This past fiscal year, we have forged collaborations and support from partners in several key initiatives. Those include:


- Working to make Montgomery County a vaccine leader and immunology capital of the world;

FISCAL YEAR 2020

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The pandemic brought new challenges and necessitated additional support for Montgomery businesses through new COVID-19 programs, which are detailed on page 12. At the same time, MCEDC stayed focused on our core mission of attraction, retention and facilitating economic growth.

A BRIGHT SPOT DURING THE PANDEMIC

Montgomery County is home to increasing numbers of life science companies working to develop life-saving treatments, tests and vaccines, with more biotech companies moving or expanding here during the pandemic. Between March and early July 2020, over \$3 Billion in public and private funding flowed into county companies including vaccine maker Novavax and vaccine manufacturer **Emergent BioSolutions** as they work tirelessly on a COVID-19 vaccine.

\$400K IN PRIVATE SECTOR FUNDRAISING

On the fundraising front, MCEDC advanced its efforts. raising almost \$400,000 to support COVID-19 related programs in addition to studies designed to further economic development. The contributions helped underwrite a wide diversity of programs including the Reach Advisors Study to propel our county's economic growth trajectory, a talent pipeline study, the 3R Initiative to aid struggling restaurants and retail, and the Westat economic recovery sustainability study.

WET LABS AND TECH TRANSFER

MCEDC worked with Facility Logix on a biotech accelerator study. MCEDC also worked with a building owner who converted 2,940 SF of commercial office space to wet lab.

As part of the BioLab Pilot Project, MCEDC engaged with 13 early-stage companies for wet lab expansion. MCEDC approved small wet lab construction awards for APCBio Innovations and BioInnovatise, and anticipates approving four more applications in FY21.

MCEDC cultivated stronger relationship with federal labs, building a robust database of county businesses ideal for federal lab tech transfer engagement, assisting partners with federal funding applications. and planning for future events involving post-docs and outreach to federal tech transfer companies.

MARKETING & OUTREACH SUPPORT FOR BUSINESS

MCEDC saw a 77% increase in our website visits in the second half of FY20, reaching over 35,000 users, likely a result of area businesses looking for pandemic resources. Timely newsletters and social media posts also shared essential COVID-19 business news, as well as general business news and good news stories.

Provided key materials, like press releases, social and grant FAQs, in Spanish.

SUPPORTING BUSINESSES & INCREASING CONNECTIONS

In FY20, MCEDC worked on major attraction and expansion projects with companies that created 1,512 jobs, retained 842 jobs, and secured over 450,000 SF of new commercial lease space.

We supported business attractions, relocations, and retentions. In addition, the MCEDC team made 4.830 connections with business assistance on a range of issues from permitting to answering COVID-19 reopening and funding questions. Those connections tripled from the first half of FY20 (1,215) to 3.615 in the second half of the year. Many of these businesses were seeking information on emergency aid and expert advice during the pandemic.

SELECT FY20 MCEDC PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

ABCD & Company LLC, a full-service marketing and virtual events firm, established its operations in Montgomery County; MCEDC assisted with county incentives.

Ana G. Méndez University signed a lease in the Inventa Towers at One Discovery Place. MCEDC assisted with consolidation of facilities and shared real estate information and connections.

Aurinia Pharmaceuticals Inc., a Canada-based, late-stage clinical biopharma, established its U.S. commercial operations center in Rockville, MCEDC coordinated multiple government agencies and funding streams.

Autolus, a biopharma, signed a long-term, full building lease to develop and construct an 85,000 SF facility in the Shady Grove Life Sciences Center in Rockville. Autolus received incentives through a state/county partnership and is expected to fill 170 full time jobs over three years.

BDO, a tax, assurance and financial advisory firm, relocated its McLean, Virginia, office to Montgomery County, bringing 80 employees.

GlaxoSmithKline (GSK), a leading global healthcare company, worked with MCEDC during the permitting process for its Biopharma facility, resulting in 400 retained employees, 100 new employees, a capital expenditure of \$139 million and 127,689 SF of space in Rockville.

RADA Technologies, a defense and aerospace industry company, chose Germantown as its U.S. HQ for R&D and manufacturing. A state/county partnership including multiple funding and tax credit programs. MCEDC organized meetings with Montgomery College to ensure a robust workforce pipeline source and facilitated permitting requirements.

