President's Report

"What a year it has been" – I seem to use this opening statement every year and this year is no different. As an association we have achieved a lot over the past 12 months and have spent a lot of time soul searching as a Committee in how we can do things better to support our Clubs and their members.

Will the year 2018-2019 be remembered as year we started to really increase the membership of our Association, or just another year in our struggle to re-establish ourselves to our former glory? With an introduction like that, the tangent that this report can take varies between criticism and congratulation. Finding the middle road is very difficult, with the promotion of ANSA NSW succeeding and developing in some areas and failing dismally in others.

One thing many of us have realised is that the climate in which the organisation thrived within the 70's and 80's has changed markedly within the new millennium. The gentle art of fishing has progressed at break neck speed, with new and exciting developments being thrust upon us, until the next new thing comes along when the cycle is repeated. The notion of sportfishing was fresh in the 70's, and idea held true for 20 years and served our association well, but how many times have we heard someone remark "been there, done that" when talking about ANSA NSW? Every magazine, TV show and website related to fishing has moved away from the grass roots of fishing, the basic bread and butter of the sport has been replaced with slick technological advances, aimed at consumers with disposable incomes who wish to participate in this month's new 'thing'. Magazine editors, writers and TV presenters move from one gimmick to another and reinvent themselves daily, depending on what happens overseas and how big the cheques are. Whilst the Association tries to stay dedicated to the Sportfishing principle, have we have continued to serve up the same dish for the last 20 odd years?

The future promotion of ANSA NSW beyond 2019 will involve the Clubs working closely with ANSA NSW. The Clubs must also be prepared to accept any new member's enquiries efficiently and professionally, websites need to be maintained and the reliance of line class as a selling point need to be reviewed. Support for our Clubs must be one our highest priority in the next few years. Membership growth within the Clubs will be one of the key indicators of our success.

The politics, letter writing and representation roles that come with our committee jobs are challenging roles to deal with and we spent some very constructive and critical time on the Hawkesbury Bioregion at the last AGM shaping our arguments. We challenged plans for creation of a Hawkesbury Bioregion Marine Park - including a Sydney Harbour marine park I can honestly say after a good win where "lockouts were taken off the table" the fight has not stopped. The time and effort put into that campaign by ANSA NSW and its Clubs was incredible, culminating in a united Stop the Lockout March in the City late last year in which many Clubs participated.


Many new relationships and alliances were formed last year in the Hawkesbury Bioregion space and many new faces started to appear but succession planning will still need to pick up where many of us will be leaving off when this all finally ends. The fight does not end and the good fight needs good people to run good clubs. This was a good time; no in fact it is still a good time to tap into the uncertainty still out there around marine parks to help draw new members into the Clubs. Whilst we all just want to go fishing, had we not acted collectively last year we would have senseless lockouts on our doorsteps, so yes every one of us need to devote some time to politics, but we should always be looking to bring new and passionate people into our clubs to keep us all on our toes and drive us all a bit more. I wrote the following last year, "We have built a great platform of clubs and advocacy roles over the years but we need fresh blood to keep pushing our

agenda which seems to have shifted from ethics and conservation, to maintaining access and our right to fish” and this is starting to happen and still needs to happen and should not be discounted as a selling point on why we join clubs – a collective voice is a good starting point and this is what ANSA NSW provides.

What is even more exciting is the space ANSA NSW is currently working in to help Clubs process club memberships and automatic payments, distribute club calendars, events and results and promote club news and important updates instantly to members. We are looking at tools that help improve participation at conventions, participation within our clubs, and boost membership numbers for all Clubs and ANSA NSW. I am happy to see a new mantra being pushed out by the ANSA NSW Committee at meetings, which are mostly teleconferences where many of us discuss and “recall a time before the internet and social media had become mainstream and fishing clubs were considered the fishing community hub, where fishers could exchange information, techniques and stories about fishing opportunities while encouraging social togetherness”. This is where our focus also needs to be and will be over the next few years, making the job of running a club easier and easier for the members to participate and drive greater connection between the NSW Clubs Today the recreational fishing community has changed significantly due to the digital age and modern practices.

In our 51st year we might have turned a new page, stay tuned.

Vice President's Report

2018/19 was again a carry-over from previous years with still lots of unfinished business to be resolved at a National and State level. The range and extent of old and new issues and challenges continue to stretch our volunteer resources but to do nothing will have dire consequences for all current and future generations of recreational fishers.

It is impossible for ANSA to tackle all these issues and challenges alone and it is imperative that all recreational peak bodies - state and national - which have recreational fishing at heart, rally together and speak as one voice in advocating for the promotion and protection of recreational fishing and preservation of the marine environment and fish resources across all boundaries.

In NSW we are indeed fortunate to be supported by the NSW Recreational Fishing Alliance (RFANSW) which is the collective voice of recreational fishing in NSW and on a national front we have a strong ally in the Australian Recreational Fishing Foundation (ARFF). ANSA is a foundation member of both these organisations and plays a pivotal role in looking out for the interests of recreational fishers and engaging with government and the many government agencies that have influence and say in the direction and management of our fisheries and the marine environment. Also at state level we have a voice on the NSW Ministerial Fisheries Advisory Council (MFAC) and the Recreational Fishing NSW Council (RFNSW) and representation on the NSW Recreational Fishing Saltwater Licence Trust Expenditure Committee (FSTEC). At a national level we have member representation on the Ministers Advisory Council and direct engagement with the Australian Fisheries Management Authority (AFMA) and Department of Agriculture Fisheries and Forestry (DAF) on issues pertaining to the management of our Commonwealth fisheries. ANSA's membership relationship with IGFA also ensures that we have a voice and an ally on the international scene

ANSA is also at the leading edge of fish habitat preservation and rehabilitation initiatives both nationally and at a state level via its membership of Ozfish Unlimited and the NSW Fish Habitat Partnership. ANSA is a foundation member of both these organisations whose charter is to lead the charge on projects and funding essential for the rehabilitation and preservation of our national waterways and to rejuvenate fish stocks back to levels they were in our grandparent's time - no mean feat but at least the game has started.

