ACTIVITIES



Give students one copy of Metro per pair.

Students look for pictures based on your instructions. Please make sure that all students have think time: ask students to share with their partners first (quietly) and then with the class. That way, everybody can talk!

1. "Please find something that costs money." Wait, then ask "What is it?" and "How much is it?"
2. "Please find something you can eat." Wait, then ask "What is it called?" and "What do you need to make it?"
3. "Please find a piece of clothing." Wait, then ask "What is it?" and "What colour is it?"
4. "Please find a person who is..."
 - working
 - smiling
 - standing
 - sitting" – Wait, then ask "What is his/her name? What is his/her job?"
5. "Please find a place outside Canada." Wait, then ask "What is the name of this place?", "Where is it?" and "Can you show it on the map?" (*there is a map in every classroom!*)
6. "Please find something beautiful." Wait, then ask "What is it? and "Why do you like it?"
7. Feel free to add your own, simple questions – if you find something related to this unit's topic, for example, that's great!

(Possible extension: If your students are very high level or very familiar with this exercise, make them decide what to look for and ask follow-up questions!)
