SHEEP PEN AREA & LIVESTOCK BARN - PUBLIC ACCESS

For the comfort of our exhibitors and in the interests of safety, stewards will use their best endeavours to prevent the public from accessing the sheep pen area and livestock barn while judging is taking place.

LIVESTOCK COMPETITIONS - PRIZE MONEY ALLOCATION

All prize winners will be presented with a **prize voucher** by the ring steward. This can either be cashed on the day at the Ticket Box Office located at the main entrance to the Showground or sent to the Show Secretary after the Show who will issue a cheque in due course. The vouchers are only valid until the end of August 2024.

STOCKMAN'S CATERING

A stockman's supper will be available to purchase for competitors arriving the night prior to the Show provided by All Time Catering. A stockman's breakfast, tea and coffee will also be available to purchase from the All Time Catering unit on Sunday, 14th July.

DEPARTING THE SHOW

* Please note * No stock vehicles will be allowed onto the main showground between 08h00 and until the Grand Parade of Livestock in Main Ring has finished and all stock has been returned to stalls. The Grand Parade will take place at 4.00pm. Stock vehicles will then be permitted on to the showground under the control of the Chief Livestock Steward and ground stewards. It is imperative that all exhibitors abide by the instructions of the show stewards to ensure the safety of all competitors, visitors and livestock, your co-operation in this matter is appreciated.

TICKET ALLOCATION

Stockman's Tickets. Everyone will require a ticket for admittance to the showground or pay on the day. Livestock exhibitors (cattle and sheep) will be issued with two Stockman's tickets for up to the first two animals entered, thereafter additional tickets will be issued at the rate of one per two additional animals entered. The option to purchase additional tickets, at a discounted rate, is available on entry forms.

Livestock parking:

Cattle Exhibitors - All stock vehicles delivering cattle will require a BLUE Livestock Delivery Vehicle pass for entry to the showground via the trade/livestock entrance in Barhatch Road. Sheep, Goat & Pig Exhibitors – All stock vehicles delivering sheep, goats and pigs will require a PURPLE Livestock Delivery Vehicle pass for entry to the showground via the small livestock entrance in Bookhurst Road. (Entry strictly before 8am, entrance only, exit via the BLUE Barhatch Road entrance/exit).

All livestock exhibitors will be issued **two Livestock Delivery Vehicle passes**. Additional Livestock Delivery Vehicle passes may be purchased at £5 per pass. Please state the number of additional Livestock Delivery Vehicle passes you require on your entry form (Please note that parking for cars is available on site in the Main Car Park - free of charge).

PHOTOGRAPHY

On occasions we may use photographs of competitors and their livestock for publicity and promotion of the Festival on our website and on Festival literature. If you **DO NOT** wish the Society to use photographs of yourself you must inform the Show Secretary in writing 10 days prior to the Festival.

Health & Safety Policy Statement

Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974

This is the Health and Safety Policy Statement of: - The Cranleigh Farming & Food Festival 2025

The Cranleigh and South Eastern Agricultural Society recognise and accept their responsibility to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, the health and safety of employees, volunteers, contractors, visitors and members of the public during the Cranleigh Farming & Food Festival 2025.

It is the Society's aim to ensure health and safety aspects are implemented by:

- Defining health and safety responsibilities of key personnel and stewards.
- Appointing a Safety Officer and obtaining competent health and safety advice where necessary to ensure the safe running of the Festival.

- Including Health and Safety in planning meetings.
- Undertaking risk assessments on the show's arrangements and activities.
- Issuing appropriate health and safety information and advice to all parties.
- Using competent contractors.
- Ensuring trade stands and exhibitors do not put themselves or others at risk.
- Ensuring Emergency procedures are in place for foreseeable emergencies.
- Providing arrangements for First Aid and Accident Reporting.
- Undertaking show health and safety inspections.
- Training show officials in the health and safety arrangements.
- Providing suitable welfare facilities, and
- Reviewing and revising this policy as necessary at regular intervals.

Refer to the show's Risk Assessments and Event Management Plan for further detail on the arrangements for health and safety.

HAND WASHING

Please remember farm animals may have germs that can cause serious infections; please ensure that your children (and your grown-ups) do not touch faces or put fingers in mouths when they have been near animals. After touching anything (animals, gates, fences etc.) wash hands thoroughly with soap and water and wash your hands again before eating or drinking. Some simple precautions:

- Wash hands thoroughly after touching animals or enclosures, fences, gates.
 - Wash hands thoroughly before eating, drinking or smoking
 - Do not eat or drink in animal areas Hand-washing facilities are located in the toilet areas and outside the livestock marquees.