It is no easy task interacting with the many differing factions that are putting recreational fishing in jeopardy but it is gratifying how successful we can be as a collective voice by presenting well thought out alternative scenarios and possible solutions in an objective and persuasive manner. It is not surprising that within the ranks of government and those agencies that drive and influence recreational fishing policy and outcomes there are many individuals who themselves are recreational fishers and are behind the scene allies and supporters. We just need more of them and with a mind to be helpful and supportive.

We won't win on every issue and at times the best achievable outcome is preservation of the status quo so that recreational fishers' interests are not going backwards. Some of the more significant issues that ANSA is actively involved with and which have a National and NSW impact include;

Nationally

- Super trawlers - While we have successfully seen off several attempts to have super trawler / factory vessels operate within Australian waters targeting our small pelagic species, there still ongoing attempts by those in the commercial sector to exploit these small bait species

that are of vital importance in the feed chain for larger pelagic predators sought by recfisher. We need to remain ever vigilant to these ongoing threats to our Commonwealth fisheries.

- Commonwealth Marine Reserves - Finally after more than a decade of political debate the Commonwealth's planned network of marine reserves is now a reality. ANSA together with other national and state peak bodies played an instrumental role in achieving a much better deal for recreational fishers than might otherwise have been the case and undoubtedly the voice of recreational fishers had some influence upon the outcome the recent Federal election where Commonwealth marine reserve policy was a controversial election issue. Recreational fishers now have an official voice on all of the Marine Park Advisory Committees including myself as the representative for the Temperate East marine park
- Southern Bluefin Tuna. There is still much work to be done in sorting out a formal national allocation of SBT quota for recreational fishers as required under international treaties. Surveys of recfisher interaction with SBT are in process in most states where SBT are prevalent and a national SBT /Tuna Champions awareness campaign is currently rolling out in most states including NSW. Tuna Champion /SBT recfisher forums already held in Victoria and SA have been supported and well received by ANSA in those states. We remain confident that a sensible allocation of SBT quota between the commercial, recreational and indigenous sectors can be negotiated with the Australian Government.
- Murray Darling Basin - With ongoing drought across most of the nation the already overstressed MDB is going from bad to worse with dire consequences for our inland fish resources and marine habitat. The challenges for those tasked with management of MDB water allocations are enormous and striking the right balance for sharing water flows for the environment and agriculture/community consumption are getting tougher by the day and sadly have become increasingly politicised. To put it simply no water equates no fish habitat and no fish. We need to strike the right measure between socio economic need and the needs of nature and adopt more efficient means of preserving our water resources when in abundance. We will continue to press government at a national and state level to recognise recreational fishing and the preservation of inland fish resources as an integral part of the ongoing management plan for the MDB and our inland waterways.
- Carp Eradication. While we can't make it rain we can do more to better manage what is in our waterways. The program for release of the Herpes virus to cull much out the nation's carp population is still being scientifically investigated. While scientific opinion is overwhelmingly positive about the use of the carp virus and its lack of impact on other fish species, there is still much work to be done on evaluating the impacts a massive and instantaneous carp cull will have on water quality in our rivers and dams and potential public health consequences. This could be some time away assuming that the government sticks to its commitment to release the carp virus.
- Recreational Fisher representation. The Australian government continues to acknowledge the need for a national recreational fishing peak body to collectively represent and speak for all Australian recreational fishers. As previously mentioned ARFF and its state and national peak body members fill this role and are now the acknowledged two way communication conduit between government and the recreational fishing sector via the National Recreational Fishing Council. The Australian government also recognises the critical need for up skilling of those individuals representing recreational fishers on various fishery management and advisory panels etc and has committed to make funds available for this to

happen and to ensure that not only the best people serve on these panels etc but the level of recreational fisher representation is more equitably weighted in our favour.

- Support for the conduct of a national / state by state study into the socio economic value of recreational fishing.
- Support for enhanced investment in fisheries research and recognition of the role and value of citizen science.
- Engagement in the development and delivery of a national recreational fishing education programme.

On the NSW scene specifically we have been actively engaged with issues such as:

- Ongoing lobbying for NSW government recognition of the RFA NSW as the official State peak body for all NSW recreational fishers
- Engagement in plans for creation of a Hawkesbury Bioregion Marine Park - including a Sydney Harbour marine park and a campaign for the Harbour be declared a recreational fishing haven
- Lobbying for no netting in the Hawkesbury, Shoalhaven and Tuggerah Lakes and for these waterways to be declared recreational fishing havens
- Continued pressure on agencies such as the EPA, Sydney Water and Councils for the detection and prosecution of offenders for water contamination and fish kill events and also for financial penalties when imposed by the Land and Environment Court to be directed into local habitat rehabilitation and other fishery related projects rather than consolidated revenue. Already we have secured \$200000 for extension of the DPI Mulloway and Kingfish stocking program in Botany Bay from such penalties.
- Pursuing financial offsets for loss of recreational fishing access or for industrial damage to our marine environment. It is our goal to build upon the \$200k EPA financial penalty and \$5mill for loss of fishing access within Botany Bay of which \$2.5 mill has already been expended on the installation of 2 additional artificial reefs off Port Hacking – the “John Dunphy Reefs” and for investment in other recreational fishing amenities.
- Intervention in the proposal by the NSW government to hand over management of the SE Trawl Fishery to the Commonwealth. This is not in the best interests of any stakeholder or the fishery itself. The better option which is supported by 23 out of 24 licensed SE Trawl fishers is to exit the fishery with an appropriate compensatory package. It would be a real win for everyone and targeted fish species if this type of commercial fishing activity off NSW south coastal waters was come to a negotiated end.
- An ongoing watching brief of the “on Street” boat trailer parking regulations which now effectively restrict parking on public streets for a maximum of 28 days across NSW. While only a small number of councils across Sydney are running pilots of this restrictive practice, all boat owners and the boating industry should be very concerned if this discriminatory regulation is adopted state wide.
- Campaign to ensure that recreational fishers are not unjustly prohibited from fishing off public jetties and wharves
- Engagement with relevant authorities concerning the regulatory requirements for compulsory wearing of lifejackets by rock fishers. While there is considerable merit in having

rock fishers wear lifejackets it is critically important that the type of jacket to be worn is of a recognised Australian standard that is specific and tailored for rock fishing use

- Continued rollout of the Angel Ring programme and safe fishing awareness/ education
- Expansion of the ANSA NSW Newtag programme
- Support for the installation of mesh screens on inland waterway irrigation pumps to minimise mortality impact on juvenile freshwater fish species etc.
- Support for the campaign to introduce Platypus friendly yabby traps
- Involvement and input into the ongoing review of NSW commercial fishing

This is a once again a remarkable level of activity by a very small group of individuals who also play vital roles in keeping ANSA at the forefront of recreational fishing by ensuring that its sport fishing activities and member services are in tune with member needs and for ANSA to be the organisation of choice for all recreational fishers.

