While Raising A Village (RAV) is currently operating in a hybrid model, candidates are expected to reside within commuting distance of our headquarters in Washington, DC. The Raising A Village Foundation (RAV) is a 501 (c)(3) non-profit organization, committed to providing high-quality intervention programs and community resources to children, youth, and families in the areas of education, health and wellness, and the arts.

The **Opportunity**

Raising A Village Foundation is looking for a self-motivated, mission-driven, **Driven Student Corps Member** (part-time/in-person). This person is responsible for supporting K-12 students during the school day or after school through one-on-one instruction and small group work in math, literacy, and college readiness. Driven Student Corps Members serve in a diverse group with 4 to 10 other team members from local colleges and universities. Each team is led by a Raising A Village Site Lead, who spearheads training, school partnerships and also directs the team in decisions that are made concerning service delivery.

This position reports **directly to the Site Lead** and works closely with all members of the RAV team, including **Site Lead and Program Team**.

Essential Job Responsibilities

This job description provides a general guideline to duties and responsibilities expected and essential for this new position. It is not all inclusive and the actual position may vary as circumstances indicate or as determined by the team.

Academic Support

- Help students learn, reviewing academic content with them, explaining how to solve problems and checking completed work.
- Help students develop study skills and organization techniques to help improve their academic performance.
- Keep reports on students and share those reports with supervisors, teachers and parents.
- Supervise groups of students, providing guidance and serving as a role model.

Qualifications

We encourage you to apply even if your experience is not a 100% match with the position. We are looking for someone with relevant skills and experience, not a checklist that exactly matches the job description. - Minimum 1 to 2 years' experience with tutoring, youth development, community service, etc. service experience
- Ability to tutor in K-12 core subjects such as reading, math, history, science
