A Note from the Executive Director

As I reflect on 2024, I cannot help but think about my first few months as Executive Director at The Mary Parrish Center. The responsibility of managing all facets of the organization felt intimidating, but not impossible, and I was eager. I had a big vision, a small team, and growing community contacts.

As our team has grown and our many contacts have transformed into partners, I realized our vision is flourishing only because of the relationships forged in those early years and over time. Relationships with donors, partners, supporters, and residents. Our rich relationships, firmly rooted in compassion, support, and integrity make The MPC so special and the work we do so meaningful.

Our funding partners enabled us to complete gut renovations on our transitional housing apartment units which is a significant part of our larger \$1.52 million total renovation project. We take great pride in this accomplishment, as they provide a safe, beautiful, dignified space for survivors and their children to heal, and the sustainability of these units will allow us to safely house survivors and continue this healing for years to come.

Relationships with existing and new community partners laid the foundation for exciting, creative collaborations which allowed us to enhance and expand our clinical services and serve many more survivors through permanent housing. We look forward to sharing the development and impact of these programs with you in 2025.

Last, but not least, are the relationships we have with residents. This year, we provided safe, affordable housing to 161 survivors and their children through our Transitional and Rapid Re-Housing programs and assessed the housing and safety needs of 1,748 survivors and their children through our Domestic Violence Coordinated Entry process. The survivors we serve teach us about courage, resiliency, and determination. They help shape our programs to provide the best trauma-informed care to promote healing, autonomy, and hope. They are the heart and soul of The MPC and what drives us to do more.

Thank you for being part of a relationship that affords us the opportunity to have a significant impact on survivors in our community. As supporters and friends, you are part of this life-saving work.

My time at The Mary Parrish Center was so happy. My daughters and I had an apartment to call home and zero pressure to get everything together in limited time.

At The MPC, I started therapy for the first time in my life. I'm getting back to being the gentle parent I was when my daughters were little. Our family therapy sessions have been helping me learn different things about myself and my kids and how to be a better parent. I owe my newfound independence to The MPC. I'm living in my own apartment in Rapid Re-Housing, and my case manager helped me get a job.

I have worked hard to get to a stable place in my life. With their help, I'm finally able to say, I have achieved that. The MPC continues to help families escape and end the cycle of abuse.



Transitional Housing, A longer-term, temporary housing program where survivors live at The Mary Parrish Center cost-free for up to one year. It's designed for survivors with deep but nonpermanent needs.



Rapid Re-Housing, A permanent housing program which offers rental assistance and support services to survivors based on the their strengths, needs, preferences and financial resources for up to one year. We work closely with local shelters to make sure survivors' immediate safety and housing needs are met, while our housing advocate works to secure appropriate housing units.

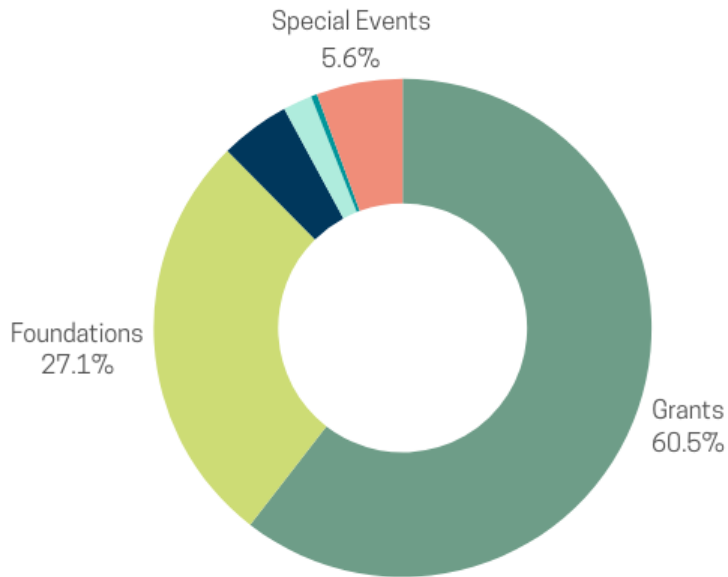

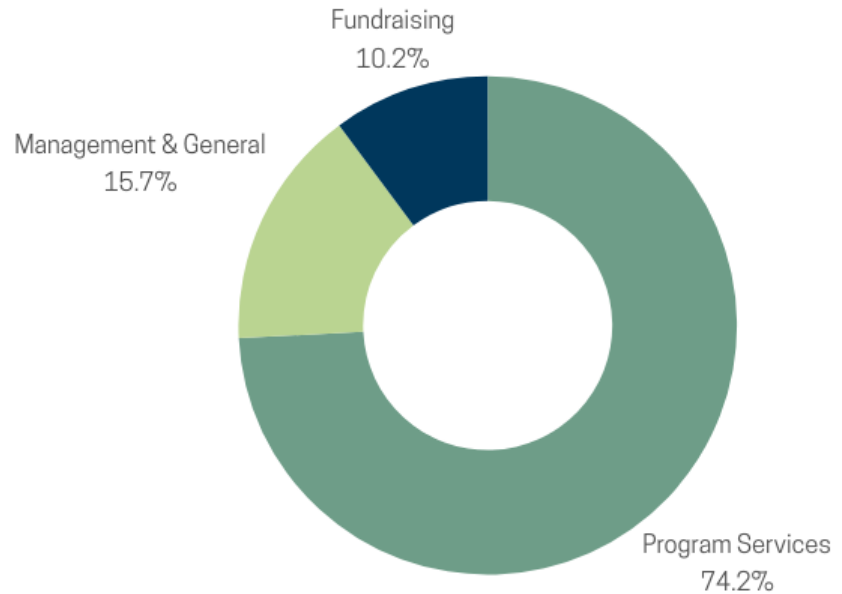