Truebill, a financial tech company, relocated its corporate HQ to Silver Spring from the San Francisco Bay area, receiving economic development funding. The company also raised \$17 million in private capital in 2020.

ASSISTING THE BUSINESS COMMUNITY IN FY20

COVID-19 RESPONSE

SHARED TIMELY BUSINESS ADVICE & UPDATES

Shared updates on national, state and local support, including Montgomery County's \$25 million emergency grant program for small businesses, \$10 million for area hospitals, and \$14 million to reimburse small businesses for certain reopening costs.

DEVELOPED & ADMINISTERED INNOVATIVE PROGRAMS LIKE THE LOCAL PRODUCTION FUND

Offered direct assistance to local makers to manufacture PPE and other COVID-related needs. **25 local recipients received awards totaling \$200,000**, with 73% of the funding awarded to companies led by women or minority entrepreneurs.

PARTNERED WITH VISIT MONTGOMERY, LOCAL RESTAURANTS & OUR FARM COMMUNITY

Informed the community about food and beverage delivery and contactless curbside options through the MCEDC website, social media posts, digital advertising and PSAs.

ADMINISTERED THE TELEWORK ASSISTANCE FUND

Helped local businesses keep operations going during this pandemic. Over \$1,041,000 was distributed to 547 businesses across the county. A total of 57% of approved grants were awarded to women or minority-owned companies.

COLLABORATED WITH A RESEARCH FIRM & THE MARYLAND NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ALLIANCE (MNCREDA) ON A LONGITUDINAL STUDY

Began to assess the impact of COVID-19 and identified resources to help businesses achieve rapid economic recovery across six suburban Maryland counties. This is a long-range multi-year study.

CREATED A PUBLIC-PRIVATE 3R (REOPEN, RELAUNCH & REIMAGINE) INITIATIVE

Supported by public and private funding from Montgomery County and PEPCO, the program includes a retail recovery guide, a countywide e-commerce marketplace, business grants and additional targeted investments in selected commercial corridors.

PARTNERSHIPS

MCEDC forged successful partnerships with multiple groups, including investing \$240,000 in entrepreneur programs through the Maryland Women's Business Center, the Bethesda Green Innovation Lab, the Montgomery County Food Council's MoCo Made initiative, CONNECTpreneur, and the Maryland Tech Council's Venture Mentoring Service.

MARYLAND TECH COUNCIL

Partner on the Venture Mentoring Service, a leading team mentoring service for tech, cyber and life science start-ups in Maryland.

BETHESDA GREEN INNOVATION LABS

The Innovation Lab supports entrepreneurs who are building for-profit business models around sustainable solutions to tackle environmental and social challenges.

MONTGOMERY COUNTY CHAMBER OF COMMERCE

Works with Montgomery County Chamber of Commerce (MCCC) to monitor legislative activity and support the Veterans Institute for Procurement Underwriting.

MARYLAND WOMEN'S **BUSINESS CENTER**

Supports MWBC to provide business counseling/development assistance to Montgomery County small and early-stage, womenowned businesses and others.

MONTGOMERY CAN CODE

Partnership with Montgomery County Public Schools, Montgomery College and Apple Corporation to support a Montgomery Can Code summer camp program, which more than doubled in size from summer of 2019 to 2020 (over 750 students).

BIOHEALTH INNOVATION (BHI)

MCEDC collaborates on entrepreneurship activities with BHI, a regional partner that accelerates and facilitates tech transfer and commercialization of research in federal labs, universities and biohealth companies in the National Capital Region.

CONNECTPRENEUR

The CONNECTpreneur forum attracts hundreds of founders, investors and business leaders across the Mid-Atlantic region for networking, speakers and a showcase of early stage companies.

MONTGOMERY COUNTY FOOD **COUNCIL: MOCO FOOD & BEVERAGE GUIDE**

MCEDC partnered with the Montgomery County Food Council on the annual food and beverage guide, filled with 70 MoCo Made food and beverage products. The collaboration promotes local retailers, farms, breweries and farmers markets in the area, with MCEDC creating and producing the food guide for the three consecutive year.

ADVENTIST HEALTHCARE AND ONE ACRE FARM

Collaborated with the health care leader and a local farm on a partnership. From June-November 2019, One Acre Farm brought a farmer's market to the hospital, allowing staff to purchase fresh veggies directly on a sliding pay scale according to employee salaries. MCEDC helped promote the partnership, and created a web page, social outreach and coasters.
