

Acer macrophyllum

Canyon Maple

LARGE TREE - deciduous

30 - 100' high, 20'+ spread.

Ascending branches, rounded crown.

Large palmate leaves (to 12" wide). Burgundy color when first appear then give brilliant fall color.

Flowers in long drooping clusters - April to May.

Seedpods remain on tree in winter.

Native habitat: riparian; stream banks and canyons below 5000'
- San Diego County to British Columbia.

Full sun to part shade.

Frost resistant.

Adaptable to soil type but prefers well-drained soil.

Needs water - 4 x / month.

Can be grown near lawns or as part of a shade tree and shrub border.
Seeds provide food for wildlife and tree provides shade for wildlife.