Treasurer's Report

Following is the Financial Report for the Year of 2018 - 2019 as well as the budget for 2019 – 2020. The year finished with a combined bank balance of \$ 12,678.00 and change.

Income drops for the year, against Budget, was mainly in Membership with loss of a few smaller Clubs that lowered Affiliation & Membership fee's as well as a drop in direct membership. Project accounts did not receive funding payments this year and both current funding streams for Angel Rings & Fishing 4 Therapy will be wound up in the next few months with final payment and closure of current funding.

Funding was received for the Swordfish Project but this is run through the General Account and not Special Projects.

Most notable differences of Budget / Actual this year was as follows (approximate amounts):

- Insurances down \$500
- Post & Stationary up \$800
- Badges / Certificates down \$500
- Promotions up \$2800
- Website down \$1500

PayPal account is still having issues with its operations. As soon as it's sorted, we will be closing it and changing to direct deposits, cheques or money orders for payments by the direct membership. Clubs will continue to pay as they always have.

Recorder's Report - Competitions

Another year of competitions has been run and won, but can we do more?

12 Month Competition

Taking on the role as the 12 Month Competition Recorder I have grown to appreciate the variety of fisher folk ANSA NSW has.

Analysing the past 12 years of 12-month competition statistics I will begin this report with the status quo by offering some highlights from the past 12 months.

Of the possible 75 positions to be awarded there was only 5 spots unfulfilled, a good result overall. Ten clubs participated in the competition with Terry Tatton of the Wollongong Sportfishing Club making a stellar effort entering many fish. A total of 120 submissions were accepted to the competition with the length categories being the most contested section of the competition. To read the full results continue flicking through the annual report to see who's who in the winners' zoo. At the end of the competition year, the competition stayed on par with its own benchmark from the past decade. This leads me to my next part of the Recorder's report. Put simply, **WE DON'T HAVE ENOUGH PARTICIPATION!** From here I will tone down my frustration with the status quo and resolute desire to bring about a new paradigm for which all ANSA clubs will benefit and see a much larger increase of members getting out and fish!

With this report I have provided 5 graphs to illustrate the current level of interaction with the 12-month competition. Some may say "there is nothing wrong", but in my experience most are saying to me "we need to change to remain relevant" and I am sure many of you would agree.

A picture paints a thousand words, and these graphs paint many thousands of words if you take the time to study and digest them. Personally, I would like to see the competition more accessible to our membership base, all our clubs participating, our youth encouraged and empowered to enter fish, more female participation, basically get our members back out on the water fishing. For this to happen we need to create a new competition system which makes it much easier for everyone to submit fish for the individual, family and club levels. All these levels of participation are captured and converge to one point, at a state level. Also, what needs to happen is **everyone to play their part** if they want their club and ANSA NSW to succeed for another 50 years. Each member needs to put in a little effort in their own way, every club committee must find the energy to invigorate their club and participation and the ANSA NSW volunteers will play their part helping connect the dots.

Speaking from a regional level, my club the Euro Fishing Association on the South Coast NSW is on track driving fishing club and competition participation levels back to where they should be and it is my hope we can spread this renewed sense of participation to the rest of ANSA NSW clubs through collaboration, encouraging a spirit of togetherness, strengthening and increasing the ANSA NSW membership base.

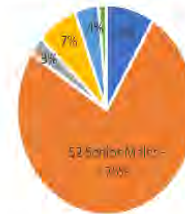

2018 - 2019 ANSA NSW 12 Month Competition Age and Genders Groups Quantities That Competed

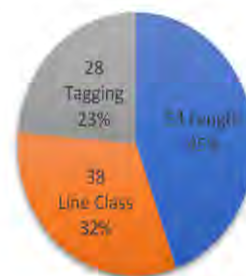

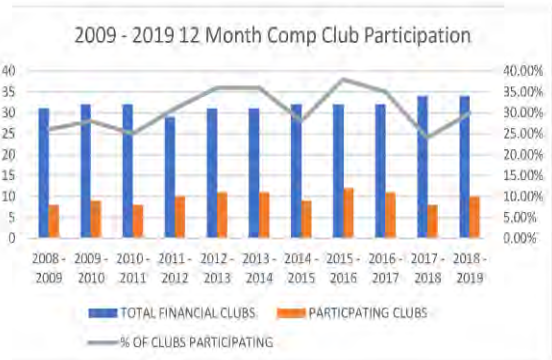

Throughout the various debates ANSA NSW played a significant role in setting the agenda in discussions to further the notion of fishing being an environmentally sustainable sport and recreational pursuit.

Issues among the areas of focus for ANSA NSW during the Financial Year were:

- ✚ Fish kills in the Murray Darling Basin;
- ✚ Oyster reefs;
- ✚ The impact of poor water quality/pollution on marine ecosystems;
- ✚ Management of Intermittently Closing Lakes and Lagoons (ICOLLS);

This report provides a summary as to the above issues and ANSA NSW's associated approach.

Fish kills in the Murray Darling Basin

After news of an estimated one million dead fish 15km upstream of Menindee broke and photos of 40 to 50 year old Murray cod were littered across the media a considered approach was discussed by the committee which complemented the position of the ARFF. This was to advocate for the recreational fishing community and highlight the need for a comprehensive, evidence-based review. ANSA NSW's statement in relation to the fish kills is currently published on its home page at www.ansansw.com.au.

