LANDFALL FOUNDATION AWARDS 74 GRANTS TOTALING \$363,100

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE:

Wilmington, NC- On November 2, 2017 the Landfall Foundation board presented checks to 74 Wilmington area non-profit organizations totaling \$363,100. This year's distribution brings a total of over \$4.1 million dollars donated to local non-profits and schools since the foundation's inception twenty-two years ago. This amount does not include approximately \$15,000 contributed toward scholarships to Landfall employees also given by the Landfall Foundation.

The number of requests for grants has increased as government entities and some other charitable entities have cut funding for non-profits. In addition to the Spring Gala and regular contributions by Landfall residents, the foundation has continued with its successful fundraisers to help meet those needs. Events this year in order of impact are the August Art Show, the December Holiday Marketplace, and the October Golf Tournament. The popular Legends of Tennis event was cancelled due to construction at the Dye Sports Center, but will return in 2018.

Through the generosity of Landfall Foundation supporters, the foundation has provided meaningful assistance to non-profit organizations in the categories of arts, education, and health and welfare since its founding. Co-chairs for the 2017 Grants Committee are Landfall residents Lilliam Kingsbury and Ginger Wilson.