FIRST AID

If you need any first aid treatment during the Festival, please make your way to the first aid point which is located on the Main Showground. If you need urgent assistance, please request help from a steward.

LOST CHILDREN If you become separated from your child / children please request help from a steward.

DOGS

Dogs are very welcome at the show. Please always keep your dog under control and on a lead. Please do not take dogs into the cattle lines. Please pick up after your dog. Dog waste bins are provided on the Showground.

General Regulations

The Cranleigh and South Eastern Agricultural Society has taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present at the Festival. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid or prevent accidents occurring and must act upon the instructions of officials and stewards.

Exhibitors must comply with the current DEFRA rules and regulations on Animal Gatherings and Movements in force at the time of the Festival. Full details are available on the DEFRA web site or local Animal Health Office. Cattle exhibitors must also comply with current BCMS requirements. Sheep exhibitors must also comply with current PSGHS requirements. BIOSECURITY - all livestock vehicles must arrive having been cleaned and disinfected before leaving home. Special attention should be given to vehicle wheel arches and footwells. Please ensure that before leaving the showground vehicles are clean, that footwear is clean and disinfected and that all contaminated clothing is changed (or safely disposed of if disposable). Please remember to "be seen to be clean".

SHOWGROUND HOLDING NUMBER - 40/067/8000

- 1. NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED ON THE DAY OF THE FESTIVAL, other than as stated in the Schedule.
- 2. Any animal shown must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor.
- 3. All animals must be free of Disease.
- 4. All livestock shall be attended to by some persons on behalf of the exhibitor to give such information as the Judge or Steward may require and in default of such attendance, the exhibitor shall be rendered ineligible to receive the prize which might otherwise have been awarded. No stock shall be marked until after the decision of the Judges. All exhibitors must send proper and adequate food and bedding for the animals. All stockmen and attendants must conform to the directions of the Stewards.
- 5. STRAW Cattle, sheep and pigs will be provided with covered accommodation and straw will be provided.
- 6. STALLS Exhibitors should reserve sufficient stalls or pens for the number of animals they intend to bring to the Show.
- 7. WITHDRAWING ENTRY In the event of any competitor withdrawing his entry fees will not be returned.
- 8. ARRIVAL / DEPATURE Stock may arrive at the Showground during the afternoon prior to Festival Day or no later than 7.45am on the day. All stock vehicles must be off the Showground and either parked in the cattle lorry area or have left the site by 8.00am.
- 10. NO ANIMALS COMPETING FOR PRIZES OFFERED SHALL BE REMOVED UNTIL AFTER THE MAIN LIVESTOCK PARADE IN WHICH ALL PRIZE WINNING ANIMALS MUST TAKE PART. IN THE INTERESTS OF SAFETY, NO STOCK VEHICLES WILL BE PERMITTED ON THE SHOWGROUND UNTIL ALL ANIMALS HAVE BEEN RETURNED TO STALLS, AFTER THE PARADE. STOCK VEHICLES WILL THEN BE PERMITTED ON TO THE SHOWGROUND UNDER THE CONTROL OF THE CHIEF LIVESTOCK STEWARD AND GROUND STEWARDS. ALL EXHIBITORS MUST ABIDE BY THE STEWARDS INSTRUCTIONS TO ENSURE THE SAFETY OF ALL.

- 11. JUDGES the Society reserves the right to substitute Judges for those named or to make additional appointments. A judge's decision shall be final.
- 12. OBJECTIONS/DISPUTES Any competitor intending to object to any exhibit must notify the same in writing to the Secretary before the Grand Cattle Parade has commenced on the day of the Festival and at the same time leave a deposit of £10.00, which will be returned if the objection is sustained. However, if, in the opinion of the objections committee, the objection is unreasonable, the deposit is forfeited.
- 13. Classes will be cancelled or amalgamated if there are not sufficient entries. In the event of any class being cancelled, the entry fees will be returned.
- 14. DOGS All dogs must be on leads at all times.
- 15. DISCLAIMER Neither the Society, nor any of its officers or servants, shall be in any way responsible or accountable for anything that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatever) to exhibitors or their servants or agents, or to any exhibit, or any vehicle conveying any exhibit, or any crate, package, show case or other article or thing containing or relating to any exhibit, or any other property brought on to the Showground, or for anything else in connection with, or arising out of, or attributable to, the Society's Show.