Oyster reefs

In focus has been the value of reefs made up of oysters, mussels and other shellfish in relation to marine biodiversity. ANSA NSW notes the success of the Victorian restoration program undertaken by its Government, The Nature Conservancy and its partners as well as the collective Australian/New Zealand Shellfish Restoration Network.

The Marine Estate Management Authority has also identified this as a key area of focus for its organisation established the Oyster Reef Restoration project. MEMA are currently undertaking a survey of oyster farmers to assist in filling any knowledge gaps as they continue to scope the project.

ANSA NSW will continue to provide advocacy for this important work.

The impact of poor water quality/pollution on marine ecosystems

ANSA NSW recognises pollution of beaches, foreshores and waterways as a significant risk to marine biodiversity and, together with the Recreational Fishing Alliance provided a strong voice in calling for more focus from NSW Environment Minister Gabriel Upton throughout the Financial Year, including pressing the Minister as to why coastal sewage outfalls are still utilised. Committee members also met and raised the issue with opposition MPs and candidates NSW in the led up to the State election.

With the existing Government retained ANSA NSW, in its association with the RFA will build on previous communications, seeking a more dedicated approach to removal of pollution and management of marine biodiversity.

Management of Intermittently Closing Lakes and Lagoons (ICOLLS)

After fish kills in 2019 became headlines again, this time along the Eastern seaboard, focus moved towards management of Intermittently Closing Lakes and Lagoons (ICOLLS). Stories of Byron Shire Council caving to pressure from residents and artificially opening an ICOLL, leading to an oxygen vacuum and resultant fish deaths brought the ire of the recreational and sports fishing community. The focus intensified when two South Coast ICOLLS experienced fish kills as a result of low water levels.

ANSA NSW has and will continue to advocate for sound scientific rationale (not simply water levels reaching infrastructure preservation triggers, public pressure etc) being applied to Local Council decisions to artificially open ICOLLS to the sea.

The impact of soft plastics on fish health and waterways

This has been a difficult research topic as the majority of analyses focus on fish ingestion during capture (and effect post capture) and are often undertaken or commissioned by commercially interested parties.

As Environmental Officer I wanted to extend my research more broadly to include debris volume along shorelines and in waterways having personally experienced, like many fishers tailor or leatherjacket destruction, with only a portion of the lure returning. Views are mixed on what is considered by some as “shoreline confetti” with many seeming to apply similar ignorance to that of smokers flicking cigarette butts overboard.

I was pleasantly surprised, when discussing the topic with other fishers to find that many have converted to alternate lure types such as metal blades and hard bodies. Bioplastics are a positive step however no manufacturer will truly bind themselves to 100% degradation.

A survey of fishers may be the best approach for achieving quality data against which ANSA NSW can form an informed position.

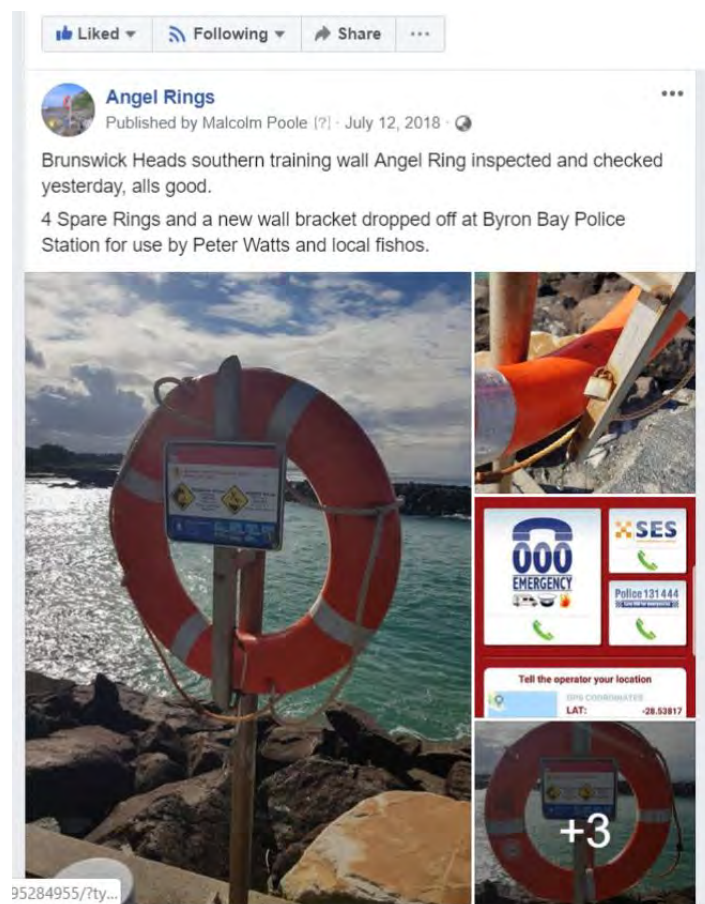
Angel Ring Coordinator's Report

Another year has passed and still the tireless and selfless work of the Angel Ring Volunteers continues to make a difference out in the community of NSW. The way the program works, its history and achievements have been documented here for many years and as we close in on 25 years it is time to perhaps put our hands up and ask for help. The expansion and ongoing management of the Project has outgrown the handful of clubs that historically have been the local custodians of the angel rings on their patch of rocks.

During the latter part of 2018 and into 2019 we have been asking the NSW Government for help in managing the Project. Something as simple as a tender process to help procure a contractor to visit every angel ring we have and report, replace or fix each assembly every 3 months is all it will take to tick a few boxes and allow us to get back onto expanding the project into areas that are crying out for more rings. Our current funding has been expended and the \$90,000 we received in 2013 has been used sparingly at a rate of \$15,000 a year. Chicken feed when you compare it to the lives they have saved over those years.

We have been asking where to from here for a while now and we think we are close to resolving the issues, but the final call will sit with the NSW Government on the ongoing value and longevity of the Project.

During the last 12 months we have used the Facebook page extensively to keep everyone up to date and here are some great posts that reflect the hard work accomplished over the past 12 months.

