



Sunshine Circles are teacher-directed and structured time for playful, cooperative and nurturing activities. Conscious Discipline is a 30-year-old, research-based, socialemotional learning and classroom management program with a proven track record of sustainable results.

The three core components of Conscious Discipline are:

Safety: Learning self-regulation creates safety to enhance every person's ability to recognize and manage physiological and emotional upset.

Connection: Creating a compassionate School Family culture motivates adults' and children's willingness to engage in healthy relationships, help each other be successful and change perceptions about conflict.

Problem-solving: Changing our response to conflict and upgrading social-emotional skills boosts all of our ability to adapt to changing situations and cultivate resiliency.
