Chevron

Yellow

Accentuate floor-to-ceiling cabinetry with a daring shade like yellow, which pairs perfectly with a floral accent wall.



Orange & Pink

There's no reason paint must be reserved for walls only: Take your paintbrush straight to the floor, as Annie Sloan has done with this geometric chalk paint look. Here's how:

PAINT

Deck out all four walls or create a bold focal point with inspiring shades and applications.



Blue

Rich navy not only serves as a stylish backdrop in this dining room designed by Ginny Macdonald, but also brings a contemporary feel to the layout. White items, including a pedestal table that frees up visual space, temper the inky hue.

1 Set aside half your tiles to paint in two colors of your choice—you'll need a large sponge roller.

2 Create a circle template by drawing around a small plate on card stock and cutting out the shape. Place two tiles of the same color next to each other and put the template in the middle.

3 Use the sponge roller to apply the other paint color around the template. Repeat with alternate colors of tile. Finish with Annie Sloan Gloss or Matte Chalk Paint Lacquer once dry.

WALLPAPER

A tried-and-true designer favorite can dress up bare walls in all kinds of spaces.



Ornate