Fingal Angel Rings set to be installed

MEMBER FOR Tweed, Geoff Provest has confirmed that Lifesaving Angel Rings will be installed at Fingal Head by the Australian National Sportsfishing Association (ANSA) in the coming weeks after a lengthy delay.

The call for the installation of the life-saving devices came in the wake of five drownings at the beach between October 2015 and February this year.

Mr Provest told The Weekly that he didn't know the exact dates for the installation.

"As the ANSA are responsible for the installation of the Angel Rings we have to be guided by them for the dates," he said.

"There was a number of approvals that needed to be sought from relevant authorities that took longer than first anticipated."

"We have been advised that the installation is due to happen between the 23rd to 25th August - but there is always a possibility of weather causing delays - therefore it has been advised in coming weeks."

The announcement comes following successful negotiations with NSW Crown Lands, and Tweed Shire Council.

"I am pleased that these lifesaving devices will be installed at four locations across the Fingal Headland and on Dreamtime Beach," Mr Provest said.

"Two Angel Rings will be located at northerly and southerly positions adjacent to popular rock fishing locations on the headland itself.

"Two other rings will be placed adjacent to beach access points, one at the most northerly access point to Dreamtime Beach on the lighthouse access track, and the other on Fingal Beach near the main Surf Life Saving Club public carpark entrance."

Mr Provest said the sites had been chosen because "they are most frequently passed by swimmers, anglers and sightseers visiting the beaches and picturesque headland".

"Dreamtime Beach is an unpatrolled beach but is popular with locals and tourists alike because of its stunning location," Mr Provest said in a media release.

"I have been working closely with the ANSA who are responsible for Angel Ring projects and their installation in New South Wales and across Australia.

"If these Angel Rings can save even just one life then the effort to have them located at Fingal Head has been worth it."

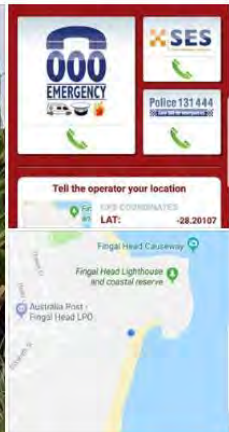

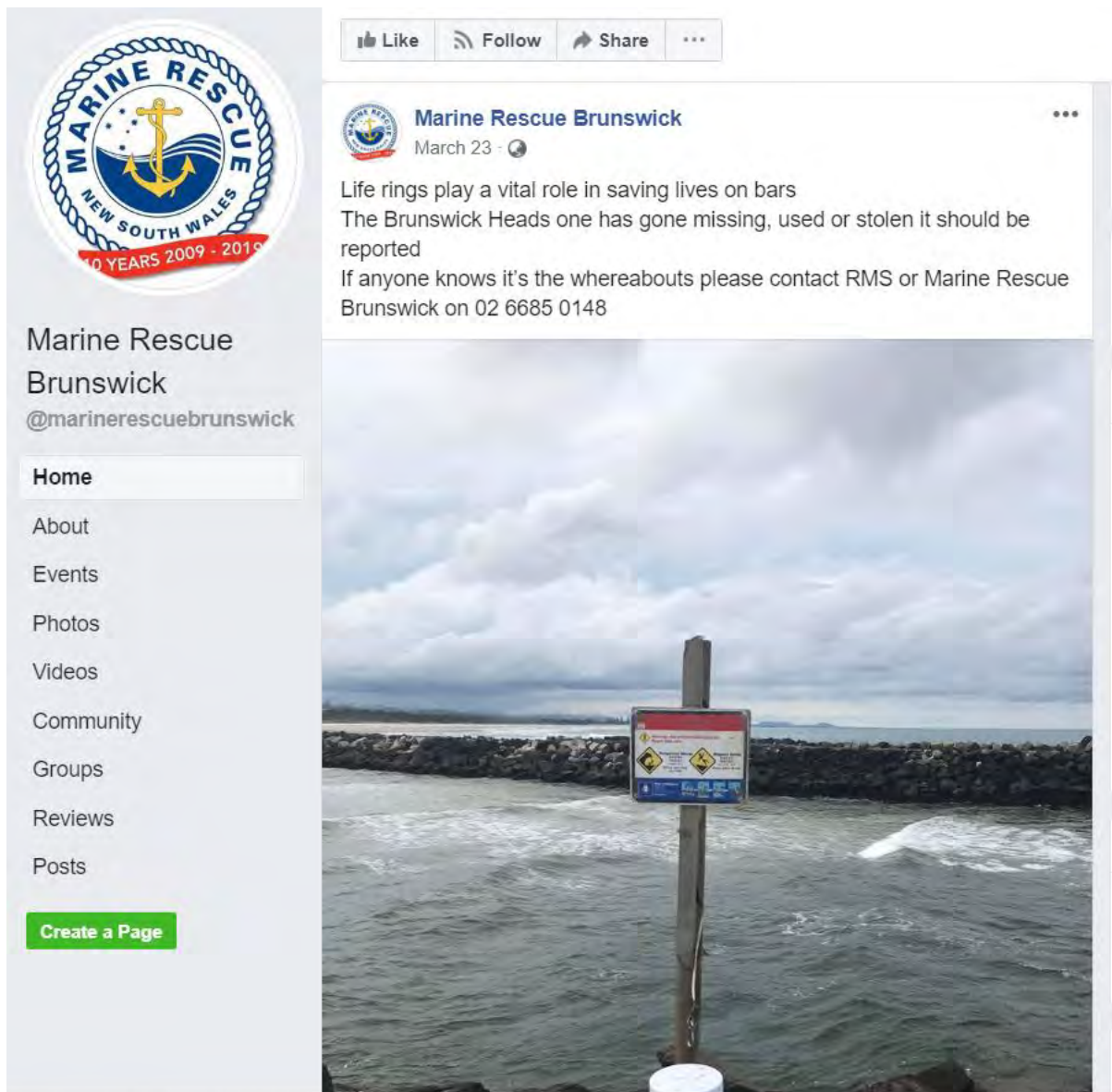

Fingal Head, Dreamtime Beach Angel Ring was installed today as per the recent media release and coverage organised by the Member for Tweed, The Hon Geoff Provest, another ring is located at Fingals main northern beach access near the carpark. Two more Rings will be installed on the headland in their approved locations soon along with update signage decals.

