At In-Sight we believe in art education for everyone. The In-Sight Photography Project was founded in 1992 by Bill Ledger and John Willis as a free summer photography class for youth. Bill and John found themselves distracted by the large number of teenagers hanging around downtown Brattleboro with no place to go and little to do. Through decades of community support, this one-time class has grown over the past 28 years into year round programming that serves hundreds of youth annually. Courses in photography and related visual arts are taught at the introductory, intermediate and advanced levels for students ages 11 to 21. While In-Sight itself has gone through tremendous growth, our mission has stayed the same: teach young people to voice their perspectives, develop respect for others, and contribute to their community through photography, regardless of financial barriers.

PARTNERSHIPS

In-Sight Photography Project is connected to our Southern Vermont Community through partnerships with other organizations and neighborhood initiatives.

WESTGATE COMMUNITY HOUSING

During neighborhood walks students learned to use digital point and shoot cameras to take photos of what they call their community. Paired with a series of virtual field trips and classroom activities, students felt comfortable to talk about the stories photographs tell them. Images were created to hang on the walls of their community center and take home to their families.

ASK THE RIVER

In July, In-Sight partnered with the Vermont community-wide art project, Ask The River. Students had the opportunity to workshop with artists Evie Lovett, Elizabeth Billings and Andrea Wasserman to create silk, cyanotype banners inspired by the connection and celebration of the Connecticut River landscape.

BRATTLEBORO LITERARY FESTIVAL & BROOKS MEMORIAL LIBRARY

In-Sight teamed up with the Brattleboro Literary Festival and Brooks Memorial Library to take large format portraits of the readers of Brattleboro. Students learned how to make portraits with 4x5 cameras at the library and conducted interviews with their subjects about their relationship to reading. The photographs were displayed at the Tiny Gallery and during the Literary Festival.





JUST THE BEGINNING

With a strong history of partnering and collaborating with other organizations, we now have our own inviting space to share with our community and host events. By operating in a facility with ample meeting space, In-Sight hosts public educational presentations, workshops, and artist talks for the general public.

We have hosted ten exhibitions in our gallery space, including student, staff, volunteer and board member work. Aside from our regular office hours, our gallery space is a part of Brattleboro's monthly gallery walk. In the summer, our artist talks and movie nights invite the public into In-Sight's facility. Through these events new relationships are developed and space for artistic community dialogue is created.
