Beginning in July, the Gateway Film Center, at 1550 N. High St., will screen the full slate of movies featuring the exploits of Agent 007.

In between will be Bond films featuring George Lazenby, Roger Moore, Timothy Dalton, Pierce Brosnan and even a 1967 non-canon movie with David Niven as Bond.

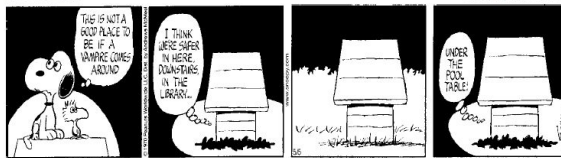
Davis blends folk, rock 'n' roll and vintage soul.

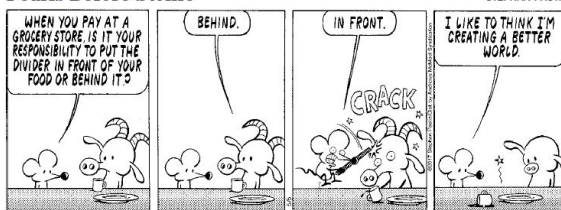

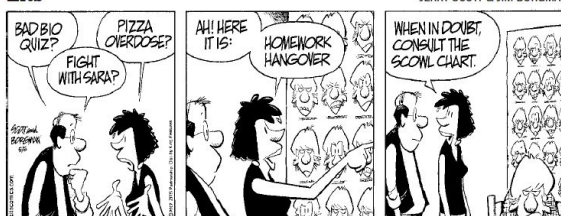