The Angel Ring is located on a dune fence protection post centre access track, pictured here with the GPS and Mapping detail taken using the Emergency+ App.

A spare ring will be located at the Fingal Head SLSC, these rings are a temporary measure until SLSNSW install their Emergency Push Button Stations for the beach locations, and the mobile phone reception is improved across the Fingal area to support the new technology.

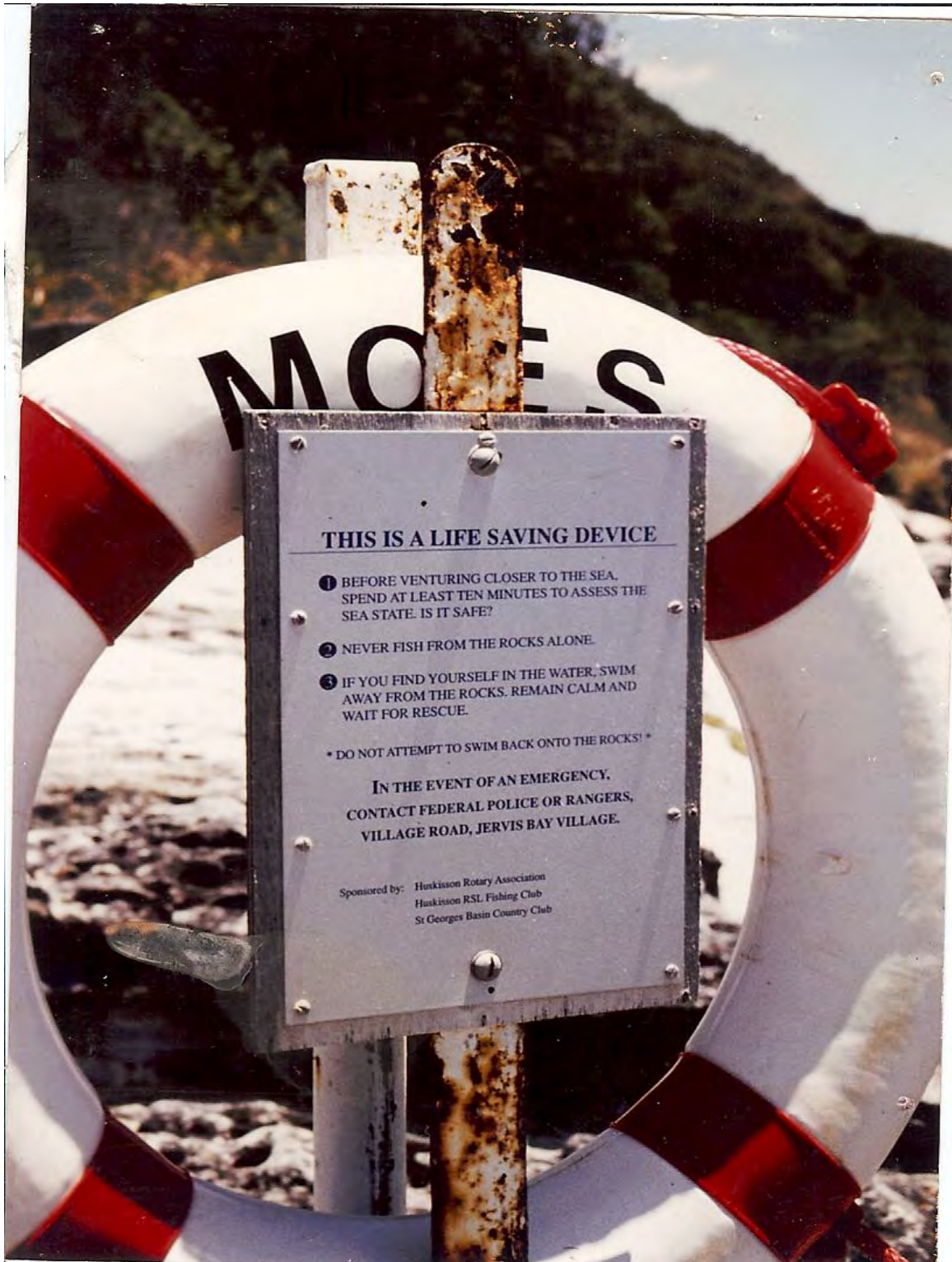




Every community minded individual and group is chipping in to help ANSA NSW keep this project alive, testament to the shared posts and concerns around missing rings promoted on their social pages.

25 years is a huge milestone and it all started back in the day on a platform outside Jervis Bay called Moe's Rock. In 1993 the life of a rock fishing angler was saved by a life ring installed by a bereaved father who had lost son who was rock fishing at Moe's Rock at an earlier date.

In 1993 the Department of Sport Recreation and Racing formed a group to focus on Rock Fishing Safety. A year later, ANSA NSW was commissioned to manage a project that would see the installation of "Guardian Angel Rings" in known rock fishing spots and thus the creation of the Angel Ring Project which has been actively running and gaining momentum since then.

Special Projects – Fishing 4 Therapy

The programme is continuing with our group bookings as well as selected one-on-one sessions, as needed to suit the individual cases, and we are still receiving more enquiries than we can cope with.

The NDIS is proving to be the biggest single hurdle for the attendees to cope with as the plans and or their management are now starting to restrict some from being able to attend.

Although individuals wish to participate, the plans are seeing some less well-off or less funded and so the case managers or family members who manage the funds are saying no to these types of activities. Often the time is being replaced with indoor activities at home or a group placing regardless of what the actual person concerned wants.

This has seen a large reduction in attendances for some groups we service with Autism based disabilities and we will see their booking likely end in a few weeks as they try for different activities that do not have an NDIS costs, such as carer or OT fee's attached.

Although F4T is a free service to all, the attendee's need to pay for a carer or OT to attend with them for every session. This comes out of their packages where previously it was a payment made by funding to individual associations.