EACH EXHIBITOR SHALL BE SOLELY RESPONSIBLE for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to or occasioned by, or arising from any animal or article exhibited by him, and for its description as given in the catalogue, and shall indemnify the Society against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto. Exhibitors shall be responsible for the behaviour of the servants or agents and for the consequences of any misconduct of such servants or agents. Exhibitors should be satisfied in all cases that the correct and appropriate restraining method and equipment is provided for use by animal handlers. Exhibitors must ensure that all stock handlers are adequately trained.

16. VETERINARY EMERGENCY TREATMENT - it is a condition of entry that the Society's Veterinary Officers may on their own authority give to any animals such emergency treatment as they may consider appropriate in

the event that the owner or his representative cannot immediately be found.

- 17. In the event of any animal dying or being destroyed on the Showground, the owner/exhibitor is responsible for the cost of disposal and agrees to indemnify the Society in respect of that cost.
- 18. DATA PROTECTION GDPR All data given upon entry into classes at the Cranleigh Show may be provided to Breed Societies etc for the checking of eligibility and publication of results. Results will be published online. Details may also be provided to the press and Breed Societies for publication. Information about exhibitors may be forwarded to the appropriate regulatory authority, as well as the Society's veterinary advisers. By making an entry to a class at the Show you are providing consent for the storage and disclosure of information in this way.
- 19. ENTRY REJECTION The Show or Livestock Secretary, supported by the Council, reserves the right to reject or cancel the entry or entries made by any person if they shall deem fit to do so. No reason has to be provided.
- 20. POSTPONEMENT/CANCELLATION OR ABANDONMENT Exhibitors shall not have any claim again the Society or any member of the Society in respect of any loss or damage whatsoever consequent upon the festival or any part of it failing to be held or having to be abandoned (for whatever reason e.g. extreme weather, flooding, disease outbreaks, security alerts, etc). No entry monies will be repaid, and the Cranleigh & South Eastern Agricultural Society will have no liability for expenses, consequential loss or damage suffered by exhibitors or their representatives as a result of this action.
- 21. ENTRY TICKETS please bring proof of entry to the gate, your exhibitor packs will need to be collected from the Livestock Secretary
- 22. EXHIBITOR'S TICKETS In case of the transfer or improper use of a ticket it will be immediately cancelled, and the full price of admission charged. Exhibitors will be expected to pay the full price for admission to the Festival if tickets are lost, stolen or not presented at the gate for whatever reason. No refunds will be issued.

- 23. EXHIBITOR BEHAVIOUR Respectful language and attitude will be expected at all times towards volunteer stewards, judges and other competitors
- 24. ADVERTISING AND SPONSORSHIP No person shall be allowed to fix any placard in the Showground without the written permission of the Show Secretary and no exhibitor shall be allowed to distribute flyers anywhere in the Showground. Any exhibitor who would like to advertise should speak to the Show Secretary regarding sponsorship at the Festival which would provide the exhibitor with advertising opportunities.

 25. INSURANCE All exhibitors should ensure they have adequate public
- 26. AMENDMENTS The Society reserves the right to review and amend their rules and regulations prior to the Festival. Any amendments will be listed on the Society website www.cranleighshow.co.uk.

CATTLE REGULATIONS

SHOWGROUND HOLDING NUMBER 40/067/8000 Important information for Exhibitors: -

Cattle should be on the show ground not later than 7.45am on Sunday, 3rd August and must remain until 5.00pm on festival day or until the Chief Livestock Steward allows you to exit. Exhibitors leaving before this time may forfeit any prize money won. All prize winners are expected to take part in the cattle parade.

Entry and stalling: Exhibitors should reserve stalls for the number of animals they intend to bring to the show.

Accommodation: Cattle are housed in covered accommodation.

Forage: Exhibitors are asked to make their own arrangements for feeding stuffs. Straw will be provided in the cattle barn.

- 1. All movements of cattle to and from the show must be recorded separately by the exhibitor in the cattle passport and be reported to the BCMS within 3 days. The Show will also record movements on and off the showground. All cattle should be accompanied by their passports or a certificate of registration. If you have a single page passport (CPP52) and require continuation sheets, they can be downloaded from the RPA website (https://www.gov.uk/government/organisations/rural-payments-agency). An officer of the Society will check all cattle documentation at the festival. The Society has to hold accurate records of all cattle/calves attending the show and movement dates.
- 2. TB Pre-Movement Testing will be necessary for cattle from herds with a routine TB testing interval of 1 year. Please indicate this on your entry form. Please check the latest information on the DEFRA web site, or check the Parish Testing Interval of your holding by entering your CPH number on the AHVLA website at: http://animalhealth.defra.gov.uk/about/tti/asp. A copy of any clear pre-movement TB test certificate should accompany each animal to the festival.

