Recfish as full members. Recfish will continue to operate on a volunteer basis with limited funding for the present and will continue to explore funding options. Ideally each State should be required to contribute to the operational funding of Recfish on a pro rata basis relative the number of recreational fishers in that state. This is unfortunately not feasible at present as not all States have a licensing regime capable of generating the required level of revenue. It is hoped that NSW and Vic will come to the aid of Recfish and some other States will then follow suit.

To conclude I would like to say thanks to all those within the extended ANSA network across the nation and in particular the NSW Branch Executive for the extensive work and effort that has gone into maintaining our fisheries and the preservation of access rights. As mentioned at the outset it has been a challenging past year and the road ahead won't be any easier.

To all the members of the Association, welcome to your Annual Report of the NSW Branch.

The Branch as a whole looks financially healthy. Income across all accounts for the year was \$37,811.68. Expenditure across all accounts for the year was \$44,738.18. Our forecast budget of \$0.00 surplus for 2008/2009 was an actual surplus of \$840.24 for the main account and a deficit of \$7,766.74 for our Project Accounts. Membership, the Branch at present represents 32 clubs consisting of 1100 members. Our direct membership branch club, Sportfishing NSW, has 43 members. Refer to Membership Report for more detail.

Tightlines continued to be an important communication tool with plenty of editions throughout the year. Refer to Joe's report for further reading.

The Angel Ring Project continues to be a success. With more lives saved. The project continues to receive good publicity. Further funding was received.

This year I have decided to step down as Secretary and hand over the responsibility to the new elected Secretary. Who that may be, well the AGM will decide this. I will stay on in a minor role as Public Officer and continue in my role with the Angel Ring Project.

I would like to finish by saying thank you to my fellow Committee and Members for your support over the last 12 months and for giving me the opportunity in serving you and ANSA.

TREASURER'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2010

Like the Australian economy, ANSA NSW has experienced a bit of a bounce back from the unexpected loss for 2008-09, with our accounts showing a profit of \$840.24 for the 2009-10 year. We maintain a healthy bank balance of \$21,264.77.

Comparing the actual results to our 2009-10 Budget, income was close to expected, with higher membership income offset by lower other income, including interest and website sponsorship. Expenses were lower in total than Budget, with our presentation night expenses being higher than expected, but most other categories being under.

2009-10 saw the wrap-up of our two Recreational Fishing Community Grants Programme projects, with final reports being accepted and all money being spent. I know getting these done has been a massive task for Stan, with a lot of frustration and negotiation required. Stan also put together our NSW Fisheries Trust Fund application, from which we secured approximately \$20,000 a year for three years to continue the Angel Rings project. It's pleasing to see the government recognise the importance of the project and support it financially. The bulk of our 2009-10 project expenses came from this funding source.

I'd just like to acknowledge the great effort Stan has put into these projects to continue improving rock fishing safety. I'm sure I speak for all ANSA members when I say a big "thank you Stan" for your ongoing commitment.

A budget for the coming year has been prepared, again being on the conservative side. I'm hopeful of a return to increasing membership which will help us cover the increases in expected expenditure. Time will tell.

Recorder's Report – 30 June 2010

Hi everyone, well the end of the year has come and gone, and the new 2010-2011 angling year has begun.

There were significant changes to the 12 month competition starting in July 2009 there was concern that the changes would not be well received. The exact opposite has occurred, anglers have embraced the changes. More state records have been added 'overall' in the line class category, with 'less' line class categories to enter into. The new 'length only' state records and 12 month competition changes have been well received and it is growing in leaps and bounds.

12-Month Competition (2009-2010)

The competition finished with 301 entries up from last year's 169, that's a significant increase. 9 Clubs had anglers score points in the competition. With the addition of the 6 length only categories, anglers were kept on their toes in that competitors were continually upgrading the species of fish that had been entered. This made for some exciting results.

In 2008-2009, across the 23 division (no length based), 28 anglers were presented certificates for 1st to 3rd place.

In 2009-2010, across the 23 division (now with length based), 43 anglers will be presented certificates for 1st to 3rd place. The changes have opened up the competition to more angler participation and recognition.

Based on the regularity of competition updates, a number of clubs were spurred on to put in a last ditch effort to secure the trophy for champion club.

The champion club position changed place several times over the year and even in the last several weeks before the close of the angling year.

Wollongong SFC placed first with 40points closely followed by South Sydney AFA on 37 points.

NSW Records (2009-2010)

The year added 118 line class records, which is up on last year's 86. New line class state records were added by 56 anglers at some point during the year.

New records were set across 33 different species. Six Clubs had anglers that received state records.

The year added 50 length only records. This will continue to grow.

ANSA NSW Convention Circuit (2009-2010)

There were 572 angler entries in total to the combined convention circuit, of which 108 anglers succeeded in putting points on the board at any of the conventions.

Finally

It has been a frustrating year for me as the State Recorder. I am at a loss to explain why capture forms are still being sent to me incomplete. I am unsure how many times I need to explain the same requirement over and over to the anglers and club recorders. Unfortunately I don't have the time to phone/email every angler and club recorder to find out why forms are incomplete. I have now adopted a zero tolerance policy, if the forms are incomplete or incorrect, they will be returned to the club recorder. If they are re-received within the 35days from the original date of capture they will be processed, otherwise they will be filed unprocessed.

Please ensure that you read the 12-Month rules for the 2010-2011 angling year that will be released very soon, this will ensure that all members are aware of the requirements.

I hope that the 2009-2010 angling year was successful for you and I look forward to receiving all of your 'correctly completed' claim forms. I will endeavour to provide regular updates throughout the year.

Good luck for the 2010-2011 season and 'Tight Lines'.