We continue to grow with the ABI (acquired brain injury) group with their numbers slowly growing as more people are attending with them. The sessions are still fishing based, but we also have BBQ's where they cook and help set everything up, some are retired chef's, so the outing serves as therapy for them and a need of their skills.

Our integration of groups is also a growing area where we are trying to selectively combine people from some groups into the general public sessions we hold. This is giving great results and offers surprising outcomes with kids asking to fish with the elderly as they enjoy the stories. Our pilot group is the Junction Neighbourhood Centre, based out of Maroubra Library. They help the aged with community services and programmes and so we are helping to get some of their members back out in the fresh air and mixing with all different aged people.

Our efforts with areas of Tourette's continue but this is probably the hardest of all the areas we work with. The sessions are all, but for one individual, run on their own without any other group interaction. The social acceptance of those passing by and interacting with them is exceptionally hard and at times very depressing for all. While all efforts are being made to continue in this area it may be under review for continuing in the format it's in.

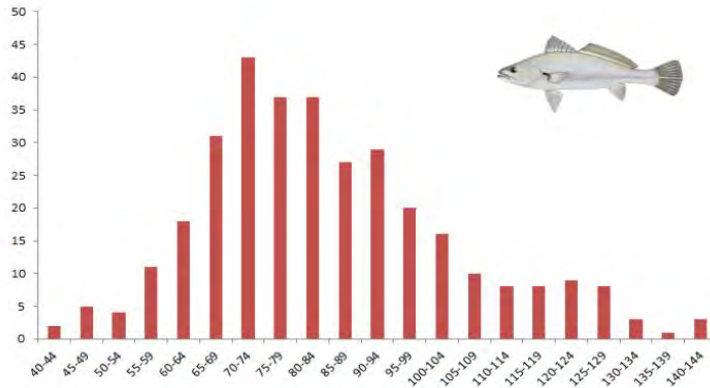
Special thanks to Bill Harvey, who's been with the ABI group for so many years and continues to be there, cementing relationships and helping wherever & with whatever he can.

Special Projects – NEWTAG Report

Participants of the NEWTAG / DPI Mulloway tagging program have been hard at work. A total of 331 fish were tagged in the last 12 months with Luke Riley managing to tag an impressive 12 fish ranging from 59 cm to 121 cm. Ross Billing has also contributed 35 fish ranging from 44 cm to 88 cm in the Hawkesbury region taking out the top tagger spot.



Several fish recorded over this period exceeded 100cm (check out the bar graph), including three that were a massive 140 cm! All three of these fish were tagged by gun angler Lachie Monro from the Coffs Harbour region.

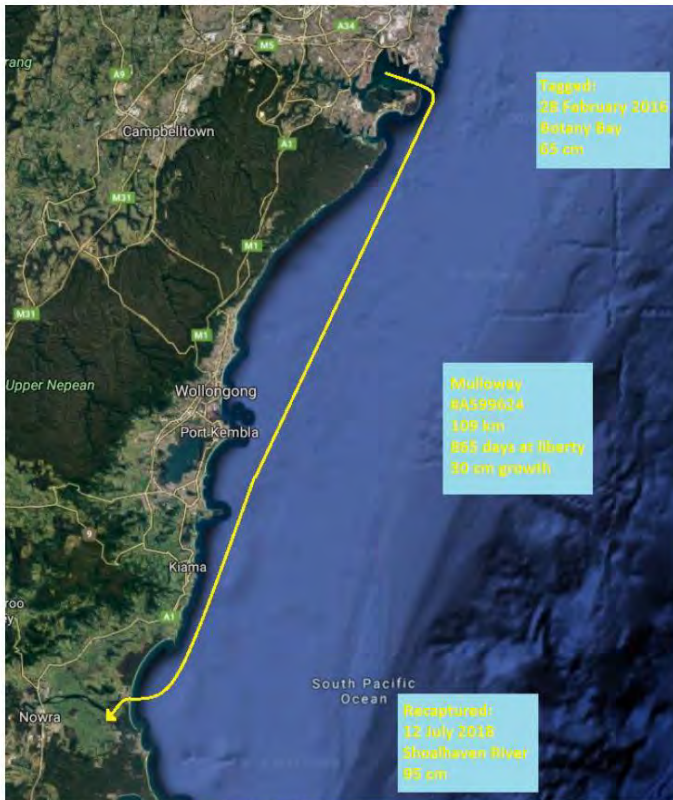


One notable capture from the Mulloway tagged was that made by six year old Noah Kelly. Noah was able to catch his first Mulloway with his father fishing out of Newcastle. Although the fish is almost bigger than him, he toughed it out to land a 92 cm estimated 7 kg Mulloway. When given the choice to keep his catch, Noah decided to tag and release the fish. After watching the fish swim off, he had a smile that lasted for days.



It's great to also see numerous recaptures right along the coast, with 47 recaptures recorded in the past 12 months. Fifteen of these fish travelled less than one nautical mile from their release site while two of these fish were recaptured by the anglers that originally tagged them, both in Newcastle! Scott McIntyre was able to recapture a 76cm fish four days after originally tagging it and David Birt's 68cm Mulloway was at liberty for 21 days before he re-caught it - a testament to Scott and David's excellent post-capture handling and release skills. David Birt was also lucky enough to recapture another tagged Mulloway during this period, this time tagged by his son. Chad Kelly was also able to provide some valuable data by recapturing two tagged Mulloway that appeared to have stayed in the Hunter River system during their time at liberty.

Mick Carrambine recaptured a Mulloway originally tagged by Ivan Maric in February 2016 in Botany Bay. Time at liberty was 865 days and the fish was 30 cm larger after heading south 109 km to the Shoalhaven River. This fish represents the longest distance travelled by a Mulloway in this period. Dan Conquest recaptured a Mulloway originally tagged in December 2015 by Chris Cleaver. The fish was recaptured 55 km north in the Hawkesbury River and is the longest time recorded at liberty at 1155 days. Over this time the fish had grown from 60 cm to an impressive 108 cm.