- 3. Cattle must originate from premises which are not under DEFRA restrictions for tuberculosis or brucellosis. They must have been the bona fide property of the exhibitor on his holding at least two calendar months prior to the show.
- 4. Animals which calve, or show evidence of calving, whilst at the showground must be placed in the approved isolation accommodation pending their removal from the showground.
- 5. Where an animal calves at full term and the owner arranges for a blood sample and a vaginal swab to be taken and examined at an approved laboratory, and the Rose Bengal Plate Test and microscopical examination of a smear made from the vaginal swab are negative, the animal may return to the show lines at the discretion of the Show Secretary.
- 6. Where an animal calves prematurely, or aborts, the festival DVM must be informed immediately. The animal must be placed in isolation in the approved accommodation and the full range of samples (including if at all possible a placental smear) should be taken. The animal will not be allowed to take further part in the show.
- 7. All other bovine animals from the same registered premises will not be allowed to compete further in the Show until negative results from certain tests carried out by a Veterinary Investigation Centre (RBPT and microscopical examination of a vaginal smear from the aborted animal) have been received. They can be returned home with the suspect animal after 7 days.
- 8. Bulls over 10 months of age should be rung. All bull handlers must be aged 18 years and over. All young handlers under the age of 14 years must be closely supervised at all times.
- 9. Cattle must be tied up, and exhibitors shall provide their own ties.
- 10. Any artificial contrivance or device found on or proved to have been used on an animal at any time whilst that animal is in the Showground, either for preventing the flow of milk or for any other improper purpose will disqualify that animal from the competition and the instigator or the owner of the said animal may be prohibited from entering Stock in any future competition

- as the Council may see fit. The Society reserves the right to have all animals inspected by the Hon. Veterinary Officers, either prior to, during, or after judging.
- 11. Only the champion of each breed will be eligible to compete for the supreme championship. The reserve of the breed of the chosen champion will be eligible to compete for the reserve supreme championship.
- 12. Cattle may automatically transfer from In-Calf to In-Milk classes and vice versa.
- 13. No Warbled cattle will be allowed into the show without a completed declaration of treatment (form C) and this form can be obtained from the Local Authority or Defra.
- 14. Cattle belonging to herds with CheCS-accredited status must be accompanied by a Herd Certificate of Status, a copy of which should accompany the entry form. Members must ensure that they and their cattle comply with the Scheme rules concerning attendance at shows. For IBR, BVD and leptospirosis, introducing cattle back into an accredited herd after their attendance at a nonaccredited show, involves isolating them from other cattle on the farm for 28 days prior to testing them for the appropriate disease(s). For Johne's disease, the risk of infection at a show is minimal and accredited cattle can be re-introduced to the main herd as long as they have been at the show for no more than 7 days and have not had direct contact with other cattle, particularly with their dung or soiled bedding.
- 15. Substitutions In the interests of competition, substitution of animals in the Cattle Section will be allowed up to 16:00pm the Friday before the festival, provided the animal is eligible for the class requirements. This need not be the class originally entered.

SHEEP REGULATIONS

Accommodation:

Sheep will be provided with covered accommodation.

Movements of sheep to and from shows must be reported to the DEFRA Animal Reporting and Movement Service (LIS) within 3 days of the relevant movement. An LIS1 form. Paper copies of the new LIS1 form can be printed (4 copies) from the LIS website at

Exhibitors using paper movement forms must complete both the form for the journey to the festival and the form for the return journey home afterwards as far as possible before setting out for the show, so that only details of journey time etc. need filling in on arrival at the showground. The Society has to hold accurate records of all sheep attending the show, and the Chief Sheep Steward will collect and check all LIS1 paper arrival and departure forms when you get to the show, send one copy of the arrival form to LIS and return the departure form to you for your journey home. Sheep movements can be reported electronically using the LIS website at www.LIS.co.uk. Exhibitors reporting electronically should also set up on-line movements before festival day for the journeys both to and from the festival, and must bring printed copies of both movement records to the festival. CSEAS can confirm these movements after the festival. Stewards will need evidence that movement records have been correctly set up for all sheep at the festival, even though no signatures are needed for the on-line system.

IMPORTANT: ALL SHEEP EXHIBITORS MUST ARRIVE AT THE SHOW WITH PAPER COPIES OF BOTH ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE FORMS ALREADY COMPLETED AS FULLY AS POSSIBLE.

