Thanks to the many who gave their time and talents. The Lunch for Their Lunch held in Bolton Abbey Village Hall last Sunday was a huge success, and raised £1,187.58 towards the total needed to feed the school children at Sawali School in Malawi for a second year. The money raised means that we now have sufficient to feed 540 of the 711 children enrolled at the school with a daily meal of nutritious maize porridge. Those who came were entertained by some flamboyant African clothing and by stories from Gill Hunter who is about to make her sixtysecond visit to Malawi from her home in Addingham. Heartfelt thanks to all who supported the event, including friends from Sacred Heart in Ilkley. The next fundraiser is a community singing workshop to be held at the Priory on Saturday 23 September.