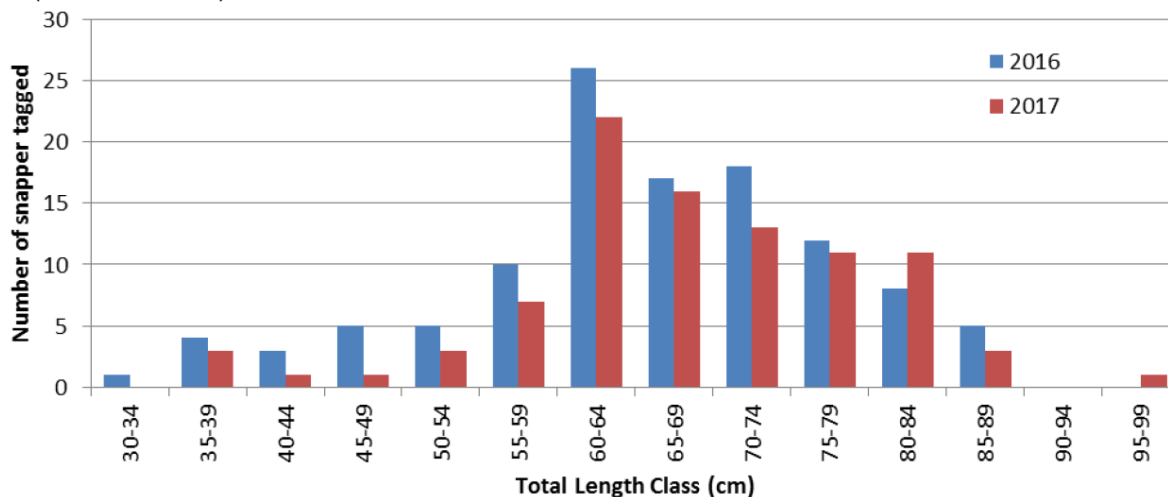

Snapper Tagging In NSW

Snapper (*Chrysophrys auratus*) are one of NSW's most popular recreational target species and the Dave Irvine Memorial Snapper Classic is the most popular snapper-only tournament in the state each year. As a catch-and-release tournament featuring many of NSW's top snapper anglers, the DIMSC represents an unprecedented opportunity to tag and release a large number of fish in a relatively small area over a small time period each year. With the support of the organisers, this citizen science initiative carried by the NSW Research Angler Program, NEWTAG and ANSA NSW has tagged fish at the DIMSC for the past two events (2016 & 2017).



The involvement of 55 anglers participating in the 2016 and 2017 editions of the DIMSC has resulted in 206 fish tagged overall (114 in 2016 and 92 last year). As can be seen in the above figure, the sizes of fish tagged have been very similar over the two years. A minimum suggested size for tagging of 60 cm has been recommended and as a result, the average size of fish tagged has been a quality 65 cm! This minimum size has been recommended as research has shown that larger snapper are more likely to move when compared to more residential nature of smaller size classes. Some very impressive fish have been tagged with almost 30 fish of more than 80 cm in length released with a tag in the past 2 years. With the advent of many extremely effective artificial lures used when targeting snapper, the incidences of mouth-hooking are high and result in fish being released in the best possible condition.

Surprisingly, just three tagged fish have been subsequently recaptured, all from the 2016 comp, none of which moved significant distances despite being at liberty for up to 473 days. Tag-recapture data is primarily used to infer migration patterns and the growth of fish in the wild. By accurately recording the location where a fish is tagged and its length, researchers have a prior history of an individual fish should that tagged fish be subsequently recaptured and reported. As well as providing movement and growth information, tag-recapture data can also be beneficial in providing an improved understanding of stock structure, the connectivity of fish populations and identifying spawning aggregations. This information in turn maybe used to inform management strategies to ensure the future sustainability of the stock.

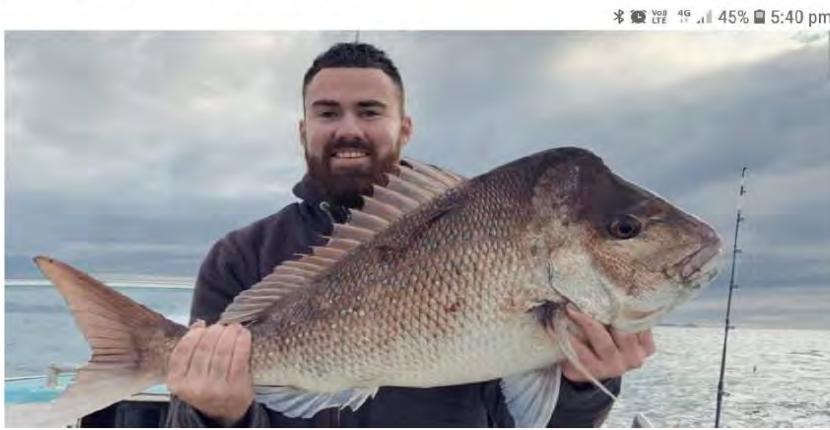


Some more great results for NEWTAG:

Citizen science projects like NEWTAG show that correct handling techniques and a willingness to release these big snapper to live another day is a good thing. During some initial trials in checking the viability of tagging snapper in NSW back in 2015/16 has seen a handful of snapper tagged that are starting to show up in recaptures. 2 fish tagged in southern Sydney have been recaptured years later.

A 60cm fish tagged on 3/10/15 was recaptured at Camden Haven on 15/1/19 at 64cm. 1200 days at liberty and travelled 380km.

The next fish was tagged on 9/4/16 at 68cm was recaptured at Point Plomer on 15/6/19 at 75.5cm. It had travelled 370km.



On the morning of the 6th of August 2017 Alan McNamara caught and released a 55cm snapper (49cm fork) as part of the Dave Irvine Memorial Snapper Classic in Coffs Harbour. The fish (as seen below) went on to be recaptured on the 28th of October 2018 by gun local angler Adrian Gray. Adrian done a good job noticing the tag as it had significant growth on it. The fish had grown 14cm (55cm to 69cm) in 448 days at large. The fish had stayed within the local area, travelling an estimated 3 nautical miles between reefs.