- 1. Sheep must be in the possession of the exhibitor two months prior to the date of the festival.
- Exhibitors must comply with the current DEFRA rules and regulations on Animal Gatherings and Movements in force at the time of the show. Sheep exhibitors who belong to Premium

- Health Schemes must also comply with current PSGHS requirements.
- 3. SEPARATE PENNING WILL BE PROVIDED FOR MAEDI VISNA ACCREDITED SHEEP. All sheep from the SAC MV/CAE Accredited Flocks must be accompanied by a valid Accreditation Certificate with an expiry date after the date of Cranleigh show. A PHOTOCOPY OF THE CERTIFICATE MUST ACCOMPANY ENTRY FORM and the original MUST be produced on arrival at the show and prior to unloading.
- 4. In order to comply with the conditions of approval for the showing of scrapie monitored sheep, exhibitors must declare on the entry form their acceptance of the rules, which are: that all females of all breeds except Dorset Horn, Polled Dorset and Finnish Landrace are (a) non-pregnant (empty) (b) have not lambed within 30 days prior to the show (c) not subject to procedures which change the seasonal breeding pattern. All females of the Dorset Horn, Polled Dorset and Finnish Landrace breeds, and animals subject to procedures which change the seasonal breeding pattern must be accompanied by a signed declaration for each animal from flock masters or their agents which states that the animals listed on the entry form are (a) non pregnant (empty) (b) have not lambed in the previous 30 days.
- 5. All sheep to be shown according to their Breed Society Rules.
- 6. All pedigree sheep to be shown in halters and only non-accredited Champions to take part in the Livestock Parade, unless suitable transport (ie. a livestock trailer) is available to transport an accredited Champion.
- 7. Unless otherwise specified, all lambs to be under 12 months old on day of festival.

GOAT REGULATIONS AND CLASSIFICATION

Accommodation: Goats will NOT be provided with covered accommodation. The Society regrets that the use of gazebos if weather conditions are windy will not be permitted. The decision to allow the use of gazebos on the day will be taken by the Chief Livestock Steward. In adverse weather, or very hot weather, competitors may cover pens with well secured tarpaulin if necessary.

- Exhibitors must comply with the current DEFRA rules and regulations on Animal Gatherings and Movements in force at the time of the show. Sheep and goat exhibitors must also comply with current PSGHS requirements.
- 2. All exhibits must be ear tagged in accordance with DEFRA regulations.
- 3. All exhibits must be on the Showground by 7.45am on the day of the festival, except goats that have kidded who must be on the Showground by 5.00pm on the day before the festival. No goat may leave the Showground before the end of the Grand Parade of Livestock in the Main Ring, they then must abide by the instructions of the Chief Livestock Steward and Ground Stewards.
- 4. The registered number of any goat, initially as R.A.F. (registration applied for), must be submitted to the Show Secretary before that goat competes.
- 5. Goats may be of any age and must have borne a kid not less than 30 days before the day of the festival and be in milk.
- 6. No pregnant goats may be admitted to the showground.
- 7. Straw will be provided for sheep and goat exhibitors.
- 8. No late or incorrect entries will be accepted.
- 9. Substitutions will not be accepted.
- 10. Classes with only one entry will be cancelled of if possible amalgamated.
- 11. No entries to be accepted for goats bred or previously owned by the judge.

PIG REGULATIONS

 All movements of pigs must be recorded using the eAML2electronic movement system www.eaml2. org.uk. or alternatively on a movement/hauliers form from the eAML2 Bureau Service 0844 335 8400. Choose the show from a prepopulated selection. Print out a two page paper summary, one of which is to be retained during transportation of the pigs and one to hand to your steward on arrival at the show. Confirm movement by text or online within 3 days. The Society has to hold accurate records of all pigs attending and movement dates.

Challenge Cups

In addition to trophies and awards presented where indicated in the classes and competitions, the following cups will be awarded:

THE CLUB PERPETUAL CHALLENGE CUP presented by the Cranleigh and West Surrey Farming Club to the Exhibitor gaining the greatest number of points in all classes during the year, including classes at the Show.

THE CORONATION PERPETUAL CHALLENGE TROPHY presented by Mr and Mrs D Berdoe-Wilkinson to the Exhibitor gaining the greatest number of points in the Livestock Classes at the Show (excluding herd competitions on the farm).

THE NUTTING PERPETUAL CHALLENGE CUP presented by Captain A R S Nutting to the Exhibitor gaining the greatest number of points during the year in the on-farm classes.

THE FLUX TROPHY for the Best Trade Stand with a frontage of under 10 metres.

THE HAMBLEDON TROPHY for the Best Trade Stand with a frontage of 10 metres and over.

Basis of points calculation:

1st - 3 points, 2nd - 2 points, 3rd - 1 point. Championships do NOT count for points

Long Service Award:
